Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 6, our Vice Crimes Unit visited numerous alcohol-licensed premises in the district in an undercover "decoy" operation to determine if any of the businesses would sell alcohol to underage minors. The following cases were made:

On October 7, at 9:28 a.m., Bayview's Officer Lamma took a report of a burglary / domestic violence on the 700 block of Kirkwood. The victim told the officer that her boyfriend has been leaving threatening messages on her cell phone. The victim stated that she fears her boyfriend, and as a result, did not stay in her apartment the previous night. The victim's apartment was "trashed," and some of her property was missing. The victim believes that her boyfriend was responsible for the damage and theft, because he had threatened to do similar acts in the past. An emergency protective order was issued in the case, and the case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 146 871).

On October 7, at 10:27 a.m., Bayview's Officer Reyes was on patrol at 18th and Connecticut when he was flagged down by a person who stated that his home was just burglarized and the suspects were running south on

Connecticut. The officer could see two males running a block away and he pursued them, but lost them as they ran onto the 700 block of Missouri. Numerous officers searched the area for the suspects, to no avail. The burglary had occurred on the 600 block of Mississippi, and the victim stated that he had looked out his second story window and seen one of the two suspects going through his garbage can. The victim went down to street level to speak with the suspect and saw that his garage door was wide open, and the second suspect was exiting the garage. Both suspects then fled and the victim pursued them. Entry was gained by breaking out one of the garage door windows. The victim has seen both suspects in the area before, going through garbage cans, and can identify them. Suspect one is described as a black male, 40-45, 6'1", 135, some facial hair, crooked teeth, dark complexion, wearing a striped blue shirt and blue jeans. Suspect two is a black male, 6'0", 155, dark complected, wearing a white sweater and dark blue jeans (041 147 108).

On October 7, at 12:15 p.m. Bayview officers Lamma and Reyes responded to the Bank of America at 5000 3rd Street on the report of a fraud in progress. As the officers entered he bank, they saw a female (who matched the description provided by Dispatch) quickly exiting the side door. The female started running south on 3rd Street and then east on Revere. Officer Reyes, apparently in better aerobic condition than the suspect, was able to catch up to the female at 1670 Revere and detain her. The bank manager was brought to Revere and identified the woman as the person who had attempted to cash a fraudulent check. The bank manager explained to the officers that, in the past few weeks, several individuals have been attempting to cash checks from Torchio's Auto Repair in Oakland, and that the checks are all fraudulent. The owner of Torchio's Auto Repair was contacted by the officers, and he stated that these checks did not originate from his company, and are not authorized for payment. The woman, living on Nichols, was booked for fraud and resisting arrest (041 147 540).

On October 7, at 10:20 p.m., Bayview's Officers Wilhelm and Brown responded to the corner of 17th and Rhode Island on the report of a fight involving 3-4 subjects. The officers approached the subjects to inquire about the fight, and they all stated that there had been no fight. The officers identified the four men and found one of them to have an outstanding warrant for his arrest from San Mateo County charging him with possession of cocaine. The officers arrested the man, living on Plymouth Street, and then found a plastic baggie containing crack cocaine in his pocket. The man was charged with the additional possession (041 149 728).

On October 8, at 2:31 a.m., Bayview's Officer Chiang took a report of a street robbery which had occurred at Nichols and Cameron. The victim told the officer that he was "jumped" by two Samoan males. The victim had been drinking and had several injuries requiring medical attention. He was transported to SFGH by ambulance. Once at the hospital, the victim became uncooperative, with both the officers and the medical staff, and had to be restrained by Sheriff's personnel in order to be treated. The victim refused to provide any further information (041 150 151).
