Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 4, at 1:39 a.m., Bayview officers were en route to the Hall of Justice and had just taken the 4th Street exit from the freeway when they saw a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed run through a red light. The officers attempted to catch up to the vehicle, and in so doing, saw it run through three more red lights and two stop signs. The officers eventually stopped the vehicle and approached the driver and smelled a strong odor of alcohol. The driver then stated, "Officer, although I drank alot, I know I can drive. I'm not that drunk." The driver was given a series of field sobriety tests and was ultimately arrested for drunk driving (041 133 204).

On October 4, at 9:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the first block of Northridge on the report of a domestic violence case. The officers interviewed the woman, who stated that her boyfriend had struck

her five to seven times in the head with a closed fist when she couldn't tell him the location of the TV's remote control. The boyfriend fled the home prior to the officers' arrival, but he was later located at Innes and Donohue and booked for domestic violence. The officers determined that the reportee had filed domestic violence reports against her boyfriend on three prior occasions, but had never followed any of the cases up (041 133 878).

On October 4, at 12:57 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at Faith and Bayshore for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with stolen auto, grand theft and possession of stolen property (041 135 040).

On October 4, at 4:40 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw numerous men loitering near the "Doublerock Social Club." One of the men looked toward the officers and then began to walk away. The officers then saw the man throw a baggie to the ground. The officers retrieved the baggie and found it to contain crack cocaine. The man, living on the 1100 block of Hollister, was arrested for possession of crack cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 135 965).

On October 4, at 5:00 p.m., a man came to Bayview Station and reported that on October 2, at 12:00 p.m., he was leaving the Joe Lee Rec Center in his wheelchair when someone came up from behind him and pushed his wheelchair over, knocking him to the ground. The suspect then went through the victim's pockets and removed his property. The victim described the suspect only as a black male, 5'11", "twig" style hair, wearing a white shirt (041 135 573).

On October 4, at 5:03 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living in Richmond, at 2161 Revere for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with burglary and possession of burglar tools (041 136 286).

On October 4, at 5:11 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 100 block of Dartmouth on the report of a restraining order violation. The officers determined that the restraining order had expired, but they found that the subject of the restraining order had an outstanding warrant for his arrest charging him with terrorist threats and aggravated assault. The suspect was booked accordingly (041 136 292).

On October 4, at 10:17 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 25th and Wisconsin when they came across a group of young men arguing in the street. Upon seeing the officers, the young men entered a car and drove off. The officers stopped the car and determined that the driver had a probation "search condition." A search of the vehicle revealed a quantity of both marijuana and plastic baggies. A 14 year old male, living on the 1800 block of 25th Street, was cited to YGC for possession of marijuana for sale (041 137 143).

On October 4, at 10:24 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at Toland and Newcomb for an outstanding narcotics arrest warrant (041 137 206).

On October 4, at 10:26 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Newhall and Newcomb when they made a traffic stop on a vehicle and determined that the driver was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant from Siskiyou County (041 137 256).

On October 4, at 11:32 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman at 2200 Newcomb who was seated in a stolen vehicle. The woman told officers that she had no idea the vehicle was stolen, and had been driven to the location by her friend. The woman did not know her friend's name. Note that the vehicle's ignition was "punched," and that this was clearly visible to any occupants of the vehicle. The woman was booked (041 137 290).

On October 4, at 11:38 p.m., Bayview officers were flagged down by a cab driver at 3rd and Newcomb who told the officers the following. The cabbie had picked up a fare at 16th and Mission and driven him to 3rd and 23rd. When the fare exited the vehicle with the cabbie, he produced a knife and robbed the cabbie of his currency. The suspect then fled on foot. The suspect is described as a black male, 20-25, 5'9", 180, dreadlocks, wearing a white hooded sweatshirt and blue jean pants, carrying a camcorder (041 137 303).

On October 5, at 12:10 a.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle for expired registration. The driver, who provided the officers with a name they determined to be fictitious, was taken to Bayview Station in order to determine his true identity. Once at the station, additional Bayview officers recognized the man as the man who had dropped a stolen gun while running from Bayview officers this past weekend (reported in yesterday's e-mail). The man was charged with possession of a loaded and concealed handgun and possession of stolen property (041 137 397).
