Stay Away Orders

Regular readers of these e-mails have noticed that numerous Bayview cases are made involving court issued stay away orders. Although many of these orders are issued in domestic violence cases, many more of them are issued in drug cases. The officers use the enforcement of these orders as a tool to discourage the district's most notorious and recalcitrant drug dealers from plying their trade at their favorite corners. Although the dealers are not too happy about these orders, they have proven to be an effective tool.

Crime and Enforcement Update

On January 5, at 5:24 a.m., Bayview Officers Wilhelm and Brown were dispatched to 19th and Vermont in regards to a traffic accident. The driver's vehicle had struck a parked vehicle, and the officers determined that the driver, living in the city of Salida, had two outstanding warrants for his arrest. The driver was booked for the warrants, which charged him with drunk driving and driving with a suspended license (050 014 283).

On January 5, at 11:35 a.m., Bayview Officer Lamma was on patrol at Jennings and Key when she stopped a vehicle for expired registration. The driver, living on the 2400 block of Sutter, had an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with possession of cocaine and he was arrested. During an arrest search, an additional quantity of crack cocaine was found in the man's pockets and he was also charged with possession of crack cocaine (050 015 526).

On January 5, at 11:42 a.m., Bayview Officer Hui took a report from a woman who stated that her sister, who is the former care giver for their mother

(living on the 1600 block of Newhall), had forged their mother's signature and used their mother's credit card accounts to obtain goods and services without their mother's knowledge. The reportee discovered that her sister had used several of her mother's credit accounts, all of which were now in arrears, and had also failed to pay their mother's tax and utility bills. The case has been reported to Adult Protective Services and will be investigated by our Fraud Detail. The suspect (sister), living on the 1500 block of Van Dyke, is no longer the caregiver for the mother (050 015 673).

On January 5, at 1:35 p.m., Bayview Officer Remedios was on patrol at Newhall and Bayview when he saw a man he knew to be wanted for a theft case from 2490 San Bruno which occurred January 1. The man, living on the 100 block of Kiska Road, was charged with theft (050 001 155).

On January 5, at 2:00 p.m., Bayview Officers Cohen and Hurley took a report of a burglary from a man who told them that two bikes had been stolen from his backyard shed on the 1500 block of 25th Street. A home nearby has been under construction for some time and has suffered two burglaries (050 016 239).

On January 5, at 4:27 p.m., Bayview Officers Fitzpatrick, Benzinger, Aherne, and Scott were on patrol at Innes and Newhall when they saw a white van parked on the sidewalk of Innes and recognized the van as one which had been described by complainants as being involved in illegal drug sales. The officers approached the two occupants of the van and observed a large bag of marijuana near the driver. The driver then provided the officers with his "cannabis club card," which identified him as a "caregiver." The officers saw that the large plastic bag contained ten smaller baggies of marijuana, and when the officers pointed out to the man that cannabis clubs do not package marijuana in this manner (for later street sales), the man replied, "Oh, I see what you mean." The man, living on Scotia, was booked for possession for sale of marijuana (050 016 922).

On January 5, at 8:45 p.m., Bayview Officer Madrid took a report of a "road

rage" incident from a woman who stated that she and her friend were driving near Sawyer and Visitacion when they saw another woman they both know (and who knows one of their boyfriends), and the woman began following them in her car. The third woman (suspect) then rammed the vehicle carrying the first two women, and proceeded to "chase" it. The suspect was able to ram the victim's vehicle three more times prior to fleeing the area. When questioned as to the motive for the attack, the second woman would only state, "The bitch is just crazy." The officers went to the suspect's home on the 1000 block of Silver but were unable to locate her (050 017 895).

On January 5, at 10:33 p.m., Bayview Officers Bradford and Olson were on patrol at Barneveld and Jerrold when they stopped a man on a motorcycle for expired registration. The officers could see an "Allen wrench" sticking out of the punched ignition, and when they questioned the man about the motorcycle's ownership, he replied, "I don't know, it's not mine." The officers ran the motorcycle's plate and VIN, and they both came back clear, so they had the Daly City Police Department contact the registered owner, who verified that his motorcycle had recently been stolen and he had not yet had a chance to report it as such. The man was arrested for stolen auto, and a search of his person revealed a quantity of methamphetamine hidden in a cigarette box, and a quantity of vicodin in a baggie. The man was also charged with the drug violations (050 017 992).

On January 5, at 10:48 p.m., Officers Nichols and Archini were on patrol at San Bruno and Gaven when they stopped a vehicle for mechanical violations. The officers determined that the driver's license was suspended, and conducted an inventory search of the vehicle prior to towing it. The officers found both methamphetamine and narcotics paraphernalia in the car and seized them both. The driver, living on the 100 block of Gaven, was booked for possession of methamphetamine, possession of narcotics paraphernalia and traffic offenses (050 018 075).

On January 6, at 2:05 a.m., Bayview Officers Lew and Correa were on patrol at 3rd and Revere when they saw a man seated in a parked vehicle and recognized the man from prior contacts and knew that he has a stay away order from this location. The man, living on Capitol, was booked for the stay away order at Bayview Station (050 018 376).

On January 6, at 5:14 a.m., Bayview Officers Birco and Foss responded to 4348 3rd Street on a burglary call. The officers arrived and saw a man holding a crow bar in his hand and prying on the front door of the premises (Metro PCS Store). The suspect, upon seeing the officers, ran west on Kirkwood and then west on LaSalle. The suspect then jumped a fence on the 1700 block of LaSalle and numerous officers cordoned off the block searching for the suspect. The suspect was not located, but is described as a black male, 22-25, 5'10", 180, wearing a black knit cap, gray pea coat and gray sweat pants (050 018 445).
