Jobs for Bayview Youth

Crime and Enforcement Update

Knife Robbery, 600 block Arkansas, June 3, 10:45 a.m.

Bayview Officers Garate and Ernst responded on a robbery call and spoke with the victims, a man and woman, who had just been attacked and robbed. The couple had just left their home when two suspects approached them, demanding money. When the male victim stated he had no money, he was knocked to the ground. The second suspect then approached the female victim, who was pushing a baby stroller, and demanded her purse as he displayed a knife. The second victim began to run away and scream, and a nearby witness then ran toward the suspects carrying a shovel and scared them away. Both suspects then ran toward the Potrero Hill Housing Development. Suspect one is a black male, 18-21, 5'8", 160, "twists" in hair, wearing a blue shirt with red horizontal stripes. Suspect two is a black male, 18-20, 5'8", 160, wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt, armed with a knife. Note that this case may be related to the below listed grand theft case (050 620 874).

Evading an Officer Recklessly, Girard and Felton, June 7, 12:00 a.m.

Bayview Officer Singh was on patrol when he attempted to stop a vehicle for traffic violations and the vehicle took off at a high rate of speed and was lost in the area. The vehicle, a 1987 Honda, was later found parked and unattended in front of 206 Arleta. The vehicle was impounded and a search of its interior revealed a stash of marijuana (050 634 502).

Grand Theft Purse, 1631 20th Street, June 7, 10:45 a.m.

Bayview Officers Ernst, Kwan and Garate responded on a purse snatch all and spoke with the female victim who reported that she had been sitting on a bench when two suspects ran up to her and grabbed her purse from the bench. The suspects then ran south on Connecticut and east toward Missouri. The officers located a possible suspect on the 700 block of Missouri and the suspect was detained, however, the victim couldn't identify the suspect. Suspect one is a black male, 18-21, 5'8", 150, wearing a black jacket, white shirt, blue jean pants and white baseball cap. Suspect two is a black male, 18-21, 5'8", 150, wearing a beige jacket and puffy black pants (050 636 053).

Possession Stolen Property, 25th and Connecticut, June 7, 1:12 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team met with a woman who had been the victim of an auto burglary the previous day and learned that she had been contacted by a man who offered to "sell" her stolen property back to her. The suspect had provided the victim with his phone number and the officers phoned the suspect to arrange for the meeting. An undercover officer accompanied the victim to the meeting place and, after exchanging cash for the victim's cell phone, arrested the suspect. (Note that the victim checked the phone and verified that it was hers, but she found numerous photos of pit bull dogs on her phone which had not been there previously.) The team of officers then responded to an apartment on the 100 block of Dakota Street (location for suspect's phone number according to reverse directory) and knocked on the door. Officers who were covering the rear of the apartment then saw two men, accompanied by two pit bull dogs, run to the rear balcony of the house. One of the men jumped from the balcony and was taken into custody, struggling violently with officers during the arrest. Entry was eventually made to the house, and it was discovered that the front door had been barricaded with a home-made barricade made of steel re-bar and blocks which had been bolted to the wall. The door frame had also been reinforced with screws and additional wood. The officers "froze" the apartment and obtained a search warrant, eventually discovering crack cocaine, two bags of powder cocaine, two police style bullet proof vests, two sets of (drug) scales, one Glock handgun, numerous handgun magazines, a .38 caliber revolver, a "survival" knife, a gun holster, numerous rounds of live ammunition in various calibers, including .22, .40, and 45, and more than \$1,000.00 in currency. Paperwork with all three men's names on it was also found inside the apartment. The original suspect, living in the apartment on Dakota, was booked for possession of stolen property, possession of a firearm by a felon, numerous drug charges, and an outstanding arrest warrant. The second and third men, also living in the apartment, were also booked for numerous theft, drug, and gun charges, as well as for outstanding arrest warrants (050 634 922).

Indecent Exposure, 655 DeHaro, June 7, 1:39 p.m.

Bayview Officers Miller, Garate and Ernst responded to the Maxwell Middle School on the report of a man exposing himself. The officers met with the principal who reported that a local man in a wheelchair had just exposed himself in front of the school. The man, who lives on the 1000 block of Rhode Island, has been warned by the principal in the past not to loiter at the school, but the police had never been notified about this man's activities. The officers located the man at Carolina and Mariposa and arrested him for trespassing and indecent exposure (050 636 401).

Possession Cocaine, 720 Phelps, June 7, 2:32 p.m.
Honda Unit Officer Gonzalez was on patrol when he saw a man seated on the sidewalk smoking crack cocaine. The officer approached the man and arrested him. The man, a transient, was booked for possession of crack cocaine, possession of narcotics paraphernalia, and numerous outstanding arrest warrants (050 637 051).

Petty Theft with Prior Conviction, 1390 Silver, June 7, 3:20 p.m.
Bayview Officer Chu responded to the Bell Market on a shoplifting case and took custody of a man caught by store security stealing several items. The man, living on Jennings, was booked for petty theft with a prior conviction (050 637 465).

Arson, 1907 25th Street, June 7, 4:35 p.m.
Bayview Officers Sanders, Bodisco and Rodatos responded on a fire call and spoke with the female resident who stated that an acquaintance had come to her home demanding the ten dollars owed to him. The man was also upset over a train set. The man entered the victim's home through the unlocked front door and told the victim he would burn her house down if he didn't get his train set and the ten dollars. The victim then heard her smoke detectors sounding and went to her living room to find that a fire had been set. The victim believes that the man who had just threatened to burn her house down because of the train set may be responsible for this arson. The case has been assigned to our Arson Unit (050 637 647).

Aggravated Assault, 4524 3rd Street, June 7, 5:05 p.m.
Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson responded on a stabbing report and met with a man with a facial wound. A second man was found lying on the sidewalk with a stab wound to his neck. The first man told officers that the second man was angry at him for dating the second man's aunt. The first man then "pummeled" the second man, knocking him to the ground and beating and kicking him. A third man then came along and stabbed the second man in the neck. The second man was booked for aggravated assault and the stabber was not described (the second man was very uncooperative) 050 637 722.

Aggravated Assault, 700 Missouri, June 7, 7:00 p.m.
Bayview Officer Fowler spoke with a female victim who reported that she was washing her car when a man approached her from behind, called her a "bitch," and punched her in the head several times. The woman was knocked unconscious and fell to the ground. The victim couldn't describe the suspect and could provide no reason for the attack (050 638 190).
