(as a baby), items which I obtained from Isaac's mother, and Isaac's favorite softball bat, which our Bayview Station softball team proudly continues to use. In addition, I will be carrying the Bayview Rotary Club

flag with me and will photograph the flag atop Kilimanjaro. In this way,

the entire Bayview community will climb Kilimanjaro with our group as a tribute to one of their fallen sons.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On January 6, at 5:40 a.m., Bayview Officers Chu and Rodriguez responded to

62 Harbor Road on a call of a person breaking into a unit. The officers found a woman outside the unit who told them that her mother had locked her

out. The officers identified the woman and determined that she had an outstanding arrest warrant charging her with burglary and they placed her

under arrest. As the officers were escorting the woman to their car, she

kicked out a window in the home and the mother demanded that she be charged

Shell Station at that location, told officers that a man with a gun had entered the office and demanded all of the money. Upon receiving the money, the man fled to a waiting car, driven by another person, and fled

black knit cap, bandanna over mouth, black jacket over white T-shirt, and

black pants. The suspect vehicle is a 1980's Honda Prelude, 2 door, black,

small spoiler in back, passenger side of vehicle has plastic with masking

tape covering window. Suspect two (driver) was not seen (050 019 205).

On January 6, at 10:21 a.m., Bayview Officer Lamma accompanied the housing

manager at the Alice Griffith Development to a unit on Cameron Way to remove a man who was illegally residing in the premises. The man had two

outstanding warrants for his arrest and was booked for the warrants $(050 \ 019 \ 584)$.

LaSalle when they saw a vehicle drive past them with no license plates. The officers recognized the driver of the vehicle from prior contacts and

vehicle stopped on San Jose Avenue, and saw the driver jump from the vehicle and run onto the light rail tracks. The officer chased the suspect

into the Glen Park BART Station, losing him inside the station. The officers went back to the vehicle, which the passenger was still seated inside, and searched the vehicle. The officers found a large quantity of

cocaine, several pieces of evidence tying the car to the man who had run ,

and a bullet-resistant vest in the trunk. Additionally, during the tow search of the auto, a .25 caliber semi-auto handgun was found secreted under a heater vent. The man wanted in connection with this case is Michael Gomez, 25 years of age, living on Peabody Street (050 020 315).

On January 6, at $5:33~\mathrm{p.m.}$, Bayview Officers Mustafich, Aherne, and Stoumen

were on patrol at McKinnon and Newhall when they saw a women they knew to
