Baseball Players Wanted

As mentioned in previous e-mails, we are currently forming several Bayview youth baseball teams through the Police Activities League and are looking for players. Our teams are co-ed and will be comprised of kids in the 3rd and 4th grades. We will have a Hunter's Point team which will practice on the field on Kiska Road (adjacent to Milton Meyer), a Potrero Hill team which will practice next to the Rec Center, and a Doublerock team which will practice at Gilman Park. We are still trying to find enough gloves for the kids, so if you have any extra baseball gloves and would like to donate them, you may drop them off at Bayview Station. Additionally, just as we did last year, we would like to have local businesses sponsor the teams, which involves supplying them with uniforms. Crime and Enforcement Update

On February 18, at 1:26 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol on the 1000 block of Connecticut when they saw a man they knew to be on probation attempting to quickly walk away from the area. The officers walked toward the man and saw that he was holding a Visine bottle containing liquid heroin. As the officers detained the man, he squeezed the heroin out of the bottle and onto the ground. The officers arrested the man and found five rocks of crack cocaine in his hat. The man, living in Oakland, was booked for possession of heroin, possession for sale of crack cocaine, destroying evidence and violation of probation (050 193 188).

On February 18, at 6:48 p.m., the Bayview plainclothes team responded to Pomona Street to conduct a probation search of an individual well known in the Bayview. The officers found both the probationer and her boyfriend in the home, and a search of their bedroom revealed a loaded handgun, a stash of both marijuana and methamphetamine, a large plastic baggie containing powder cocaine, a quantity of ecstasy, and an additional stash of powder cocaine (secreted in a stereo cabinet). The two individuals were booked

for numerous weapons and drug charges, and the probationer's probation was revoked (050 194 318).

On February 18, at 11:11 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at Connecticut and Wisconsin when they stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and found that the driver was smoking marijuana as he drove. The officers found several individually wrapped marijuana baggies in the driver's pockets and arrested him. A passenger in the vehicle was found to possess a quantity of ecstasy, and a second passenger was found to possess fourteen individually wrapped baggies of marijuana. The officers also found an open bottle of Brandy inside the auto. The driver, living in Daly City, was booked for possession for sale of marijuana. The passengers were arrested for various offenses (050 494 346).

On February 19, at 6:51 a.m., Bayview Officers Cohen and Gallo responded to the 800 block of 20th Street on a medical call. The officers met with Fire personnel who were providing treatment to a woman who had been found lying on the ground between two parked cars. It was determined that the woman had expired sometime during the night and the case was assigned to Homicide. The woman, originally identified only as a "Jane Doe," was later properly identified and lived on 6th Street (050 195 617).

On February 19, at 9:15 p.m., Bayview Officers Correa and Lew responded to the 900 block of Vermont on the call of a shooting. The officers found a Hispanic male on the ground, bleeding from a gunshot wound to his chest. The officers began first aid and summoned an ambulance. The victim was transported to SFGH, where he died of his wounds. The officers interviewed numerous neighbors, none of whom saw anything. Some neighbors did hear one or two shots, followed possibly by a vehicle leaving the area (050 197 419).

On February 20, at 11:24 a.m., numerous Bayview officers responded to Silver and Yale on the report of an auto burglary in progress. The officers approached the vehicle described and saw an Asian male jump from a black Volkswagen and flee on foot. The officers pursued and detained the male. The officers then contacted the owner of the vehicle who verified that the suspect had no permission to be in the vehicle. The suspect, living on Crescio Court, was booked for auto burglary, possession of burglar tools, attempted auto theft, and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 198 796).

On February 20, at 1:49 p.m., Bayview Officers Ferraez and Alcaraz responded to Hudson and Reuel on the report of a shooting. The officers found a man with a single gunshot wound to his head and began administering first aid. The victim told officers that he was walking on Hudson at Cashmere when he was approached by three males who told him that he

couldn't walk down the street, since they "owned" it. One of the suspects removed a gun from his clothing and shot the victim in the face. Suspect one is a black male, 20-25, 5'8", corn row hair, heavy build, wearing a white T-shirt and black pants, armed with a revolver. Suspect two is a black male, heavy build, wearing a multicolored baseball hat and brown jacket. Suspect three is a black male, wearing a white jacket and blue jean pants (050 199 249).

On February 20, at 10:32 p.m., Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson were on patrol at 19th and Illinois when they came across a woman sleeping in a van with a loud generator operating just outside the van. The officers contacted the occupant and found her to possess heroin and numerous hypodermic needles and syringes. The woman, homeless, was booked for possession of heroin (050 200 573).

On February 21, at 5:38 p.m., Bayview Officer Nichols responded to Felton and Somerset on the report of a robbery. The victim told officers that several people had just assaulted and robbed him and had then boarded a Muni bus. Responding officers stopped the bus and located and detained the described suspects. The victim, along with witnesses, positively identified one of the detained suspects as the main assailant. The 15 year old suspect, living on the 2000 block of Quesada, was booked for robbery at YGC (050 203 204).

On February 21, at 9:06 p.m., Bayview Officers Madrid and Hastings were on patrol at 3rd and Keith when they saw a vehicle drive past and noticed that the vehicle's license was on their hot sheet. The officers stopped the vehicle and detained its occupants. The driver, living in Richmond, was booked for stolen auto, various traffic offenses, and a warrant charging him with burglary and possession of burglar tools. The two passengers were released without charges (050 185 561).
