#### Hunter's Point Meeting

The Mayor's Hunter's Point Shipyard Citizens' Advisory Committee will meet this Wednesday, March 16, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Lennar Shipyard Trailer. New business will include a discussion of the Yosemite Slough Shipyard Project, and the Redevelopment Agency Report will include a discussion on the status of funding for the historic and cultural recognition plan.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Aggravated Assault, Oakdale and Phelps, March 13, 12:37 a.m. Bayview Officers McCormick and Nichols responded on the call of a male hitting a female, and upon arrival, found a man bleeding profusely from a knife wound to his neck. The female combatant, living on the 1700 block of Revere, was booked for aggravated assault (050 281 993).

Attempted Kidnaping, Threats, 1924 Palou, March 13, 1:30 p.m. Bayview Officers Kwan and Mostasisa responded on a call from an 11 year old boy who told Dispatch that someone was kicking in the front door of his home in an effort to take his little brother. The officers interviewed the adult female in the home who told them that her baby's father had just kicked in the front door and demanded that he be given his baby son. The suspect threatened to beat the victim and then fled the premises without taking the baby. The officers searched both the area and the last known addresses of the suspect, but he was not located (050 283 381).

Robbery and Conspiracy, Silver Terrace Playground, March 13, 6:05 p.m. Bayview Officers McCormick and Rightmire responded on a call from Dispatch of a fight involving numerous black and Asian youths. As the officers arrived they saw several young people begin to run in different directions and, with the assistance of back-up officers, detained everyone. The Asian

victims approached the officers and told them that they had been playing tennis when they were suddenly attacked by a group of several youths who punched them and then stole their tennis rackets. The suspects then began striking the victims with their own tennis rackets. The first suspect, a 16 year old male living on the 1700 block of McKinnon, was booked for robbery, conspiracy and battery. The second suspect, a 12 year old female living on Treasure Island, was booked for the same charges. The third suspect, a 14 year old female living on the 1500 block of Shafter, was booked for the same charges. The fourth suspect, a 13 year old female living on Apollo, was booked for the same charges (050 284 204).

Battery / Domestic Violence, 1320 Hawes, March 13, 9:00 p.m. Bayview Officers Machi and Remedios responded on an assault call and spoke with the female caller who told them that she and her husband had been arguing. The wife told officers that it was her husband's birthday, and he had celebrated by getting drunk and phoning other women. The husband then started breaking things in the house and when the wife went to intervene, the husband punched her in the face. The husband was booked for domestic violence battery (050 285 462).

Homicide, 45 Dedman Court, March 13, 10:35 p.m. Numerous Bayview officers responded to Dedman Court on a call of several shots fired. A male was standing in front of the premises and told officers that his adult son had just shot his wife. The male asked the officers to kick the front door of the premises down and they complied, making entry to find the victim deceased as a result of gunshot wounds. The husband told officers that his son had become involved in an argument with his wife regarding his desire to take his own son from his wife, who was also present in the home. The suspect son had left the premises and returned later with a gun, shooting the father's wife. The son is currently being sought by Homicide (050 284 903).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, 400 Mansell, March 14, 10:05 a.m. Officer Miller spoke with the vice principal at Burton High School who told him that he had interrupted a drug deal in the boy's rest room and had detained a student who was selling marijuana. The vice principal had found six baggies of marijuana on the student. The student, 15 years of age and living on 8th Avenue, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale (050 286 125).

Vandalism, 1650 Davidson, March 14, 4:23 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Alcaraz and Mojica responded on the report of a vandalism in progress. The officers found two juveniles who matched the description provided by Dispatch. The callers told officers that they had seen the juveniles spray painting graffiti on Amtrak property, and the officers found numerous cans of spray paint in the backpacks of the juveniles. The first juvenile, 16 years of age and living on 23rd Street, was cited for vandalism and possession of aerosol spray paint. The second juvenile, 16 years of age and living on Castro Street, was cited for the same offenses (050 288 187).

Shooting, Kiska Road, March 14, 5:13 p.m.  
Numerous Bayview units were in the area of Kiska Road and began responding upon hearing several gunshots. The officers were unable to locate a crime scene, but 15 minutes later, were apprised that a shooting victim had just walked into SFGH. The victim told officers that he and his girlfriend had just dropped off a friend on Kiska Road when a man approached him and shot him in the chest. The suspect is described as a black male wearing a black baseball cap backwards, a black T-shirt, and black pants. The suspect had dreadlocks and gold teeth on both the top and bottom. The victim was in stable condition (050 288 438).

Illegal Lodging, Toland Street, March 14, 10:10 p.m.  
Bayview Officer Buelow was on patrol when he found a man watching television inside of a parked motorhome. The man had been warned numerous times about lodging on public streets and was cited for the offense (050 289 163).

Domestic Violence, 707 Missouri, March 14, 11:34 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Bates and Batchelder responded on a trespassing call and spoke with the female caller who said that her husband had just kicked in the back door to the home and, as she attempted to phone the police, he struck her several times in the head with the phone. The husband fled the scene, but was located later on Dakota Street by Bayview officers. The suspect, living on the 700 block of Missouri, was booked for domestic violence and violation of parole (050 289 395).
