Crime and Enforcement Update

Robbery, Phelps and McKinnon, May 9, 7:30 a.m.

Bayview Officer McCormick took a report of a robbery from a woman who stated that she was walking down the street when a man approached her from behind and knocked her to the ground. The man then forcibly took the woman's purse and ran to a black Honda-like car and fled. The suspect is a black male, 20-25, 5'10", 170, wearing a blue pullover sweatshirt and tan pants (050 517 704).

Hot Prowl Burglary, 10 Mabrey Court, May 9, 9:45 a.m.

Bayview Officer Cohen responded on the report of a burglary and spoke with the female caller who had been asleep in her home and was awakened by noise coming from her window. The victim went to her window and saw a man trying to pry it open. The suspect fled upon being seen by the victim. The suspect is a black male, 16-19, wearing a white T-shirt (050 514 772).

Stolen Auto Arrest, 22 Dakota, May 9, 10:15 a.m.

Bayview Officer Petterson was on patrol when he saw a vehicle drive past him and determined that it had been reported stolen. The officer stopped the vehicle and attempted to place the driver under arrest, but he resisted and began to run away. The officer pursued the suspect and wrestled him to the ground, eventually gaining control and handcuffing him. The officer was surrounded by a hostile crowd and brought the suspect to Bayview Station, where the suspect provided a name which could not be verified. A group of women then arrived at Bayview Station and demanded to see the suspect. When asked which man they were there to see, they provided the suspect's actual name (apparently unaware that he was using a fictitious name), and five outstanding arrest warrants were found under the man's real name. The suspect, living on Plymouth, was booked for stolen auto, resisting arrest, driving with a suspended license, and numerous criminal warrants (050 515 178).

Robbery Arrest, 166 Dakota, May 9, 11:52 a.m.

Bayview Officer Bodisco responded on the call of a residential robbery involving a gun and spoke with the male caller who stated that his adult

son had just robbed him at gunpoint. The son had entered the premises and stolen a TV set after waving a gun at his father and stating, "I'll give you some of this." The son stays with his mother on the 800 block of Missouri and when the officers went there to speak with the mother, they caught the son climbing out a rear window and arrested him. The son was booked for both robbery and burglary (050 515 601).

Terrorist Threats, 853 Innes, May 9, 3:12 p.m.

Bayview Officers Archini and Kenney responded on a threatening phone call and spoke with the female caller who stated that her ex-boyfriend has been phoning her nonstop and threatening her because he is angry that she has a new boyfriend. The suspect resides on the 1500 block of Revere and the case will be investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (050 516 831).

Terrorist Threats, 1448 Thomas, May 9, 3:42 p.m.

Bayview Officer Damonte responded on a person with a knife call and found a woman holding a knife. The woman dropped the knife to the ground as the officer approached and she was detained. The female caller then told the officer that she had come home to find the suspect on her front porch holding a knife and drinking a beer. The suspect threatened to stab the victim, and referred to her as a "dyke bitch." The suspect, living on the 1000 block of Palou, was booked for threats and brandishing a knife (050 515 366).

Attempted Murder, Mendell and Kirkwood, May 9, 3:43 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kwan and Hui responded on the call of a shooting and found a man on the ground at the bottom of the stairs that lead to 1501 McKinnon Avenue. The officers summoned medical assistance and began administering first aid to the victim, who had been shot in the head. The victim could not be interviewed, but two witnesses at the scene provided information to the officers. Both witnesses had seen the suspect carrying a gun and then running to a vehicle and fleeing the scene. The suspect is described as a black male, 20-30, 5'6", holding a black handgun. One witness described the vehicle as a green Toyota sedan, two door. The second witness described the vehicle as a black import station wagon with no license plates, displaying a number "6" temporary operating permit (050 516 665).

Battery, Middlepoint and Westpoint, May 9, 5:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Archini responded on the report of a man bleeding on the caller's doorstep. The officers located the man and the caller told them that he had seen the victim running through nearby backyards and then collapsing onto his front doorstep. The victim was very uncooperative and told officers that he had been shooting dice with five other men who had suddenly "jumped" him for no reason. The victim provided very sketchy descriptions of the other dice players, stating that they were all black males and that one of them had gold teeth and one of them had no teeth (050 517 124).

Resisting Arrest, 2088 Bancroft, May 9, 9:59 p.m.

Bayview Officers Cahill and Wise responded to a call of a domestic fight and met with the female caller who stated that her 16 year old daughter was being held against her will inside a home on Bancroft. The officers were able to make entry to the unit and found the daughter unharmed and in the company of her 17 year old boyfriend (they were both sitting in a walk-in

closet). The officers attempted to interview both juveniles and the male became enraged and began fighting with the officers. The male juvenile was cited for resisting arrest and released to his mother. The female was uninjured and stated only that she and her boyfriend had been arguing (050 518 025).

Traffic Arrest, Resisting Arrest, Thomas and Lane, May 10, 12:40 a.m. Bayview Officers Singh and Wong were on patrol when they attempted to stop a man on a bicycle for traffic violations. The man took off on the bike and then stopped on Thomas and exchanged something (hand to hand) with another male before fleeing again. The man was eventually stopped and cited for traffic violations and delaying arrest (050 518 291).
