## DECISION NOT TO WAIVE THE ATTORNEY-CLIENT PRIVILEGE FOR AUDIO OR VIDEO RECORDINGS OF POLICE COMMISSION CLOSED SESSIONS OF ATTORNEY-CLIENT COMMUNICATIONS FROM JANUARY 1<sup>ST</sup> TO MAY 31, 2015

WHEREAS, on June 19, 2017, the Police Commission Office was in receipt of an immediate disclosure request for copies of, or access to, audio or video recordings of all commission closed door sessions from January 1 through May 31, 2015;

WHEREAS, on July 5, 2017, the Police Commission Office responded to said immediate disclosure request declining to release audio or video recordings of commission closed door sessions from January 1 through May 31, 2015 stating that confidential information acquired in any closed session may not be disclosed unless the body that held the closed session (in this case, the Police Commission) votes to disclose the information, Cal. Govt. Code § 594963(a);

WHEREAS, on July 18, 2017, the Police Commission Office received notice of a complaint filed with the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force stating that the Department failed to provide complainant with responsive records for his request of public files that should be available because of local sunshine laws;

WHEREAS, on August 15, 2017, Police Commission staff attended a hearing by the Education, Outreach, and Training Committee of the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force in regards to above-mentioned complaint where the Task Force recommended to complainant that he requests the Police Commission place an item on its agenda for a vote whether to waive the attorney-client privilege for audio or video recordings of Police Commission closed sessions of attorney-client communications from January 1<sup>st</sup> to May 31, 2015;

WHEREAS, on September 20, 2017, the Police Commission voted whether to waive the attorneyclient privilege for audio or video recordings of Police Commission closed sessions of attorney-client communications from January 1st to May 31, 2015; therefore, be it
