Crime and Enforcement Update

9/16/05

Attempted Kidnapping 5700-3rd St. 4:03 p.m.

Bayview Officers Mostasisa and Doherty responded to the MLK Pool on a report of a kidnapping. Upon arrival, they met the mother, her 11 year old son, and 1 year old daughter. The mother said that they were outside of the pool building, when she went inside to use the restroom. As the 2 children waited for the mother to return. The suspect approached the 2 children and told the son to take his sister and to get into the suspect's van parked a short distance away. The son refused and the suspect raised his hand to hit the son. The son fearing for his safety reached into his mother's purse and pulled out a box cutter, pushed out the blade, and pointed it at the suspect. Upon seeing the knife, the suspect left. The suspect is described as a black male, 5'8", 140 lbs., black hair, and brown eyes. The suspect's van is described as a light blue van with windows all around.

Aggravated Assault w/Gun-Gang Related 1000 Oakdale 5:13 p.m.

Bayview Officers Luedtke and Olson responded to a report of a shooting. Upon arrival, they met a woman who said that she heard several shots and screaming. The officers searched the area but were unable to find any victims. A short time later, Dispatch informed the officers that 2 gunshot victims had driven themselves into St. Lukes Hospital. The officers recognized one of the victims as a gang member that frequents the area of the shooting. That victim gave his name, but refused to provide any information regarding the shooting. The 2nd victim also refused to provide information and did not give his name to the officers.

Aggravated Assault w/Gun 100 Kiska 12:58 a.m.

Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell and numerous other officers responded to a call of shots being fired. Upon arrival, they were dispatched to an address. At that address was a man who had been shot in the face. The man said that he was walking when he heard shots being fired. The man ran and then realized that he had been shot in the face. The man was transported to SFGH. There is no suspect description.

Aggravated Assault w/Gun 1300 Palou 7:26 p.m.

Bayview Officers Luedtke and Olson responded on a report of a person shot. Upon arrival, they were directed by several people to the hallway of a building. As they entered, they saw a man lying on the floor bleeding from the torso. Witnesses said that they heard several gunshots and the sound of a car speeding away. The man was transported to SFGH. There is no suspect description.

Aggravated Assault w/Force 200 Paul 8:28 p.m.

Bayview Officers Arndt and Pashby responded on a report of a Muni driver being assaulted. The Muni driver said that he was flagged down by the suspect. When the driver stopped, the suspect entered the bus and began to berate the driver for not stopping. The suspect then began punching the driver. The driver pushed the suspect off the bus onto the street where the fight continued. The suspect then fled. The suspect is described as an Asian male, 18-19 years old, 5'8", 160 lbs., black hair, wearing a dark jacket with white horizontal striped shirt, and gold teeth.

Bayview Officers Coleman and Rightmire were on uniformed patrol in a marked police vehicle when they saw 2 men sitting in a vehicle. The area that the men and vehicle were in is a well known area that narcotics are used and sold. They noticed the men because 2 days before they had detained the same men for being in a stolen auto. The officers contacted the men and asked them about the car. The men could not tell the officers whom the car belonged to. A computer check of the VIN revealed that the car was stolen. The man who was in the driver's seat was arrested. The man that was in the passenger seat was released.
