# Leo Zandanel



Ofc. Eleonardo Zandanel was born in Pieve di Cadore Italy to an Italian father and a Brazilian mother, so he grew up speaking Italian and Portuguese. He migrated to the United States at age 10 and learned English, Spanish, and French along the way. After graduating from Northeastern University—with a double major in International Affairs and Economics—he then worked at the United Nations during 2 general assemblies in 2011 and 2014. Already an established world traveler, he then went on a motorcycle ride of a lifetime: from Boston to Brazil. There, he found a job at a non-profit. While visiting a friend in San Francisco, he noticed an ad on a Muni bus to join the SFPD and the rest is history.

# Ernest Jones



Ernest Jones was born at St Luke's Hospital in the Ingleside District in 1985. EJ's home was at Arch and Holloway Street in the neighboring Taraval District. EJ's mother worked as an educator for the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) for 45 years; his father worked for SF MUNI as an Inspector.

EJ attended St. Emydius Grammar School and later attended St Ignatius High School. EJ attended Dominican University for his undergraduate studies and received a Masters in Public Administration from the University of San Francisco.

EJ's professional career in Public Administration began with the SFUSD where he assisted families and students with their needs and education. EJ wanted to further his public service and have more tangible impact on families, so he began working at the Bernal Heights Neighborhood Center and with residents of the Alemany housing complex. There, he affected positive community engagement by starting the "City Eats Program" where 1,000 homeless people are fed nutritious meals every Saturday of each month. EJ continues to serve challenged and underserved communities and has a desire to make a positive impact on people's lives.

EJ takes great pride in planning block parties where residents from communities such as Holly Park and Alemany Housing Complex celebrate their neighborhood. When asked about the recent Holly Park Block Party, EJ took pride in the success of the event where residents, neighbors (including Mayor Breed), and neighborhoods came together in a spirit of collaboration, preparation, and connection. EJ is grateful for so many motivated, caring, and dedicated people, community members, community groups, and City government (with special thanks to Nick Chapman at ISCOTT/MTA and Daniel Homsey from NEN) coming together to plan the upcoming November 3rd Alemany Block Party on Ellsworth Street from 11AM-2PM. Ingleside Officers Jensen and Duran responded to an address on the 300 block of Paris where the caller claimed to have been robbed on a Muni bus at Brazil and Mission. The victim, bleeding from a cut above his eye, said 10 suspects had assaulted him on the bus a short time before and stole a cellphone as well as several thousand dollars in cash from his pocket. The victim was unsure which bus he was on or where exactly the robbery took place. The officers were unable to find the bus or the exact location of the robbery and assault. A woman called police after hearing footsteps in the vacant apartment above her. She called police and Ingleside Officers Dang, Little, and Peralta responded. The officers entered the building and went to the third floor apartment but the door was locked. They then went to the backyard fire escape and entered the apartment just in time to hear Officer Little ordering the suspect to surrender in the main apartment stairway. The suspect, who had an extensive criminal record was placed in custody. Inside the vacant apartment was a fold up mattress and items stolen from other areas of the building. A woman walked into a bank and used identification and credit cards to deposit fraudulent checks and then withdrew \$3000. She then returned a short while later and tried to withdraw another \$3000 from the account. However, a suspicious clerk asked the suspect for her social security nu mber and other personal information which the suspect could not provide. Bank officials told Ingleside Officers Zandanel and Little that the suspect then fled the bank after overpowering a security guard and escaped southbound on Mission Street. The bank provided security footage of the suspect and the officers then talked to the woman who owned the stolen driver's license which was taken while she rode on a Muni bus sometime before. Ingleside Officers Brown and Martinez pulled up on the scene of a robbery and found the victim lying on the ground with a scraped knee and other injuries. She told the officers that two suspects ran up to her, threw her to the ground and then dragged her for a short distance. The suspects stole her black iPhone and her purse and then fled to a waiting vehicle which fled in an unknown direction. Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

### **San Francisco Police Make Arrest in Mission District Homicide**

On Monday, October 8<sup>th</sup> 2018 at approximately 1:17 AM, San Francisco Police officers responded to 19<sup>th</sup> Street and Capp Street in the Mission district regarding a shooting. Officers arrived on scene and located the victim, 25 year-old San Francisco resident Anthony Patton, laying on the ground suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. San Francisco Fire Department paramedics responded and rendered aid, but unfortunately Patton succumbed to his injuries.

SFPD Homicide investigators commenced an investigation that led to the identity of the suspects. On October 11<sup>th</sup> 2018, Mission Station officers located and arrested 20 year-old Antioch resident Reno Ramos and 27 year-old San Francisco resident Joe Nunezdosangos for homicide.

Following interviews with Homicide investigators, Ramos and Nunezdosangos were charged with murder and booked into San Francisco County Jail. Due to pending identification matters, the subjects' photos will not be released at this time.

Although arrests have been made, investigators are asking anyone with information on this case to contact the 24 hour San Francisco Police Tip Line at 415-575-4444 or text-a-tip to TIP411 with SFPD at the start of the message. You may remain anonymous.

### **San Francisco Police Seek Public's Assistance in Locating Hit and Run Vehicle**

On Tuesday, August 21, 2018 at approximately 5:40AM, a hit-and-run collision occurred at the intersection of Valencia Street and Hill Street in San Francisco's Mission District. The suspect vehicle, a maroon 4-door sedan, was traveling southbound on Valencia Street when it struck the victim who was operating a bicycle. The collision caused the victim to be ejected off his bike and fall to the ground.

The victim, a 33 year-old San Francisco resident, sustained non life-threatening injuries and was transported to a local hospital.

Photos of the suspect vehicle accompany this news release.

This incident occurred on a well-traveled thoroughfare. Investigators ask anyone who was in the area of Valencia Street and Hill Street on August 21, 2018 around 5:40AM to check cell phones, dash-cams and surveillance systems for photos or video of the collision and/or the suspect vehicle. ### **Update on Outside Agency Officer Involved Shooting at Aquatic Park**

On October 16, 2018 at approximately 9:31 PM, San Francisco police officers from Central Police Station responded to shots fired in the area of Aquatic Park. They determined that an officer involved shooting involving a U.S. Park Police officer had occurred. A firearm with an extended magazine was recovered at the scene.

One subject was transported to a hospital, where he remains in life-threatening condition. Another subject was booked on possession of a firearm and possession of a firearm with a large capacity magazine. The U.S. Park Police officer in this incident was not injured.

This is an active and ongoing investigation in the early stages. Investigations are being conducted by the San Francisco Police Department and the San Francisco District Attorney's Independent Investigations Bureau.
