Junk Dealer Ordinance

On Monday, March 21, the Board of Supervisors' City Operations Committee will hear Supervisor Maxwell's ordinance that creates new oversight and regulations for junk dealers. Among other provisions, the ordinance would require yearly reviews of junk dealer permits by the San Francisco Police Department and create higher performance standards, including maintenance of a detailed "Buy Book", by these businesses. The ordinance will be heard before the City Operations and Neighborhood Services Committee, which meets at 1:00 p.m. in City Hall, room 263. The trafficking of stolen property is a huge problem in southeast San Francisco, and this legislation will help address that problem through greater oversight of the Junk Dealers that purchase these goods. Come out and show your support. Crime and Enforcement Update

Stalking, Threats, 178 Elmira, March 15, 3:00 p.m.
A female victim walked into Bayview Station and reported that she has been receiving numerous threatening phone calls on her cell phone and threatening instant messages on the internet. The victim stated that just after Valentine's Day she broke off a relationship with a young man and ever since has been receiving the annoying and threatening messages which describe her daily actions and the places she goes. The case will be investigated by our General Work Detail (050 296 287).

Hot Prowl Burglary, 1827 Jennings, March 16, 9:00 a.m.
Officers Leung and Barron responded on the report of a burglary and interviewed the caller who stated that he awoke to find a man standing inside his bedroom going through his wallet. The victim yelled at the

suspect, who fled with property taken from the wallet. The suspect is a black male, 20-25, 5'6", 150, wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt with a Nike logo in front, and red and blue colored shorts (050 294 479).

Warrant Arrest, 24th and Michigan, March 16, 10:38 a.m.
Bayview Officers Harmston and Parry were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and began to approach him. The man slipped through a fence and when the officers found him again, he was in the process of relieving himself. The man was arrested for a warrant charging him with possession of methamphetamine. The man apologized for the personal indiscretion, stating that the "dump tank" in the bus he lives in was full (050 934 386).

Warrant Arrest, 1400 Phelps, March 16, 11:38 a.m.
Bayview Officers Alcaraz and Lew were on patrol when they came across a man wanted for an outstanding felony warrant and arrested him. The man, living on the 100 block of Trumbull, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine for sale (050 295 358).

Cocaine Sales, 3rd and Newcomb, March 16, 1:41 p.m.
Bayview plainclothes officers were working in the area of 3rd and Newcomb when they saw two men conversing in an apparent drug deal. One of the men entered the Bayview Liquors on the corner, returned to the second man and removed something from his mouth, handed the object from his mouth to the second man, and received currency in return. The officers arrested the buyer, finding crack cocaine in his pocket. The officers then attempted to arrest the seller and he began to swallow something and resist violently. The seller was eventually restrained, but he had swallowed whatever had been in his mouth. Packaged marijuana was located in his underwear and he was placed under arrest. The buyer, living on the 1500 block of Palou, was booked for possession of crack cocaine. The seller, living on the 1400 block of Kirkwood, was booked for cocaine sales, resisting arrest, destroying evidence and violation of probation. The seller has a slight pattern of illegal behavior in the area of 3rd and Newcomb including the following: Arrested for sales of drugs at 3rd and Newcomb in October of 2003 and subsequently convicted. Convicted of possession of drugs in December, 2004 (and still on probation from that case). Arrested for sales of drugs at 1660 Newcomb in December, 2001, and diverted. Arrested for

sales of drugs at 3rd and Newcomb in June, 2000, with the case being dismissed. Convicted of possession of drugs at 3rd and Newcomb in August, 1997. Convicted of attempted grand theft at 3rd and Newcomb in January, 1993. Numerous additional drug arrests (without convictions) at 3rd and Newcomb. I fear that this suspect is not taking the numerous efforts made on his behalf by the criminal justice system seriously (050 295 897).

Warrant Arrest, 2901 Hawes, March 16, 2:00 p.m.
Bayview Officer Whitney responded to a home on Hawes on the request of Juvenile Inspector and arrested a 17 year old male for an outstanding criminal arrest warrant (050 127 206).

Warrant Arrest, 63 Dakota, March 16, 2:31 p.m.
Bayview Officers Fowlie, Ferraez, Sanders and Rodatos responded to an abandoned unit at the request of the Housing Authority in order to remove a squatter, and found a man inside the unit who was wanted for an outstanding warrant charging him with violation of parole (050 296 340).

Warrant Arrest, 10 Cashmere, March 16, 2:38 p.m.
Bayview's plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and arrested him. The man, living on Cashmere Street, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine for sale (010 110 138).

Warrant Arrest, 3rd and McKinnon, March 16, 3:58 p.m.
Bayview Officers Dalton and McPherson were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and placed him under arrest. The man, living on the 1400 block of Hudson, was booked for the warrant which charged him with being under the influence of narcotics in a public place (050 296 641).

Homicide, 6245 3rd Street, March 16, 8:44 p.m.
Officers Hastings and Johnson responded to Jimmie's Market at 3rd and Hollister on the report of a shooting. The officers found a blood trail in front of the store but couldn't locate any victims. Dispatch then advised the officers that a shooting victim had just walked into SFGH and the officers responded to the hospital. The victim was being taken into surgery and couldn't be interviewed, but the witness who had driven the victim to the hospital told officers that he was working in his barber shop when he heard gunshots and was then approached by the victim. The witness then drove the victim to SFGH. The victim, who lived on the 1200 block of Shafter, later died of his wounds. Later in the evening, a witness who wishes to remain anonymous phoned Bayview Station and identified the

shooter, who had apparently been involved in a dispute with the victim earlier in the day. The case is being investigated by Homicide (050 297 893).
