### Crime and Enforcement Update

Officers responded to the area on a report of shots being fired. When the first unit arrived on the scene they started searching for any victims. Unable to locate any injured parties, they then concentrated on finding a crime scene. As they changed their focus they noticed several individuals in the street picking up things. As they got closer they believed that the suspects were picking up some spent bullet casings. They stopped their vehicle and exited and attempted to detain all the suspects, but only managed to stop two. Unfortunately all the other suspects ran off. The subjects were released at the scene and no evidence was collected. Officer were able to locate a vehicle that had been parked and unattended in the area that had a single bullet hole through the rear window and out the front windshield. The owner of the vehicle stated that it had been parked in the area of the shots fired. No arrests were made and it is still under investigation. (005524066)

Officers from the plain-clothes unit were in the area of Kirkwood and Mendell. They had split up with a couple on foot and a lone officer in a vehicle. The officer in the car observed two individuals walking and acting suspicious, looking over their shoulders at the officer several times. The officer did the smart thing and picked up the other officers to assist in stopping these individuals. In doing so he lost sight of the two individuals for about thirty seconds. After this brief time the individuals were no longer worried that the police were in the area and now were walking like any other citizen. The subjects were detained. In searching the ground that the subjects covered while not under surveillance an officer recovered a semi automatic handgun. It was recovered and the individuals were transported to the station for investigation. Gang task force responded and interviewed the suspects. An interesting item came from the interview. One of the suspects claimed that he was the intended victim from the shooting at Kirkwood and Mendell less that a week ago.

This is a case of an excellent job by the patrol officers. It starts out as the officers responded to call of an alarm going off at St Gregory's Church at 2:30am. The Alarm Company notified us that the alarm was coming from the gate on the Mariposa side. When the officers arrived they noticed that the gate was missing. A lot of people would have said, "It couldn't be the gate, because it ain't there." These officers happen to have admired the gate several times during their patrols, and knew exactly what it looked like. They investigated the missing gate and discovered that it in fact was wired with an alarm sensor. The suspects had to be close by, but the officers needed a responsible person to respond and confirm that the gate was stolen. Once confirmed that the gate was stolen, they went hunting. They left the church around 3am. They check most of the usual places. They had a few more in mind.
