

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE November 8, 2004

#### Ongoing Violence

There was another senseless act of violence in the district this weekend, reported below as the November 5 shooting incident on Palou. The victim in this case, a 17 year old male who had been living with his girlfriend and her mother on Palou, appears to have simply been at the wrong place at the wrong time. The young man expired of his gunshot wound on November 6 at SFGH, and there are very few leads in the case at this time. A 1980's black Cadillac, with tinted windows and gold rims was used by the suspect(s), and was seen fleeing the area following the shooting. Bayview officers recovered another four firearms this weekend, including a sawed-off shotgun, but there seems to be a never-ending supply of firearms which flow into the district. We are continuing to aggressively monitor and pursue the most violent gangsters in the district, including the notorious Uda, who was recently released from custody on the gun case (AK-47) our officers made on him several weeks ago. The case was dismissed due to a lack of evidence.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 5, at 9:55 a.m., Bayview officers were addressing the problems present at a large homeless encampment at Cargo and Amador when they saw a man drop a crumpled cigarette pack to the ground upon being approached by the officers. The officers checked the package and found a quantity of methamphetamine. The suspect was booked for possession of methamphetamine and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 266 009).

On November 5, at 11:30 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 800 block of Felton on a domestic violence call. The female caller told officers that her husband had demanded sex from her after telling her that he had just taken some Viagra, and when the wife refused his advances, he became angry and battered her. The officers arrested the husband for domestic violence (041 266 667).

On November 5, at 11:30 a.m., a Bayview sergeant stopped a Toyota Camry at Bayshore and Industrial which was a reported stolen auto. The driver, a 14 year old male living on 21st Street, was booked for stolen auto at YGC. Note that this suspect was just booked in a (different) stolen auto in the past two weeks. The first passenger, a 13 year old living on Balmy Street, was released to his parents. The second passenger, a 13 year old living on Treat Street, was also released to his parents (041 252 042).

On November 5, at 8:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1200 block of Palou on the report of a person screaming for help and shots being fired. The officers located a man inside a parked vehicle with a single gunshot wound to the head. The officers summoned medical aid for the victim and then interviewed four women, all of whom had been inside the vehicle with the victim at the time he was shot. The witnesses told officers that they had been inside of the parked vehicle when a second vehicle pulled alongside them and an occupant of the second vehicle began firing into the victim's vehicle. The suspect vehicle was described as a 1980's Cadillac, black in color, with tinted windows and gold rims. The

suspect was described only as a black male, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt (041 268 475).

On November 5, at 10:26 p.m., Bayview officers responded to Fitzgerald and Hawes on the report of a stabbing. The victims told officers that they were seated in a parked vehicle when the suspect threw a wine bottle at them through the car's open window while shouting, "You fat (expletive deleted)." The wine bottle struck one of the victims on her head. The victims told officers that they have had ongoing problems with the suspect, and one of the victims exited the car in order to fight the suspect, "one on one." The victim told officers she was then forced to bite the suspect, because the suspect had been joined by a second suspect who was armed with a kitchen knife. The second suspect began swinging her knife at the first victim, eventually stabbing her in the chest. The officers responded to the home of the stabbing suspect and located her. The stabbing suspect, living on the 1300 block of Fitzgerald, was booked for aggravated assault (041 268 691).

On November 6, at 3:47 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 25th and Minnesota when they pulled a vehicle over for no license plates. When the officers began speaking with the driver of the vehicle, they could smell a strong odor of marijuana, and upon being questioned, the driver admitted that there was additional marijuana inside his vehicle. The officers found a large baggie of marijuana next to the driver's side door and seized it as evidence. 25 small plastic baggies (used for packaging for sales) were found in the center console and seized. The driver, living on the 100 block of Westpoint Road, was booked for possession for sale of marijuana, possession of crack cocaine (found in his sock), and possession of crystal methamphetamine (found in a cigarette pack in his pocket). He was also charged with possession of a switchblade and violation of his parole. The passenger, living on the 2000 block of Thomas, was booked for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 269 445).

On November 6, at 7:35 a.m., Bayview officers stopped a man at Evans and Quint for riding a bicycle the wrong way down a public street. The officers discovered that the man had an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with sales of cocaine, and the officers arrested him (041 540 072).

On November 6, at 9:15 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Newhall and McKinnon when they saw a man riding a bicycle past them on the sidewalk. The officers stopped the man to issue him a citation, and they discovered an outstanding arrest warrant for the man charging him with possession of stolen property. The man was booked for the warrant (041 269 940).

On November 6, at 3:45 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Page Street, for aggravated assault. The man had been named as the suspect in a district incident last week (reported in this space) wherein he had refused to pay the repair bill for his auto and had then dragged the employee down the street with his vehicle as he drove away from the repair shop (041 226 047).

On November 6, at 5:21 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Newcomb and Newhall when they saw two women, known to them from prior street contacts, drive by in a Toyota SUV. The officers ran the license of

the vehicle and discovered it to be a reported stolen auto. The occupants of the vehicle were detained, and the driver, living on the 1600 block of Kirkwood, was booked for stolen auto (041 271 406).

On November 6, at 5:32 p.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop on a vehicle on the 2500 block of San Bruno Avenue. The officers were in the process of citing the driver as an unlicensed driver, when he suddenly began to walk away. The officers pursued the man to detain him and they were suddenly set upon by a woman who battered the officers, eventually biting one of the officers. The woman, who turned out to be the wife of the male driver, was arrested for battery on a peace officer. The driver was cited for the traffic offenses and released at the scene. The officer received a tetanus shot and was treated for a human bite wound (041 271 365).

On November 6, at 6:46 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Oakdale and Baldwin when they heard someone yell out, "Five-0," in an effort to alert everyone near to the presence of the police officers. The officers then saw a man, known to them as a validated member of the Oakdale Mob gang, quickly walking away. The officers stopped the man, knowing that he was prohibited from being in the area under a court-issued stay away order. The man, living on the 1100 block of Palou, was arrested for violating a court order, and for violation of probation (041 271 989).

On November 6, at 7:41 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Newcomb when they saw approximately ten young men loitering in front of the Bayview Liquors store, including three known members of the notorious Big Block gang. As the officers exited their car, two of the men, with their hands in their pockets, quickly turned away from the officers and entered the liquor store. The officers knew one of the men, as they had previously arrested him for possession of a firearm. As the officers entered the liquor store, the two men embraced in an "unnatural hug," and appeared to the officers to be exchanging something. The officers separated the men and patted them down, finding a loaded and concealed handgun in the waistband of the second man (not the one previously booked for possession of a firearm by the officers). The suspect, a 16 year old male living in Daly City, was booked for weapons charges at YGC (041 271 735).

On November 6, at 11:23 p.m., a woman reported to Bayview officers that she had just exited a bus at Westpoint and Middlepoint when she was approached by an ex-boyfriend of one of her friends. The victim stated that she became involved in a verbal argument with the suspect, and the suspect then forcibly stole her cellphone and ran away. The suspect, Lynell Carter, lives on Redondo Street and is 26 years of age (041 272 391).

On November 7, at 12:23 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were conducting a walk-through at Westpoint and Middlepoint (Westmob gang territory) when they saw a man they knew from numerous prior contacts, and who is a still-active member of the Westmob gang. The officers had previously arrested the man for firearms offenses and knew that he was still on probation for one of these cases. As the officers began to approach the man, he turned and began to quickly walk away. The officers called out to him and asked him to stop, and the man suddenly bent over and brought his

hands to his waistband. The officers ordered the man to move his hands away from his waist area, and he refused, stating, "I'm just sick." The officers then drew their firearms and ordered the suspect to show his hands and to move them from his waist area. The suspect eventually complied and laid down on the ground with his arms extended. The officers approached the man and rolled him over, finding a semi-auto handgun under his body. The handgun was cocked and fully loaded. The man was arrested and a search of his clothing revealed a quantity of both methamphetamine and marijuana. The suspect, living on the 100 block of Westpoint Road, was booked for weapons charges, gang charges, drug charges, and outstanding arrest warrants (041 272 573).

On November 7, at 1:10 a.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Hudson when they heard a car alarm sounding and they turned onto Hudson and drove toward the alarm. The officers then saw a male, with his upper body protruding from the front passenger window of a Honda Prelude. The man, upon seeing the officers, dropped a metal bar to the ground and began to quickly walk away. The officers asked the man if he was the owner of the vehicle, and he stated, "No, I know, it was stupid." The man was booked for auto burglary and for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with auto tampering, burglary, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 272 658).

On November 7, at 2:15 a.m., Bayview officers responded to Palou and Hawes on a carjacking incident. The victim told officers that she was parking her vehicle in front of 1120 Palou when she was approached by a man wearing dark clothing and a ski mask and armed with an AK-47 assault rifle with laser sights. The suspect then threatened to kill the victim if she did not get out of her car. The first suspect was then joined by a second suspect, who was also armed with an AK-47. The suspects then entered the vehicle and drove off, east on Palou. Suspect one is described as a black male, 17-20, 5'9", 160, wearing a gray ski mask and dark clothing. Suspect two is a black male, 5'9", 170, wearing a gray ski mask and dark clothing (041 272 802).

On November 7, at 2:38 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at 3rd and 25th for an outstanding felony arrest warrant (041 818 738).

On November 7, at 4:30 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1800 block of 25th Street on a home invasion robbery call. The victim told officers that she was inside her apartment with her boyfriend when her power went off. The boyfriend opened the front door to check on the power and was confronted by two men who were armed with uzi-style handguns and were wearing black-hooded sweatshirts which were covering their faces. The suspects entered the apartment, struck the boyfriend several times on his face, and placed their guns to his head, ordering him to, "Stay down." The boyfriend began yelling for the police, and both suspects fled from the premises. Suspect one is described as a black male, 20-30, 6'0", 200, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt with red lettering on it, and black pants. Suspect two is a black male, 6'0", 180, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and black pants (041 272 971).

On November 7, at 9:50 a.m., Bayview officers went to the Doublerock Housing area to search for a man they knew to be wanted for an auto theft

arrest warrant. The suspect had also been identified recently as he fled the scene of a nearby residential burglary. The officers located the wanted man, parking a vehicle near 2432 Griffith Street, and the officers determined that the vehicle he was driving was stolen. The officers began to approach the suspect and he took off running. The suspect ran to premises on the first block of Nichols and entered an apartment, slamming the door behind him. The officers entered the premises (hot pursuit of a fleeing felon) and found the suspect hiding in an upstairs closet. The man, living on the first block of Nichols, was booked for stolen auto, for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with stolen auto, and for numerous traffic offenses. The burglary investigation continues (041 268 306).

On November 7, at 5:05 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were conducting a walk-through on the 700 block of Missouri when they saw two men, known to them from prior contacts, loitering in the area. The men, upon seeing the officers, began to walk away, but were prevented from doing so by the officers. As the men were being detained, one of them dropped a quantity of crack cocaine to the ground. The officers retrieved the crack and arrested the man, living on the 800 block of Buena Vista, for possession of crack cocaine (041 274 676).

On November 7, at 5:23 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Jennings and Egbert when they came across a male and female arguing loudly in the middle of the street. The officers intervened and spoke with both parties, who each stated that they were simply arguing and needed no police assistance. Both individuals were found to be on probation, and the male was found to be in possession of black tar heroin. The male was booked for possession of heroin (041 274 698).

On November 7, at 5:30 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 3rd and Quesada when they saw a vehicle drive past them with a "dangling" license plate. The officers ran the plate and determined that the vehicle was stolen, but the vehicle had already driven away and was lost in the area. The officers later located the vehicle parked on the 1600 block of Quesada, and as they approached it, two juveniles jumped from it and fled on foot. The officers pursued the driver, and eventually caught up to him and arrested him. The driver, 14 years old and living on the 1200 block of Shafter, was booked at YGC for stolen auto, resisting arrest, and traffic offenses (041 274 739).

On November 7, at 7:44 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were conducting a walk-through of the Oakdale / Baldwin area when they found a sawed-off shotgun hidden in the crawl space below 1044 Palou. The shotgun (with obliterated serial numbers) was seized and booked as evidence (041 274 961).

On November 7, at 9:25 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Hollister when they saw a man, known to them from numerous prior contacts, loitering on the corner. The officers knew that the man was prohibited from being in the area under a court-issued stay away order, and the officers arrested him. The man was booked for violation of a court order and violation of probation (041 275 191).

On November 7, at 10:17 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on Connecticut Street when they saw several men loitering in a parking lot. As the officers approached the group, the men all began to flee in different directions. The officers saw one of the men discard a pea-coat, and the officers picked it up and found a loaded 9mm handgun in its pocket. The gun was booked as evidence (041 275 323).

On November 8, at 12:01 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2700 block of San Bruno Avenue on a burglary in progress call. As the officers arrived, they saw a man, dressed in dark clothing and carrying a backpack, walking away from a home on the block. The man looked directly at the officers and then ran into a doorway, where the officers detained him. The officers were then approached by the female caller, who told them that she had heard someone breaking into her apartment and had phoned police. The officers checked the man's backpack and found a video camera, black translucent plastic, and women's underwear. The officers viewed the video in the camera and found it to contain images of people using a toilet, as well as images of the woman they had just interviewed (the female caller). It was determined that the male suspect was the ex-boyfriend of the woman's mother, and had apparently been filming the daughter through open windows, from her backyard area, as she dressed. The man, living on the 5500 block of Mission Street, was booked as a "peeping tom." The video and tape were booked as evidence (041 275 674).
