**Policing in San Francisco is a tough balancing act.** At a recent meeting regarding prostitution and auto burglaries, I explained how we staff our personnel to handle high volumes of calls for service. All things being equal, I could simply allocate personnel 30/30/30 for even coverage of the three watches of days, evenings and midnights. Things are not that simple. At Central Station, one of ten police districts in the City, we have more than our share of special events, demonstrations, parades, dignitary protection, fairs, street closures and the like. We have the lion's share of hotel, retail and major employers in town. We also have 7 of the top 10 tourist attractions in the City. Many of our attractions are also attractive to aggressive panhandling, prostitution and auto burglary.

Our staffing is balanced to address particular crime problems and high times for calls for service. Last month's high times for calls for service were 3 PM, 10 AM, Midnight and 6 PM. Accordingly, we staff days and swing hours with the most officers. In addition, most businesses are open during those hours and most large events and attractions are during those times as well. One area unique to our district is the Broadway Entertainment Corridor and with it comes the need for all the resources necessary to apply there. Although the number of calls for service is a consideration, there is the need to address violent crimes over lower level infractions. The Emergency Communications Dispatch center prioritizes calls as A, B and C priority depending on whether the call is in progress, violent and/or serious, as opposed to a traffic, noise or other minor complaint.

We are also bound to police events under the permit or licensing by other agencies. Sometimes State or City Codes say what, when and where we can apply the law. Again, in San Francisco, we are unique in several areas and in the end, no rules are so finite. Our policing plan is ever changing to meet the needs of the community and to address criminal behavior as well.

### Lost and Found

**On 6/20/07 at 3 PM, Officers Randy SooHoo and Nelson Artiga** were alerted to a marijuana farm of sorts inside an apartment on the 1000 block of Sutter. SFFD responded to a call of a smoky fire on a rooftop. As the fire was extinguished, they investigated a locked fire escape, (a violation), and saw the 'grow farm' inside that apartment. Further inspection revealed that no furnishings indicated that anyone was actually living there. The large operation yielded several dozen mature marijuana plants, seedlings, a duct, lighting and watering system. The Narcotics Detail conducted the follow up investigation. To date, no one has claimed the goods as theirs.

Officer Koltzoff used her OC spray to overcome the assault and was supported by responding back-up officers. The suspect was subdued and charged with Felony assault and for being a public nuisance. Officer Koltzoff suffered a laceration to one of her fingers.

**On 6/25/07 at 4:19 PM on the 600 block of Hyde Street,** Officers responded to a call of a Robbery in progress. **Officers Paul Doherty and Nico Discenza** saw the male victim lying unconscious, bleeding from the mouth, being treated by ambulance EMT's. Several witnesses described the Robbery assailants as two transgender suspects and described their escape route. One suspect was taken into custody and charged with Robbery and Aggravated Assault. The victim was treated for numerous facial and head lacerations and was transported to SF General Hospital. The apparent 'take' in the robbery was only one quarter, twenty five cents, despite the suspects going through the victim's pants pockets as he lie unconscious.
