We are happy to assist applicants with this process, the end result being that we obtain additional officers from this community.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 19, at 12:29 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Albatross Way, at 1005 Connecticut for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with aggravated assault (041 320 069).

On November 19, at 7:47 a.m., Bayview plainclothes officers served a search warrant at a home on the 1400 of Shafter and confiscated numerous pieces of evidence including crack cocaine and illegal ammunition. The two brothers residing in the home were booked for drug charges and outstanding warrants (041 320 508).

On November 20, at 3:20 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Selby and Innes when they saw a man known to them from prior arrests for auto theft and warrants. The officers ran the subject for warrants and discovered an outstanding warrant for auto tampering. The man was booked for the warrant (041 423 359).

The man, living in San Leandro, has numerous convictions for car theft and burglary, and he was charged with possession of burglar tools and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 324 986).

On November 20, at 9:37 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Fitzgerald and Jennings when they saw a vehicle speeding in the area and made a traffic stop. The officers determined that the vehicle was stolen and ordered the occupants out of the vehicle. A passenger jumped from the vehicle and fled, but the officers took him into custody. The driver, 15

The officers determined that the female who had been screaming had been engaged in a shouting match with her boyfriend, but had not been assaulted. The boyfriend, living on the 1400 block of Quesada, was booked possession for sale of heroin (041 329 572).

On November 21, at 5:44 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers walked into the liquor store at 1524 Silver Avenue and interrupted what they believed to be a marijuana sale. The seller turned away from officers and stuffed a large bag of marijuana under his coat. The man smelled of marijuana and as the officers detained him he yelled out, "I've got my marijuana card, you can't (expletive deleted) with me." The officers looked at the bag of marijuana, which contained over two ounces (street value of close to \$1,000) and found that it had no markings. The officers asked the man for his medical prescription for the marijuana, and he had none. The man then provided the officers with a card which listed him as a medical Cannabis Voluntary

Caregiver. A check of the man's rap sheet revealed that he had prior arrests for possession for sale of marijuana, sales of marijuana, possession of base rock cocaine, sales of crack cocaine, and numerous other drug arrests. The man, living on the 100 block of Kiska Road, was booked for possession for sale of marijuana (041 329 726).

On November 21, at 6:30 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 300 block of Wheeler on a domestic violence call. Dispatch advised the officers that a prior call to the same residence earlier in the day had for a shots fired call.
