ROSES Sock-Hop

Crime and Enforcement Update

Willful Cruelty to a Child, Brighton Street, May 3, 8:05 a.m.

A woman living in the Bayview reported to our officers that she had dropped off her one year old child at a day care center on Brighton Street and could hear her child crying as she left. The woman looked through the mail slot and saw the owner of the center slapping her son several times. The woman went back into the premises and confronted the owner, who stated, "...that's the only way to control him when he misbehaves." The woman left the center with her child. The case will be investigated by our Juvenile Division and CPS (050 494 641).

Domestic Violence, 1014 Griffith, May 4, 3:10 p.m.

Bayview Officers Barron and Mojica responded on a domestic dispute and spoke with the female caller who stated that her boyfriend had slapped her following an argument. The boyfriend had become angry when he came to visit the victim and found her entertaining a male visitor. The victim's tires were then slashed and her house and car keys were stolen. The case will be investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (050 496 891).

Threats, 1648 McKinnon, May 4, 11:00 a.m.

Bayview Officer Barron responded on a threats case and spoke with the caller who stated that her next door neighbor, who doesn't like her, threatened her children by saying, "I'm not doing any more talking...I'm going to start shooting people. I'm going to have someone spray your house." The case will be followed up by our Investigations Bureau (050 494 782).

Possession Assault Rifle, 1240 Revere, May 4, 1:05 p.m.

Bayview Officers Mustafich, Solares and DeJesus were on patrol when they saw two locals loitering near two parked cars. One of the locals, a validated member of the "Oakdale Mob" gang, upon seeing the officers, ran into the garage area of 1240 Revere. As the gang member was running he dropped a black backpack to the ground and it was recovered by the officers. The officers found a fully loaded assault rifle inside the

backpack and arrested the gang member. The house was "frozen" and a search warrant was obtained. Numerous pieces of evidence, including live ammunition, individually packaged marijuana, a ski mask, and other items, were seized from the house and cars. The gang member was booked for possession of an assault rifle, possession of a loaded firearm, and gang charges. The second suspect was booked for possession of marijuana for sale (050 496 067).

Trespassing, 125 Tunnel, May 4, 1:36 p.m.

Bayview Officers Whitney and Mostasisa were flagged down by a woman who told them that her house was being broken into on Tunnel Avenue. The suspect was detained and told officers that he was looking for his friend and had merely gone into the wrong backyard. No entry had been gained to any homes. The suspect, living on Geneva, was cited for trespassing (050 496 346).

Aggravated Assault, 3rd and McKinnon, May 4, 6:25 p.m.

Bayview Officers McPherson and Dalton responded on the call of a battery and spoke with the intoxicated victim who was unable to sit up on his own. The victim told officers that the suspect had hit him in the mouth with a brick. The victim stated that he knows the suspect but forgot his name. The brick was still at the scene but the suspect was not (050 497 485).

Graffiti, 1044 Connecticut, May 4, 8:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Cruz and Festa responded on a vandalism call and spoke with the female caller who showed the officers threatening graffiti that had recently been scrawled on her front door. The victim's neighbor had seen the two female suspects placing the graffiti on the door. The suspects, "Joyce and Sabrina," who both live nearby, are apparently angry that the victim recently broke up a fight in which they were both involved (050 497 930).

Auto Boost, 245 Williams, May 4, 6:20 p.m.

Bayview Officers Whitfield and Norris responded on a theft call and spoke with the victim who stated that she had parked her car at the FoodsCo Store and had gone inside, leaving her purse inside the car. The victim returned to find her purse missing and was told by a witness at the scene that a woman had entered the car and taken her purse. The suspect was described only as a black female, 30-35 (050 498 154).

Battery, 32 Amherst, May 4, 10:45 p.m.

Bayview Officers Borgen and Chiang responded on an assault call and spoke with the female caller who stated that she had taken a cab home and had just paid the fare and asked for her change when the cabbie kicked her in the back. The victim was intoxicated and told officers that cab number 1210 from DeSoto Cab Company had dropped her off, but the officers checked and learned that DeSoto has no such cab number (050 498 461).
