Since we now have officers working out of the gym (our Hunter's Point sub-station is located within the actual gym), the PAL is assuring other teams that this is a safe environment. This is a huge step for our community, and we're optimistic that as people from across San Francisco come to Hunter's Point, they will begin to learn that very positive things are happening here.

Drug Free Zones

I spoke with the sign shop at DPT yesterday regarding our Drug Free Zone signs, and most of them have now been installed. This was the last component to our long-range anti-drug plan for the district. Our plan includes the following four components:

- 1) Pro-active arrests at all problem locations of all drug dealers and users.
- 2) Maintenance of loitering for purposes of selling / buying drugs database, and aggressive enforcement of this statute.
- 3) Charging of school zone (drug free zone) enhancement on all relevant cases.
- 4) Request for criminal stay-away orders in all drug cases.

We are hopeful that this plan will begin to address the myriad problems associated with the rampant drug dealing which occurs at our problem corners. There are additional components to this plan which will be revealed in the weeks to come as they are utilized. In addition, we are working closely with the Bayview Neighborhood Rescue Team to target the

most problematic locations. Our first two target locations, Fitzgerald and Jennings, and Thornton and Latona, will be reported on in these e-mails as we proceed with our enforcement plans.
