Force Options Training Simulation – Stakeholder Participation

Force Options Training – presented by Officer Ryan Jones on February 13, 2018

The San Francisco Police Department conducts Use of Force training throughout the Department and incorporates that training into the overall tactics and operational planning of many critical incidents. In order to understand the totality of Use of Force incidents and how seriously the Department takes these issues, many things have to be considered, evaluated and employed. The law, Force Science, POST training, and supervisory investigation are all factors which are related to Use of Force.

This particular Force Options Presentation **is a small example** (glimpse) into the types of components involved in Use of Force training for not only new recruit officers but for CPT/ AO (Continued Professional Training / Advanced Officer) mandated for officers every two years. The purpose of this training is to increase knowledge in current use of force law, Improve *skills* in tactics and the selection of appropriate force options by utilization of simulator, and improve ability to document a use of force incident. The San Francisco Police Department has been utilizing this type of simulation and scenario based training during the Police Academy and in Roll Call trainings at Unit / Station level. Although Use of Force is a POST requirement, it is incorporated into all kinds of scenario and repetitive training, supervisory investigations.

Force Options Training Simulation – presented by Officer Ryan Jones on April 10, 2018

Before the simulation, the instructor will briefly explain the scenario to the participant. The participant will be asked to make a force option decision, which may include using no force at all. Each scenario will last approximately two minutes. We have four stakeholders that have volunteered to participate.

Each participant will be outfitted with the following equipment:

- Gun belt
- Compressed air firearm
- Compressed air pepper spray
- Foam baton

The firearm and pepper spray do not shoot projectiles and only work during the simulation.

After the scenario ends, the participants will be debriefed:

- What did you see?
- What did you do?
- Why?
