Public Workshop

Triggerlock Case

A notorious Bayview gangster who has been validated as a member of the infamous Westmob gang is being tried in Federal Court this week under the triggerlock program, which focuses on violent gang members found in possession of firearms. The defendant was offered a 12 year deal, which he turned down, and is now facing 42 years in federal prison if convicted. The defendant actually confessed (on tape) to Bayview officers at the time of his arrest, and Bayview officers will be testifying in this jury trial in the next few days.

Crime and Enforcement Update

False Registration, Quesada and Ingalls, March 7, 7:59 a.m.
Bayview Officer Reyes responded on an accident call and was in the process of facilitating an exchange of information between the drivers when she realized that the license plates on one of the vehicles displayed current registration, even though a computer check revealed that the registration was expired. The plate was booked as evidence and the owner was cited for false evidence of registration (050 257 035).

Illegal Lodging, Custer and 3rd, March 7, 10:20 a.m.
Bayview Officer Lavin responded to Custer and Quint on a complaint of an illegal encampment, and she found a large collection of tents, debris, metal items, shopping carts, and other property. A man approached the officer and claimed ownership of everything in the area. The man was cited for illegal lodging (050 257 706).

Illegal Lodging, 1200 7th, March 7, 9:15 a.m.
Bayview Officer Lavin responded to 7th Street on a complaint of a homeless encampment and found two males lying on the sidewalk in sleeping bags. The officer found numerous bicycles, shopping carts and debris on the sidewalk,

making passage on it impossible. The two men were cited for illegal lodging (050 257 433).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, Fairfax and Mendell, March 7, 11:15 a.m. Officer Whitney was on patrol when he saw a man, who had been there for several days, living in a vehicle. The officer stopped to talk with the man and determined that he was wanted out of Solano County for an outstanding warrant. The officer arrested the man and searched the vehicle, finding both marijuana and methamphetamine. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant and the drug charges (050 258 293).

Stolen Auto Arrest, 6600 3rd, March 7, 1:01 p.m. Bayview plainclothes officers received information from a confidential informant that a stolen vehicle was parked in the lot of the Franciscan Hotel at 6600 3rd Street, and that the driver would be returning to it shortly. The officers responded to the hotel and found three individuals smoking crack cocaine in a black Toyota. The Toyota was found to be stolen and the three individuals were arrested. One of them was found to have a key to an Audi in his pocket, and the officers located the Audi in the hotel parking lot and found it to be stolen also. As the officers were searching the Audi, a gold Lexus drove into the hotel parking lot. The officers determined that the Lexus was also stolen and detained its two occupants. The first suspect, living on the 6600 block of 3rd Street, was booked for stolen auto, conspiracy, violation of probation, and traffic warrants. The second suspect, living on the first block of Jennings, was booked for stolen auto, conspiracy, violation of parole, possession of a master key, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia. The third suspect, a transient, was booked for stolen auto, conspiracy, violation of probation, possession of a master key, and a warrant charging him with aggravated assault. AAA was contacted and advised it may wish to downgrade its rating of the Franciscan Hotel (050 258 839).

Shooting, Oakdale and Ingalls, March 7, 4:26 p.m. Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol when they received information from Parole Agent Ibay that he had just witnessed a shooting incident at Ingalls and Oakdale. The agent stated that he had seen a black male in his early 20's with dreadlock hair shooting a revolver out the window of a silver Ford Probe. The suspect and vehicle then took off at a high rate of speed and were lost in the area. Moments later, Bayview's plainclothes officers saw a silver Dodge van driving recklessly and at a high speed through the district and they followed it as it drove to SFGH. A young man inside the van was taken into the hospital with a single gunshot wound

(there was also a single bullet hole in the side of the van), and the numerous occupants of the van were detained. Parole agent Ibay later saw a group of men in front of 140 Middlepoint and recognized one of them as the shooter he had seen in the Ford Probe. The shooter was detained and taken to Bayview Station. Inspectors from our Gang Task Force responded and took over the investigation. The victim, a 19 year old male living in the Sunnydale, was admitted to SFGH. The suspected shooter, a 19 year old male living on the first block of Westpoint, was interviewed by Gang Inspectors (050 259 467).

Warrant Arrest, Phelps and Davidson, March 7, 8:20 p.m.
Bayview officers were on patrol at Phelps and Davidson when they found an overturned vehicle and saw its occupants crawling out of the back window. The officers began administering first aid and summoned medical assistance. One of the vehicle's occupants was found to be wanted out of Solano County for an outstanding warrant charging him with robbery and he was arrested (050 260 351).

Cocaine Offense, LaSalle and Osceola, March 7, 11:26 p.m.
Bayview Officers Foss and Bernal were on patrol when they flagged down by private security officers who had just taken two individuals into custody for possession of cocaine. The security officers had seen one of the men throw a golf-ball size piece of cocaine under a car when he saw the security officers approaching him. The suspect, living on Commer Court, was booked for possession for sale of cocaine and an outstanding warrant (050 260 599).

Trespassing, 1082 Pennsylvania, March 8, 12:47 a.m.
Bayview Officers Bates and Batchelder responded to the 1000 block of Pennsylvania on a "proowler" call. The officers found a man matching the description provided and detained him. The caller told officers that the detained man was her ex-boyfriend whom she had just kicked out of her apartment upon finding out that he had a drug problem. The man had been attempting to break into the caller's apartment to retrieve his property. The man was booked for trespassing and vandalism (050 260 759).
