Police Officer Applications

From November 16 to November 22, the City and County of San Francisco will be accepting applications for the position of entry level police officer. Application forms will be available at all district police stations and the San Francisco International Airport 24 hours a day until November 22.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 16, at 6:25 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the public park at Felton and Somerset and spoke with an 83 year old woman who was injured in a dog attack. The woman told officers that a dog had run toward her in a menacing manner and she fell backwards and struck the pavement. The dog never actually made contact with the woman. The woman wished no police action and the owner of the dog was identified and a report written to document the incident (041 307 556).

On November 16, at 7:28 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on Cameron Way on a domestic violence call. The female caller told officers that she and her girlfriend were walking out of the Doublerock development when a vehicle pulled up to them and the driver asked the victim her name. The female driver then told the victim, "You ain't (expletive deleted), I'm Willie's new (expletive deleted)." The suspect then began throwing oranges at the victim and the victim left the area. Some time later, the victim was at Fitzgerald and Jennings when she was again approached by the suspect in a threatening manner. The victim pulled out a knife in an attempt to hold the suspect at bay, but the suspect then tackled the victim and began to punch her. The victim told officers that her ex-boyfriend then joined the female suspect and began to punch and kick her. Additionally, numerous people at the scene then began to punch the victim, and she eventually fled the area, as did all of the suspects. Willie Andrews, 64 years of age and living at 1730 Newcomb, is the ex-boyfriend wanted in connection with this aggravated assault case. Also wanted is Willie's apparent new girlfriend, who might also live at 1730 Newcomb. She is 5'7", 190, name unknown (041 307 835).

On November 16, at 9:17 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 1700 block of Newcomb on the call of a fight. The male caller told officers that he and his ex-girlfriend had been arguing and he had asked her to return his vehicle keys. The ex-girlfriend was unhappy with the

request and struck the victim in the face with the keys, ironically, returning the keys in the process. The officers determined that the ex-girlfriend was prohibited by court order from being near the caller (ex-boyfriend). The ex-girlfriend was arrested and charged with domestic violence (041 308 350).

On November 16, at 11:15 a.m., cited a man, living on Dedman court, at 1631 Newcomb for possession of narcotics paraphernalia (041 308 720).

On November 16 ,at 12:28 p.m., Bayview's quality of life officer responded to the railway tracks at Evans and Rankin on the report of a large illegal encampment. The train operators that run on the tracks have been concerned lately that they might run over people sleeping on the tracks. The officer found the area to be covered with garbage, debris, tires, hypodermic needles, stolen shopping carts, and tents. Rats could be seen running through the garbage and debris. A man with a compound fracture was found lying on the ground next to a container. The man told the officer that he had fallen off of the container the previous night and had been on the ground, unable to move, the entire night. An ambulance was summoned and the man was taken for treatment. Four individuals were cited for illegal lodging, and one individual was booked for an outstanding drug arrest warrant (041 309 085).

On November 16, at 1:15 p.m., a woman went to Bayview Station to report that her ex-boyfriend had just battered her. The victim told the officer that her ex-boyfriend punched her and stole her keys, and when she went to her home she saw him standing in front. The ex-boyfriend then threw the keys at the victim and left. The case is being investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (041 309 483).

On November 16, at 2:25 p.m., Bayview officers took an assault report from a woman who told them that she had been walking north on Palou at Ingalls when a vehicle drove up next to her and stopped. Four women jumped from the car and demanded the victim's purse. When the victim refused to relinquish her purse, the four female suspects beat her with their fists, and one of the suspects hit her over the head with a glass bottle. The four suspects all fled the area in the vehicle they had arrived in. The victim was treated for her injuries at SFGH. Suspect one is named "Chamaria" and is 18, 5'4", 120. Suspect two is named "Precious" and is 5'7", 150, and lives on Topeka. Suspects three and four are unnamed black females. All of the suspects "...live in the area." The vehicle is described as a Pontiac Grand Am, 4 door, white in color (041 310 872).

On November 16, at 5:04 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living in Oakland, on the 100 block of Westpoint Road for an outstanding felony arrest warrant (031 409 247).

On November 16, at 10:43 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a woman, living on Alabama Street, on Elmira Street for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 311 422).

On November 18, at 3:14 a.m., Bayview officers made a traffic stop of a driver on a motorcycle on the 1100 block of Illinois. The driver, living on Eugenia, was booked for numerous outstanding arrest warrants (041 311

886).
