Police Officer Applications

From November 16 to November 22, the City and County of San Francisco will be accepting applications for the position of entry level police officer. Inter-department lateral candidates are also encouraged to apply. Interested individuals may visit the department's web-site for more details at www.sfgov.org/police. Application forms will be available at all district police stations and the San Francisco International Airport 24 hours a day until November 22.

Bayview Applicants Wanted

For the past three days I have included the above hiring announcement in the daily e-mail. The SFPD has always attempted to recruit interested applicants from the Bayview District of the city, but oftentimes, the numbers we get fall short of our goals. If you know of someone from the neighborhood who might be interested in becoming an officer, have them contact me directly. I would be happy to personally mentor them as they prepare to take their entry tests (written and oral), and would also be happy to facilitate ride-alongs for them so that they get a better idea of what the job entails. We are happy to assist applicants with this process, the end result being that we obtain additional officers from this community.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 17, at 11:00 a.m., a woman reported to Bayview officers that a man, representing himself as a lawyer, had taken over \$1,000 from her in the past six months but had never actually delivered any services. The victim was in need of a divorce, and her friend introduced her to the "lawyer" several months ago, and they met in the parking lot of the shopping mall at 16th and Potrero. The "lawyer" met her several more times in the same parking lot, and each time the victim gave him more money. When no actual papers or filings were ever produced for the victim, she eventually became suspicious and told the suspect she was going to notify the police. The suspect told her, "I don't care, go right ahead." The lawyer gave the name of Edgar Caseres and used an address of 4043 Piedmont Avenue, Oakland. The case is being investigated by our Fraud Section. The lesson here is, if you are ever meeting an attorney for the first time, and he or she tells you the meeting will take place in a parking lot, don't bring any money (041 312 903).

On November 18, at 7:00 a.m., a woman was riding her bicycle at 17th and Potrero when she got involved in a traffic altercation with a motorist. The bike rider rode down Utah to 16th and saw that the motorist was following her. The motorist eventually "swerved" into the bike rider's

lane, attempting to run her down. The bike rider arrived at her school on the 1100 block of 8th Street and ran into the school, and she then noticed that the motorist had followed her into the school. The motorist then threw a stick at the bike rider and yelled out, "I'm having a bad (expletive deleted) day." A security officer at the school intervened and obtained the woman's license plate. The case is being investigated by our General Work Detail (041 316 751).

On November 18, at 8:42 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 3100 block of San Bruno Avenue on a threats call. The male caller told officers that he borrowed \$3,000 from a Chinatown loan shark more than a year ago, and the loan shark and his associates have been harassing and threatening the man ever since. The main lender, a man known to the victim only as "Priest," is currently demanding a payment of \$10,000 from the victim, even though the man has already paid "Priest" \$5,000. The victim told officers that two Asian male suspects came to his door the previous evening and displayed a handgun. They then threatened to kill the man's family if he did not pay the money "owed." The case is being investigated by our Inspector's Bureau (041 316 814).

On November 18, at 10:56 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1300 block of Revere on a threats report. A group of four sisters told the officers that their 49 year old brother was a crack addict and had been threatening their 87 year old mother whenever she refused to give him money for crack. When the sisters had attempted to intervene, the brother had threatened to get a gun and kill them. The brother was not present when the officers were interviewing the sisters, but he returned later in the day and the officers arrested him. The man, living in the basement of his mother's home, was booked for terrorist threats (041 317 511).

On November 18, at 11:36 a.m., Bayview Station's quality of life officer responded to the railway tracks at Rankin and Evans on a complaint that numerous people were living on the railroad tracks. Employees from Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad Company had complained that they were unable to navigate their railway tracks because people had erected tents and other structures over the tracks. Additionally, shopping carts and various items of personal property had been strewn about the tracks and the surrounding area. As the officer approached the scene, she saw a man well know to her for sleeping on the train tracks. The man took off running and hid inside a bush. The officer told the man to come out of the bush, and he took off running again. The man was eventually located and told officers he had been running because he had an outstanding warrant. A check of the system revealed no such warrant, and the man was cited and released (041 317 527).

On November 18, at 1:40 p.m., a 62 year old woman living on the 1200 block of Shafter told Bayview officers that her daughter's boyfriend, a 50 year old male living with her daughter in her garage, had accused her of breaking the window on her daughter's car. An argument ensued and the daughter's boyfriend approached the caller in a threatening manner, so she sprayed him with water from a hose. The boyfriend then stepped on the caller's foot, causing her to fall down. The boyfriend was unavailable for interview (041 318 020).

On November 18, at 2:08 p.m., a man living on the 100 block of Kiska Road reported to Bayview officers that he had heard gunshots on his block the previous evening around 2:30 a.m. When the man went to his parked vehicle the next morning, he found a bullet hole in the roof of his vehicle (041 318 183).

On November 18, at 5:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2800 block of San Bruno Avenue on a call of a man and woman fighting. The female caller told officers that her boyfriend had become angry when she accused him of charging a magazine subscription to her name. The boyfriend stopped the car they were driving in, drug her out of the car, and beat and kicked her. The boyfriend then took the woman's garage door opener and threatened to go to her home on Montana Street and damage her personal property. The officers notified Taraval Station so that officers from that district could check on the home, and they did so. The woman was escorted home and an emergency protective order was issued (041 318 967).

On November 18, at 5:37 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers arrested a man, living on Middlepoint Road, at 110 Middlepoint Road for an outstanding arrest warrant from San Joaquin County charging him with possession of stolen property (041 319 084).

On November 18, at 5:43 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on Whitfield Court, at Thomas and Jennings for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 319 062).

On November 18, at 8:15 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at 3rd and Revere when they saw a group of five men huddled together and recognized two of the men as local drug dealers. The officers approached the group and saw one of the men drop some crack cocaine to the sidewalk and step on it. The officers attempted to place this man under arrest and he began to reach down the rear of his pants in an apparent attempt to conceal or destroy additional evidence (this is a common area to conceal narcotics). The officers attempted to control the man's arms, but he resisted violently. He was eventually taken into custody and a bag containing numerous rocks of crack cocaine was found hidden in his underwear. The second recognized drug dealer was also arrested (for loitering where drugs are sold), and an arrest search revealed a second bag containing numerous rocks of crack cocaine. The first man was booked for possession for sale of crack cocaine, conspiracy, destroying evidence and resisting arrest. The second man was booked for similar charges (041 319 523).

On November 18, at 10:17 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Newcomb and Toland when they saw a vehicle parked on the street and noticed that its plate was listed on their hot sheet. The officers approached the vehicle and placed the female driver under arrest. The woman was booked for stolen auto and an outstanding arrest warrant (041 317 555).
