Late Night Basketball

The second week of games were played last night at Joe Lee Rec Center in Bayview's Late Night Basketball program. The games were well attended by residents and, for the second week in a row, there were no problems. Dan Boardman of Bode Gravel came in and spoke with the young men about jobs, and Jeff Adachi of the Public Defender's Office spoke about the Clean Slate program.

Bayview Historical Society

The second meeting of the Bayshore Historical Society will be this Friday, 8 October, 6:00 to 7:30 p.m., 1201 Mendell, at McKinnon. Agenda items: Tours of Bayview historic sites, Bayview ethnic and racial diversity, planning for oral history collections, and work on compiling a list of historic residences. Some of the most significant are the "earthquake shacks," which are the little structures with the peak roofs which look like a child's drawing of a house. Wallace Clean Up

Yesterday afternoon, five DPW dump trucks were lined up on Wallace Avenue cleaning out the large toxic-waste dump site which has been referenced in prior e-mails. I visited the site yesterday morning and there were still (literally) tons of debris on the site. I received word this morning that it is now clean. All of the various city agencies involved in this effort are to be commended for working together to address a district eyesore and health hazard which has existed for a very long time.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 6, at 2:59 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the first block of Harbor Road on a domestic violence call. The officers interviewed a woman who stated that she had been drinking with her boyfriend of two months, and they began to argue. The boyfriend then punched her several times in her face, and she hit him over the head with a vodka bottle. The boyfriend then punched her several more times. The victim told the officers that her boyfriend has assaulted her 10-12 times during their two month relationship. As the officers were interviewing the woman, the boyfriend returned and could be heard yelling outside. The officers attempted to approach him, but he fled. The officers later located him hiding under a stairwell on Kiska Road. The boyfriend was booked for domestic violence and violation of probation (041 141 649).

On October 6, at 8:15 a.m., a Bayview School Resource Officer working at ISA High School (693 Vermont) arrested a 16 year old student, residing on Turner Terrace, for aggravated assault and conspiracy. The student, along with others, had been involved in an earlier reported incident, in which another student had been assaulted by several suspects (041 135 056).

On October 6, at 11:40 p.m., Bayview's quality of life officer received a call that the commercial property at 3rd and Cargo was being used as a dumping and camping ground, and that an infestation of rodents had resulted from the piles of debris and garbage left in the area. The officers found several individuals living in tents, and they were each cited for illegal lodging. One of the individuals was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 142 209).

On October 6, at 12:32 p.m., Bayview officers received information that a man was selling drugs out of a vehicle parked at Newhall and LaSalle. When the officers arrived, the vehicle was gone, but the officers remained in the area and the vehicle returned shortly thereafter. The officers saw the vehicle's driver exit the vehicle and talk with numerous people in the area, and they then saw him doing something under the dashboard area of the car. The officers detained the suspect and found the vehicle to be stolen. The suspect, living on the 1400 block of Palou, was booked for stolen auto (041 143 009).

On October 6, at 12:58 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Middlepoint Road, at Westpoint and Middlepoint Roads for an outstanding arrest warrant (030 187 402).

On October 6, at 1:21 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 22nd and Connecticut on the report of a street robbery. The two victims stated that they were walking on Connecticut at 22nd when two young men suddenly blocked their path and two additional young men then approached from the side and demanded their property. The suspects then went through the victim's pockets and removed their property. The suspects then fled into the Potrero Hill Park. The first two suspects are described as 14-17 years of age, black males, 5'10", wearing white shirts and black pants. The second two suspects are described as 12-15 years of age, black males, 5'3", wearing white shirts and black pants (041 143 338).

On October 6, at 1:30 p.m., a student at Thurgood Marshall High School on Conkling Street was walking through school when he was struck in the chest by what he believes was a "b.b." fired from an air gun. The student had a red welt on his chest which he displayed to the officer taking the report, and he stated that he hasn't had any problems with anyone else, but other students routinely bring air guns and firecrackers to school (041 143 924).

On October 6, at 3:00 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 16th and Deharo when they saw a known "Fillmore" gang member driving a vehicle with no license plates on 25th Street. The suspect has been connected to several district shootings and has prior arrests for firearms violations. The officers attempted to pull the vehicle over, but it fled and was lost in the area. Moments later, a marked Bayview unit saw the vehicle again and attempted to pull it over, but it again fled, driving at a high rate speed and recklessly as it ran through stop signs and red lights. The vehicle was eventually located in the parking lot at 555 9th Street, and the driver, living on Potomac, was charged with reckless driving (041 144 176).

On October 6, at 3:49 p.m., a woman walked into the Bank of America at 5000 3rd Street and attempted to open a checking account using a California

driver's license which bank employees suspected was not genuine. The woman asked that she be provided immediately with checks, and when bank employees became suspicious and phoned police, the woman fled. The woman, living on Gateview Court according to the license, left the driver's license behind when she fled (041 114 041).

On October 6, at 4:11 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Carolina and Coral when they were flagged down by a woman who told them that a man had just been robbed and was chasing the suspects "down the hill." The robbery victim then drove up to the officers and pointed to two males who were running behind a building on the 900 block of Connecticut Street. The officers caught up with the two individuals and detained them, and the victim joined them, stating, "That's two of them." The victim then told officers that he was walking to his parked vehicle after working at SFGH and he noticed he was being followed by five to six male juveniles. The victim put his briefcase into the vehicle's trunk, and was then surrounded by the juveniles, who demanded his money. The juveniles then removed his wallet and fled toward the Potrero Hill Housing development. The first suspect, a 14 year old juvenile living on Turner Terrace, was taken to YGC and charged with robbery and conspiracy. The second suspect, a 16 year old juvenile living on the 1200 block of Palou, was charged with the same offenses. Note that there have been several similar robberies in this area in the past few weeks (041 144 289).

On October 6, at 7:57 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 100 block of Atoll on a call of shots being fired into a house. The caller told police that he was awakened by someone knocking on his front door, and then heard someone yelling, "You messed with my girlfriend." The caller went to the front door and told the subjects there that neither his son, nor the man they were looking for, was at home. The suspects then threw a rock through an upstairs bedroom window. The caller admitted to police that he had never seen a gun, but he might have heard shots being fired. The victim saw the suspects enter a home on the 100 block of Nautilus, and the officers went to this home and knocked on the door. The suspects told officers that a man living at the first address on Atoll had broken out their window following a fight in the street. The original caller declined to press charges and all involved parties were encouraged to be nice to each other (041 145 259).

On October 6, at 8:43 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Quesada when they saw approximately 20 persons near the "Big Save Market" engaged in what appeared to be a fight. The officers approached the group and it immediately dispersed, with individuals quickly leaving in every direction. The officers noticed that a jacket had been left draped over a parking meter, and when they checked it, they found a loaded semi-auto handgun in the pocket. The gun was booked for analysis and safekeeping (041 145 293).
