REGULAR MEETING

The Police Commission of the City and County of San Francisco met in Room 400, City Hall, #1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, at 5:33 p.m.

PRESENT: Commissioners Turman, Mazzucco, Marshall, DeJesus, Melara, Hing, Hirsch

Sgt. Kilshaw announced that Items 6, 7, 8, and 9 will be taken off calendar to be agendized at a later date.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES

Motion by Commissioner Mazzucco, second by Commissioner Marshall. Approved 7-0.

APPROVAL OF THE AWARDS COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

Taken out of order.

Commissioner Mazzucco explained the awards process. Commissioner Mazzucco also asked that a vote for silver for Officer Bandy be re-evaluated to a gold. Chief Scott read the summary of the incident.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Motion by Commissioner Mazzucco, second by Commissioner Melara to approved the Awards Committee Recommendations with the exception of the upgrade from Silver to Gold for Officer Bandy. Approved 6-0.

Commissioner DeJesus was not present in the room for the vote.

Chief Scott spoke of the North Bay Fire. The Chief then gave a brief update on crime stats and recent arrests. The Chief also spoke of Fleet Week, Hardly Strictly Bluegrass, and the Columbus Day Parade. The Chief then talked about upcoming events including the 2017 Goddess Solidarity 5K, Human Trafficking March, Stride for Life Run/Walk.

b. **DPA Director's Report**

- Presentation of Statistical Reports: Summary of Cases Received, Mediation of Complaints, Adjudication of Sustained Complaints for August 2017 & Companion Reports

Director Henderson gave a brief update including updating the DPA's website which will cost approximately \$150,000 to update and will take several months. Director Henderson also gave a brief update in regards to Prop G. Director also talked about receiving a new car for the Department.

Director Henderson then talked about the August 2017 statistical report. He stated that DPA received 39 new cases in August. He also talked about having 56 cases referred to the DPA that are outside of their jurisdiction. These are cases that don't involve Police Department but are concerns that people are having about things they have observed and want to report. He stated that his staff are being trained so that when those reports come in, they can be referred to the right agency for follow up. He then went on to talk about the 3304 cases. He stated that 18 percent of his caseload is outside of the statute of limitation. He reported that as of today, DPA have zero 3304 cases. He reported that as of now DPA has five cases from 2015 and they are not 3304 cases.

Commissioner Turman spoke of meetings with Chief Scott and individual members of the Board of Supervisors in regards to law enforcement and public safety within their individual districts and will report back to the full Commission as to what they heard from the individual supervisors. Commissioner Turman also spoke of the rise property crimes and concerns brought out by the community and spoke of working with Chief Scott, the District Attorney, and presiding Criminal Judge about having an open forum so that people can come and talk about these issues.

Commissioner Mazzucco also spoke of attending community meetings and asked the Captains in district stations to track these cases as to what happened and what the outcome of the case is. He also spoke of marching with the Chief in the Italian Heritage Cultural Parade and thanked the Chief for walking with him. He also thanked Sgt. Angelo Spagnoli along with Captain Caltagirone, Officer Giovannelli and all the officers for putting this parade together.

Commissioner Mazzucco also talked about the passing of Patrol Special John Fitzinger.

Commissioner DeJesus spoke of attending the closing ceremonies of Fleet Week.

Commissioner Melara asked about Safe Place and OIS/Domestic Violence homicide and asked for a report about what has been happening in the last two years to improve the handling of these cases.

Commissioner Marshall asked for a presentation by the community ambassadors as to what has been happening with the program.

Commissioner Hing spoke of the Sanctuary City DGO and will be bringing that back to the full commission in the next two weeks.

Sgt. Kilshaw announced that next meeting will be October 18th, at City Hall, starting at 5:30 p.m.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Peter Alexander Chernoff gave his best to the fire fighters for their safety. He spoke of Freedom for Palestine event. He also thanked the Chief for sending officers to Santa Rosa to help with the fire.

Patrol Special Byard thanked the Commission for words spoken about PSO Fitzinger and spoke how PSO Fitzinger's son will be taking over for his dad.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Patricia spoke of a break in at the Palace of Fine Arts and how the suspect's car did not have plates and recommended working with the CHIP. She then spoke of Stacey Etcheber and PSO Fitzinger. She spoke of the Halloween and the safety of the children.

Clyde spoke of murders in Chicago.

Peter Alexander Chernoff spoke of more fires and spoke of the Kate Steinle case.

Ms. Paulette Brown spoke of her son, Aubrey Abrakasa, and played a video about her son's poster being taken down and asked for a venue for the posters to go up for the public's eye.
