Late Night Basketball

We just finished another successful night of Late Night Basketball. Tonight's workshop featured presentations from Neil Whitbeck, the Apprenticeship Coordinator of the Carpenter's Union; Michael Wilson from the Construction Employer's Association; Randy Gourley of the Carpenter's Training Committee; Jeffry Recob and Charles Moore of Swinerton Builders; and Marcellus Prentice of YCD. The presentations were very informative, and it added tremendous credibility when the speakers identified two of our basketball players (who were present in the workshop) as current carpenter's apprentices who were doing very well in the program. The workshop was followed by the first round of play-offs, to be followed on Friday night by round two. (Note that yesterday's e-mail had these games being played tomorrow, but due to the holiday, they will be played Friday.)

Rescue Team

The Bayview Neighborhood Rescue Team focused on the 3rd and Newcomb area today and visited several liquor stores. While the team was at 3rd and McKinnon, a call for assistance was put out by a member of the department's Robbery Detail for the 1600 block of McKinnon Avenue (across the street). A bank robber, who is apparently responsible for numerous Bay Area bank robberies, was taken into custody.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On November 8, at 8:06 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 60 Reuel Court on a suspicious vehicle call. Dispatch advised the officers that someone in a parked car was bragging to people nearby that he had just stolen it. As the officers were responding to the scene, they received additional information via radio that a vehicle had just been stolen from 525 Phelps Street (this information was actually phoned in to Bayview Station from Pet Camp). The victim told officers that she had left her car running in front of 525 Phelps as she ran inside to take care of personal business, and when she returned a moment later, her vehicle was gone. The officers arriving on Reuel court found a man in the driver's seat of the vehicle and detained him. The officers then found the vehicle's keys under the driver side of the vehicle and the suspect was arrested. The suspect, living on the 2400 block of 3rd Street, has previously been booked for stolen auto in San Francisco in 1988, 1990, 1997, and 1999. Additionally, he is on active parole for grand theft (041 280 651).

On November 8, at 6:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 900 block of Connecticut on an assault call. The female victim told officers that she had been with a man in a car when her ex-boyfriend saw her and approached the car. The ex-boyfriend battered the woman and threatened to kill her. The ex-boyfriend pulled a large chunk of the victim's hair out and struck

her numerous times with closed fists. The officers, who knew the suspect from prior contacts, located him later in the evening and booked him for domestic violence, terrorist threats, and probation violation (041 282 867).

On November 9, at 11:57 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1200 block of Newhall on a vandalism call. The officers met with the victim who told them that he was working on his vehicle when he was approached by a suspect, who was riding a bicycle, and who offered to sell him a screwdriver. The victim declined the somewhat attractive offer to buy a used screwdriver from the man, and the suspect became angry and picked up the victim's hammer, throwing it through the window of the victim's vehicle. The victim then attempted to phone the police on his cell phone and the suspect pushed him to ground and stole his cell phone. The suspect then fled on his bicycle north on Newhall. The suspect is described as a black male, 40-44, 5'8", 165, wearing a black beanie and black clothing (041 281 574).

On November 9, at 1:29 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at 140 Dakota when they saw two men fighting and stopped to intervene. The officers separated the two combatants, and a third male then approached and yelled at one of the officers, "Back off," as he pushed the officer. The officers arrested the third man, and as he was being taken into custody, one of the original combatants head-butted one of the officers. This man was also arrested. The first man arrested, living on Faxon, was cited for battery on a peace officer, resisting arrest, trespassing (on housing authority property), and traffic violations. The second man arrested, living in San Bruno, was cited for battery on a peace officer, resisting arrest, and trespassing (041 281 900).

On November 9, at 4:02 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a woman drinking alcohol in public and approached her to issue a citation. The woman was found to have two outstanding arrest warrants and was placed under arrest. The officers searched the woman and found both crack cocaine and narcotics paraphernalia. The woman was charged with the warrant and the new drug charges (041 282 607).

On November 9, at 4:15 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 100 block of Burrows on the report of a street robbery. The female victim told officers that she was walking to the bus stop at Goettingen and Silver when she noticed a black Acura driving past her very slowly. The victim said that when she reached Silliman and Bowdoin, the Acura pulled in front of her as she was in the crosswalk and blocked her path. The victim was then approached by two female suspects who grabbed her purse and pulled on it, but the victim refused to release it and kept control of her purse. A passing motorist, seeing the action unfolding, yelled out at the suspects, and they entered the Acura and fled. The two suspects are described only as black females. Two additional black females were in the car (041 283 097).

On November 9. at 5:13 p.m., Bayview officers received information that a person was dealing drugs from her motor home at Van Dyke and Ingalls. The officers found the motor home and knocked on the door, and as it was

opened, three pit bull dogs ran out of the motor home directly toward one of the officers. The pit bulls continued to approach one of the officers in a threatening manner and the officer discharged her firearm at the dogs. The dogs were not hit, but the gunfire scared them off and they ran down Ingalls. The officers found a large quantity of both marijuana and methamphetamine in the motor home and seized the drugs. A female suspect was arrested for numerous drug charges, and a second female suspect was cited for unlawful lodging (041 280 510).

On November 9, at 10:35 p.m., Bayview officers were on parol on Terry Francois Blvd. when they saw a man and a woman in the rear of a parked van and ran the license plate. The van came back as a reported stolen vehicle, and the officers detained the couple. The female told officers that she had borrowed the van from a friend, although she did not the friend's name. The officers contacted the vehicle's owner, who assured the officers that he neither knew the suspect, nor had he given the suspect permission to have his vehicle. The woman, living on the 1700 block of Newcomb, was booked for stolen auto and outstanding arrest warrants (041 276 296).
