Operation Dream Snow Trip

On Saturday, February 26, Operation Dream will be taking 30 kids from public housing to the Boreal Ski Resort for a day of inner-tubing and sledding. Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 8, at 3:00 a.m., Bayview Officer Leung and back-up officers responded to the 1700 block of Newcomb on the report of a stabbing. The officers found an injured and bloody female victim (very intoxicated) in front of the home, and saw a broken out window (on the front of the home) with blood around it. The victim told officers that her husband was very liquored up from the previous evening and had attempted to awaken her at 2:00 a.m. When she didn't wake up, the husband punched her several times in the face. The victim then threw the television set at the front window as a way of calling for assistance. The officers advised her to utilize a phone in the future. The officers located the husband in the upstairs bedroom, and he was both naked and very drunk. The husband was treated for his injuries (from the broken glass) and booked for domestic violence (050 150 934).

On February 8, at 9:09 a.m., Bayview Officer Lamma was on patrol at Newhall and Revere when she saw a vehicle drive past her and noticed that the vehicle's license plate was on her "hot sheet." The vehicle was pulled over and the driver was arrested. The driver told the officer that he had rented the truck he was driving from U-Haul and had simply kept it too long. (U-Haul had reported the truck as being stolen.) The driver was booked and the case is being investigated by our Auto Detail (050 142 389).

On February 8, at 10:31 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the Bret Harte School on Gilman on a report from the principal that a parent had reported that her first grade daughter had been "raped" last week by four first

grade boys in the girls' restroom. A female officer interviewed the victim and was told that nothing had ever happened with any of the boys, as they were "not allowed" in the girls' restroom area. The victim's friend was also interviewed, and she provided the same story as the victim. The officers interviewed the victim's mother, who reiterated that her daughter had been "raped." The victim is receiving a medical exam and counseling today, and the case is being handled by our Juvenile Division. The mother of the victim's friend was also interviewed, and she stated that nothing had taken place (050 151 932).

On February 8, at 12:08 p.m., Bayview Officer Lamma responded to a home on Lois Lane on the report of an assault. The male caller was very drunk and told the officer that his roommate had locked him out of their apartment. The officer interviewed the roommate, who was sober and lucid, and the roommate stated that the caller was taking a combination of prescribed medication and alcohol and had been acting strangely and was becoming increasingly aggressive. The roommate directed the officer to the caller's room and pointed out eight bottles of different prescription medications, along with an empty bottle of Viagra? The roommate told the officer that the caller had actually assaulted him, and then threatened his life. The roommate signed a private person arrest and the caller was arrested for battery, threats, and public intoxication. The suspect was booked at the hospital ward of the jail due to the many medications (and alcohol) he had apparently ingested (050 152 435).

On February 8, at 2:20 p.m., Bayview Officer Berge responded to Napoleon and Evans on the report of a battery. The victim, who was in a wheelchair, told the officer that she had just been in a dispute with a Muni driver who had refused to allow her to get on the bus, and after arguing with each other, the Muni driver sprayed her with pepper spray and left. The officer administered first aid to the woman, but the woman displayed no symptoms of having just been pepper-sprayed. The Muni driver was eventually located and told officers that she had been in an argument with the woman, but that

she had not pepper-sprayed her. There were no witnesses to the incident and the case is being referred to our Investigations Bureau for follow-up (050 153 217).

On February 8, at 3:17 p.m., Bayview Officer Reyes responded to the 2700 block of San Bruno Avenue on a call from a man that his brother was causing problems and was wanted for an outstanding Department of Corrections warrant. The man was located and booked for the warrant (050 153 245).

On February 8, at 4:51 p.m., Bayview Sergeant Fabbri was on patrol on 25th Street when he saw a man he knew to be a "serious sex offender," and stopped to determine if the man had properly registered. The man was seated in a vehicle at the time of the contact, and assured Sgt. Fabbri that he had properly registered. A records check revealed not only that the man had not properly registered, the vehicle he was seated in was a stolen auto! The man was arrested and a search of the vehicle's interior revealed a quantity of methamphetamine. The suspect, living on Diamond Street, was booked for failing to register as a sex offender, possession of meth, stolen auto, violation of probation, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 153 580).

On February 8, at 5:55 p.m., Bayview Officers Olson and Archini were on patrol at Hawes and Palou when they stopped a vehicle with five occupants for traffic violations. The five occupants were all juveniles and none of them were wearing seatbelts. The officers were in the process of issuing citations when they discovered a loaded handgun inside the backpack of a passenger in the rear seat. This passenger, a 17 year old male living in Hercules, was booked at YGC for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun. A second passenger, living on the 1300 block of Ingalls, was found to be in possession of crack cocaine and was booked at YGC for simple possession. A third passenger, living in Daly City, was found to be in possession of marijuana and was cited for simple possession. The vehicle was a rental car, rented by the driver's mother, and was returned to the mother who eventually responded to the scene (050 153 994).

On February 8, at 8:00 p.m., Bayview Officers Mitchell and Haynes responded to the first block of Cashmere on a call that two children were not being properly cared for and were being abused by their mother. The officers

found two infants being cared for by a baby-sitter. The officers found the home to be in disarray and saw that the children appeared dirty and uncared for. While the officers were interviewing the baby-sitter, the mother of the two children, carrying a large beer in each hand, arrived home. The mother was angry that the officers were in her home, and when she was questioned about a variety of injuries (both old and new) that the children appeared to have, she became very defensive and uncooperative. The children were taken into protective custody and a social worker from CPS was brought into the case. The mother later made death threats against a neighbor who she believed had summoned the police (050 154 801).

On February 9, at 12:29 a.m., Bayview Officers Olson and Archini were on patrol at Newcomb and Toland when they saw a man in a parked vehicle and determined that the vehicle was stolen. The man, who has two prior arrests for stolen auto and lives on 22nd Avenue, was booked for stolen auto (050 155 229).
