What is Project Pull:

Project Pull is a paid summer internship program for high school juniors, seniors and incoming college freshman, sponsored by the City & County of San Francisco. Project Pull is a multipart internship program, which provides a mixture of educational, challenging and fun opportunities both inside and outside the workplace. Paired with City employees serving as mentors, interns are provided with the opportunity to gain insight on careers in the public sector by performing projects and tasks in a professional work environment.

Who is eligible for the program:

- Resident of San Francisco or attend school in San Francisco
- Students entering junior, senior year in high school or incoming college freshman (Age: 15 - 19)
- Students with a 2.75 GPA from last completed semester - Fall 2016
- Able to commit to twenty (20) hours a week for eight (8) weeks during the summer session (Early June through early August)
