Thanksgiving Holiday

Basketball

I received word from Lisa Gray of UCSF that after she had made her presentation to the young men at Late Night Basketball, she received over 15 resumes from them applying for job openings. Three of the applicants were interviewed, and all three were offered positions. I have yet to hear from the other presenters how they fared. I will make the inquiries next week.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 22, at 8:30 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man at 1039 Fitzgerald for violation of his parole. The man had been found inside a vacant housing unit. The man is also a registered sex offender, and his status was checked, with the result being that his registration was current (041 331 389).

On November 22, at 11:00 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1300 block of Silliman on a robbery call. The caller told officers that three men had entered her apartment while she was there and that one of them grabbed a knife from the kitchen and held it to her throat. The other suspects then ransacked the apartment and took several items of property prior to fleeing. The suspects are described as three black males, approximately 6'0", 160, one with braided hair (041 332 860).

On November 22, at 12:25 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2100 block of Quesada on an aggravated assault call. The officers found a man inside the garage of the home bleeding from several wounds. The man, who operates a barber shop from within his garage, stated that his adult nephew had just attacked him with a crowbar for no reason. The nephew was located by the officers and arrested. A search of the area revealed the crow bar, apparently discarded by the nephew following the attack. Once the nephew had been arrested, the caller refused to provide any additional information and refused medical treatment for several deep lacerations to his arms. The 23 year old nephew was booked for multiple counts of aggravated assault (041 332 694).

On November 22, at 1:38 p.m., Bayview undercover officers were working the area around Fitzgerald and Jennings when one of the officers was approached by a drug dealer and offered crack cocaine. The dealer got into the officer's car and directed him to pick up a second individual, who also got into the car. The second man directed the officer to drive to the front gate of the Alice Griffith Development. The second man exited the car and walked into the development, returning moments later with four rocks of crack cocaine which he provided to the officer. The officer gave the man

\$40 in currency and the man again exited the car and began walking into the development. The cover officers moved in for the arrest and the man began to run away. The man was eventually caught and arrested. The first man, living in Oakland, was booked for sales of cocaine, conspiracy, and violation of probation. The second man, living on the 1800 block of Sunnydale, was booked for the same offenses (041 332 939).

On November 22, at 2:05 p.m., Bayview undercover officers were surveilling 3rd and Quesada when they saw a man walk to a parked vehicle, remove the cover from the car's steering wheel, and retrieve a piece of folded white paper from the steering wheel column which contained numerous rocks of crack cocaine. The man, living on the 1400 block of Quesada, was arrested and charged with possession of crack cocaine for sale. Approximately \$1,000 in currency, found in the man's pockets, was booked as evidence (041 333 078).

On November 22, at 4:15 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 200 block of Westpoint Road on the report of a woman who had been beaten with a mop. The caller told officers that she had just been beaten by two people (with fists), prior to being struck with a mop handle, and that she had then maced the suspects in self defense. The caller displayed a clump of "fake hair" which she told officers the suspects had pulled from her head. The caller told officers that she had been approached by a woman living nearby who was angry that the caller hadn't picked her for a "work crew." The two started arguing, and the daughter of the second woman then approached and punched the caller. The daughter later struck the victim with a mop handle. The suspect, 33 years old and living on the unit block of Westpoint Road, was booked for aggravated assault and battery (041 333 727).

On November 22, at 5:31 p.m., Bayview undercover officers were surveilling Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw a man making what appeared to be numerous drug sales. The man would greet various people on the street, go to his parked car, retrieve something from the car, and then place it on the sidewalk near the fence line. The individuals he had been speaking with were then seen to go the fence line and pick up objects. The man then entered his car and drove away, followed by Bayview officers. The man was followed to the 1200 block of Revere and detained. The man told officers he lived at the home on Revere, and the officers determined that he was on probation for drug sales and had a search condition. The officers knocked on the front door to the home and could hear people inside. Two men then jumped out of a rear window of the home and were detained by the officers. The officers entered the home and found a scale in the kitchen, as well as a quantity of marijuana in a bedroom. The officers also searched the car, finding crack cocaine and another scale. The first man, living on the 1200 block of Revere, was booked for numerous drug charges and violation of probation. The second man, living in the same home, was booked possession for sale of marijuana and violation of probation. \$1,000 in currency was seized from the home and booked as evidence (041 334 242).

On November 22, at 5:35 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1100 block of Quesada on the report of a carjacking. The victim told officers that he was parking his car at Oakdale and Baldwin when three juveniles approached him and one of them pointed a gun at him. The gunman then stated, "Give me

your car." The victim turned over his keys and the three suspects fled in the vehicle. Suspect one is a black male, 16-17, 5'10", 150, wearing a black beanie cap, black pea coat, black pants and shoes. Suspect two is a black male, 16-17, 5'10", 150, wearing all dark clothing. Suspect three is a black male, 16-17, 5'10", 150, wearing all dark clothes. The vehicle stolen is a 1986 Ford Escort, 2 door, charcoal gray, California license 1SGN248 (041 334 101).

On November 22, at 8:34 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 400 block of Burrows on a robbery call. The caller told officers that she was walking on Felton at Brussels when two suspects approached her and demanded money. One of the suspects was armed with a stick. The victim started to scream for help, and the suspect with the stick struck her in the leg with the stick. The suspects then threw the victim to the ground and fled. Suspect one is a black male, 16-18, 5'9", 130, wearing a hooded black jacket and brown pants. Suspect two is a black male, 16-18, 6'0", 150, wearing a dark jacket with a hood and dark pants (041 334 747).

On November 22, at 11:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1000 block of Connecticut on the call of a man kicking in the door. As the officers were arriving at the scene they saw a vehicle driving away which matched the description given of the suspect vehicle. The vehicle contained the ex-boyfriend of the caller, and he was detained. The caller told officers that her ex-boyfriend had come to her home and demanded entry, and when she refused, he began pounding on the door and threatening her. The ex-boyfriend was booked for terrorist threats and violating a court order (041 335 121).
