Crime and Enforcement Update

Possible Child Abuse, 1100 block of Oakdale, May 9, 8:50 p.m. Bayview Officer McCormick took a report from a woman who stated that her ex-husband keeps threatening her new boyfriend and uses racial slurs against him (the new boyfriend is white). The woman stated that her ex-husband is a "crack head," and recently shot out the windows of her boyfriends' car, referring to him as a "peckerwood." The woman feels that her ex-husband is exposing the children to both crack cocaine and marijuana in his home (when he takes them for visitation), and stated that when she reported this to CPS the case worker ignored it because the case worker is a "play cousin" of the ex husband. The case is being referred to our Juvenile Unit for follow-up (050 517 635).

Possession Cocaine, 1756 McKinnon, May 10, 4:01 a.m. Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and determined that the driver's license was suspended. The driver was also found to be on probation and was arrested and searched. A large stash of crack cocaine was found in the driver's sock, and a wad of crumpled up money was found in his pocket. The suspect, living on Topeka, was booked for possession of cocaine for sale, violation of probation, and various traffic offenses (050 518 473).
