Mandatory Reading (Supersedes DB 16-166)

On Wednesday, October 12, 2016, the United States Department of Justice Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) released its Collaborative Reform Initiative (CRI) assessment of the San Francisco Police Department. This independent review was a six-month process in which the CRI-team thoroughly reviewed five areas integral to building and maintaining trust with the communities we serve.

Members of the San Francisco Police Department must maintain working knowledge and understanding of this DOJ assessment as well as the President's 21st Century Policing Model. These reports provide you with a critical roadmap of where the San Francisco Police Department is heading with regard to policing reform.

The SFPD encourages supervisors and captains to continue conversations on the final report of the President's Task Force on the 21st Century Policing through roll calls, in-service training, and community meetings.


