Crime and Enforcement Update

On October 18, at 5:40 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Bayshore and Industrial when they saw a beige Cadillac speed away from them at a high rate of speed. The Cadillac ran through a red light and then drove toward Potrero Hill. The officers attempted to stop the vehicle at 23rd and Arkansas, and as the vehicle came to a stop, three young men jumped from it and began to flee on foot. One of the young men was holding a black semi-auto handgun in his hand, and he threw it to the street. The same young man dropped four baggies (containing what the officers determined to be methamphetamine) to the ground next to the gun. The three suspects ran into the nearby housing development and were lost by the officers. The handgun and narcotics were each booked as evidence. The suspects are described only as black males, 18-25, 5'8", 160 (041 189 809).

On October 19, at 1:42 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 5000 3rd Street on the report of a person attempting to pass a fake check. As the officers

arrived, the bank manager pointed down 3rd Street toward a man that he told the officers was the suspect. The officers detained the man and interviewed the bank manager, who told them that the suspect had brought in a check from Torino Market made payable to another company. The suspect's name was then handwritten over the payee's name, and the suspect had attempted to cash the check. Torino Market was then contacted, and the store manager told officers that he had mailed the check in question that morning, and within minutes of mailing it, was told by a customer that a male was seen opening an envelope he had just mailed (the envelope must have been dropped.) The Torino manager put a "stop" on the check, and was later contacted by B of A. The suspect was booked for various fraud charges (041 195 505).

On October 19, at 2:00 p.m., a woman was standing in the bus stop at Williams and Apollo when approached by a male suspect who grabbed her purse and pulled it, knocking her to the ground. The victim held on to the purse, and the suspect fled on foot. The suspect is described as a black male, 20-22, 5'9", 150, wearing a black hooded jacket (041 954 436).

On October 19, at 4:15 p.m., Bayview officers responded to 1240 Revere on the report of a group of juveniles trying to beat a male in his vehicle. The officers met with a man who told them that he was driving on Revere when he passed a group of juveniles who threw an orange (traffic) cone at his vehicle, striking it. The victim stated that he stopped his vehicle and approached the group and noticed that two of the juveniles were holding handguns. One of the armed juveniles then told the victim, "You better get the (expletive deleted) out of here." The victim then left the area and notified the police. The officers recognized the unique description given of one of the suspects (blond dreadlocks) as belonging to a young man they are quite familiar with, and moments later, they located the young man at Palou and Hawes and detained him. The officers searched the suspect and found a revolver in his pocket. The victim was brought to the scene and identified the detained suspect as one of the two men who had been armed . The 16 year old suspect, living on the 1000 block of Gilman, was booked for weapons charges at YGC (041 2196 230).

On October 19, at 11:40 p.m., Bayview officers received a "private person" arrest from security guards patrolling the properties at 1400 LaSalle. The guards had arrested two men for possession of methamphetamine. The first man, living on Wills, was booked for simple possession. The second man, living on Westpoint, was booked for possession for sale of meth (041 197 802).

On October 20, at 2:30 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Silver and Ledyard when they saw a man standing next to a vehicle with a broken-out window. The officers detained the man and found several pieces of property in his pockets. The officers contacted the owner of the vehicle, who responded to the scene, and he identified the property recovered from the suspect's pockets as the property which had been in his vehicle. The suspect, living on the 2000 block of Carroll, was booked for auto burglary and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 197 868).
