The 2005 San Francisco Black Film Festival will present a tribute to the black families who worked on the Oregon Railroad on Friday, June 10, at 4:00 p.m. at the Eureka Theater, 215 Jackson Street. This is your invitation to witness a brilliant tribute to the little known and sometimes forgotten pioneers in labor and industry, "Railroad Men." The 30-minute documentary chronicles the migration of African American men and women who came from the south and mid-west to work in the passenger railroad trains from 1905 to 1970. Crime and Enforcement Update

Drug Search Warrant, 406 Kansas, June 2, 7:00 p.m.

Officers assigned to our Narcotics Detail served a search warrant at an apartment at 406 Kansas Street and recovered methamphetamine, currency, and drug paraphernalia. The female occupant, listed on the search warrant and living in the apartment, was booked for numerous drug offenses (050 619 015).

Robbery, 3rd and Hudson, June 5, 2:16 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lane and Winesberry responded on a robbery call and spoke with the male caller who reported that he was waiting for the bus when an orange colored Buick LaSalle pulled up to him and three suspects exited the car. The suspects robbed the victim at gunpoint and then fled in the Buick. The suspects are described as black males wearing dark clothing (050 627 137).

Warrant Arrest, Jerrold and Rankin, June 6, 3:35 p.m.

Officers assigned to our Honda Unit were on patrol when they saw a woman seated in a car with a crack pipe in her hand. The woman was found to have an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with grand theft and was arrested. The woman resides on 34th Avenue (050 608 414).

Vehicle Arson, Jerrold and Toland, June 6, 4:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Siguido and Darnell responded on a vehicle on fire call and spoke with a cabbie who reported that he saw a fellow cab driver throw an object into his cab moments before it burst into flames. The cabbie stated that he and the suspect had been involved in a "road rage" incident a month ago, and the suspect has been harboring a resentment ever since. The case will be followed up by our Arson Unit (050 633 338).

Shot Fired, 5 Osceola, June 6, 4:50 p.m.

Bayview Officer Lantrip spoke with security guards who had located a spent round and turned it over to police. A shooting had been reported in the area on May 28 (050 597 712).

Aggravated Assault, 25 Hudson Court, June 6, 5:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Johnson and Erb responded on a fight involving a brother and sister. The sister told officers that she and her brother had argued regarding how the garage should be cleaned, and the brother became angry and then punched and choked the sister. The brother was booked for aggravated assault (050 633 407).

Cocaine Arrest, Keith and Underwood, June 6, 6:54 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes officers were on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer seated in a car. The officers approached the man, who is currently on probation, and saw him attempting to hide (and crush) some crack cocaine. The man was arrested and booked for possession of both crack cocaine and marijuana, as well as violation of probation and destroying evidence (050 633 792).

Burglary, 14 Hawkins Lane, June 6, 7:17 p.m.

Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson responded on a prowler call and spoke with the female caller who had come home to find her home ransacked. The victim then entered her bedroom and found a man rummaging through her property. The suspect pointed a gun at the victim and then fled. The suspect is a black male, 20-25, 6'0", 190, wearing a brown hat, black jacket, and tan pants (050 633 811).

Robbery, San Bruno and Thornton, June 6, 10:08 p.m.

Bayview Officer Singh responded on a robbery call and spoke with a man who reported that he had just been robbed at gunpoint. The man, who is Spanish speaking, said that he was approached in front of the "El Toro" bar by two Spanish speaking Hispanic males who pointed a gun at him and then robbed him of his personal property. Suspect one is a Hispanic male, 22-26, 5'11", 185, wearing a black jacket and armed with a silver handgun. Suspect two is a Hispanic male, 23-26, 5'9", 160, skinny build (050 634 223).

Robbery, Oakdale and Industrial, June 6, 11:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Rodriguez and Dangerfield responded on a robbery call and spoke with two male victims who reported that they were walking down the street when a group of four juvenile suspects approached them and threw them to the ground. The suspects then stole the victims' property and fled on foot. The suspects are all described as black male juveniles, 15-17, average height and weight, wearing dark clothing (050 634 370).
