Section VI, Paragraph B, Sub-Section 3 states:

PROHIBITION USE OF CONTROL HOLDS. Officers are prohibited from using the following control holds:

- a. carotid restraint
- b. choke hold choking by means of pressure to the subject's trachea or other means that prevent breathing
