Crime and Enforcement Update

On December 6, at 3:37 p.m., a Bayview officer took a report of a theft from a Christmas tree lot at 550 Bayshore. The employee / victim told officers that the fence to his lot had been knocked down and numerous trees had been stolen. Later in the day, the victim saw a man, possibly homeless, selling Christmas trees from the back of a pick-up tree directly across the street from his lot. When the victim approached the man to discuss the situation, the man became very "confrontational" and refused to give the trees back. The man then fled with the trees in his truck. The officer later located the truck, parked and unattended, and towed it with an investigative hold (041 386 594).

On December 10, at 11:36 a.m., Bayview officers responded to a home on the 100 block of Dakota on a burglary in progress call. The officers entered the unit through the open front door and saw a man loading stereo equipment into a bag. The man was arrested for the burglary. The man is well known to Bayview officers and is believed responsible for a string of burglaries committed in recent weeks on Potrero Hill. Numerous burglar tools were recovered at the scene, and when the suspect was searched, both crack cocaine and smoking paraphernalia were located. The suspect was booked for burglary, possession of cocaine, possession of paraphernalia, and possession of burglar tools (041 401 443).

On December 10, at 12:23 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers were on patrol at LaSalle and Newhall when they saw a group of known drug dealers loitering together on the corner. The officers detained the men and ended up arresting two of them for loitering for purposes of drug sales. The first man, living on the 1500 block of Jerrold, was booked for the loitering charges and violation of (drug) probation. The second man, living in Vallejo, was booked for loitering. The third and fourth individual were admonished regarding their activity and entered into our loitering database (041 401 948).

On December 10, at 1:40 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a man on the 1100 block of Hollister for violation of a court-issued stay away order and an outstanding narcotics arrest warrant (041 402 269).

On December 10, at 1:51 p.m., Bayview officers arrested a known drug dealer at Keith and Thomas and charged him with loitering for purposes of engaging in narcotics sales (041 402 413).

On December 10, at 3:44 p.m., Bayview plainclothes officers responded to 3rd and Quesada on a call of a man with a gun. As the officers were en-route they drove through 3rd and Palou and saw a group of approximately 20 young men standing in the intersection. The officers saw that one of the young men matched the description given of the armed man, and they approached the young man. The officers could see that his jacket was "uneven" and they ordered him to place his hands in the air. The officers approached the young man and located a fully loaded handgun in his pocket. The young man, 15 years of age and living on the 1500 block of Ingerson, was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, possession of stolen property and gang charges (041 402 617).

On December 10, at 6:00 p.m., Bayview officers took a report from a 15 year old male who stated he had been "jumped" on a Muni bus parked at Palou and Hawes. The victim stated that a suspect approached him and blocked his path, and then punched him in the chest. The suspect then removed the victim's cell phone from his pocket and fled from the bus. The suspect is a black male, 15-16, 5'7", 150 (041 403 104).

On December 10, at 11:00 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 600 block of Hamilton on a robbery call. The victim told officers he had been at Hamilton and Woolsey and had been approached by three suspects who asked for money and cigarettes as one of the suspects held the victim in a "choke hold." The suspects then punched the victim prior to fleeing. The suspects are black males, 20-25, 5'9", one 180 pounds, the other two 130 pounds (041 404 209).

On December 11, at 9:34 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Yosemite on a report of a vehicle with bullet holes in it. The officers located a parked auto with four bullet holes in it, and the officers towed the auto for purposes of conducting a follow-up investigation (041 404 817).

On December 11, at 4:42 p.m., Bayview officers responded to a business of the 200 block of Bayshore on a shooting call. When the officers arrived they found a man on the floor of the office with a gunshot wound to his head. The officers administered first aid and summoned an ambulance. The victim was transported to SFGH, where he expired due to his wounds (three gunshot wounds). The shooter, seen by witnesses near the scene, is a black male, 6'0", thin, wearing a dark beanie cap, dark "puffy" jacket (possibly lighter shade on sleeves), and dark pants. The shooter entered a black Nissan or Honda and fled north on Bayshore toward Hwy 101. The vehicle was described by a second witness as possibly a gray Acura. The victim in this case was the prime suspect in an many as five Bayview murders, and was also the suspect in numerous shooting cases, including an attempted murder case from three weeks ago in which two young men were shot on Cargo Way (041 406)

On December 12, at 4:14 a.m., Bayview officers responded to the 2400 block of Griffith on a carjacking call. The victim told officers that he had driven to the 2400 block of Griffith to meet with his friend "G," who is a fellow "rapper." The victim stated that he was then approached by two suspects, one of whom pointed a handgun at him and demanded his keys. The two suspects then drove out of the Alice Griffith Housing Development toward 3rd Street and the victim phoned police. Shortly thereafter, the security guard at Alice Griffith saw the vehicle drive back into the development with two occupants, neither of whom had been in the vehicle when it left. The officers responded into the development and saw four individuals standing near the parked auto, but all four individuals ran upon seeing the officers. The original suspect was a black male, 18-23, 6'0", 170, wearing a baseball cap, black hooded sweatshirt and blue jean pants (041 407 582).

On December 12, at 4:33 a.m., Bayview officers responded to 3rd and Revere on the report of a man with a gun who was shooting the gun near a "club." The officers arrived at the scene and saw a man who matched the description given by Dispatch (wearing an orange and white jersey with matching black and orange "Jordan" shoes). The officers saw several shell casings on the ground, and as they searched the immediate area around the suspect, they located a handgun on top of the tire of a parked auto. The suspect, living on the 6600 block of 3rd Street, was booked for reckless discharge of a firearm, possession of a loaded firearm by a felon, and violation of probation (041 407 598).

On December 12, at 7:45 a.m., Bayview officers arrested a man, living on the 1600 block of Quint, for an outstanding arrest warrant (041 407 786).

On December 12, at 10:00 a.m., a Bayview officer responded to Ingleside Station to translate for a Cantonese speaking victim of a robbery which had occurred in the Richmond District. Four juvenile suspects were in custody in a robbery case, and when the officers searched the suspects, they found credit cards belonging to an additional victim (who required the translation services). Although the robbery series being investigated did not occur in the Bayview, all four of the suspects did (Jerrold, Santa Fe, Quint, and Turner Terrace). The case is under investigation by our Robbery Unit (041 408 029).

On December 12, at 11:00 a.m., a Bayview officer took a report from a man on the 400 block of Bayshore who had seen a suspect breaking into his parked auto. The victim described the suspect, who ran from his car upon being confronted, as a black male, 40, 5'5", wearing a red knit cap, beige pants, and a blue coat. The suspect was carrying a red bag (041 408 342).

On December 12, at 1:08 p.m., Bayview officers were on patrol at Westpoint and Middlepoint when they saw a man loitering and recognized him as someone not currently residing on the property. The officers approached the man, living on Bertha lane, and cited him for trespassing (041 408 582).

On December 12, at 2:12 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the Greyhound service station at 1140 7th Street on a call of a newborn baby which had

found in a bus restroom. A Greyhound maintenance worker told officers that he was preparing to put chemicals into the toilet when he noticed something stuck in the toilet bowl. The worker removed what he thought was a bag and discarded it, only to realize later that it was a newborn baby. Homicide Inspectors were called to the scene and conducted an extensive investigation regarding the identity of the passengers who had been on the bus. A woman who had been acting strangely prior to being removed from the bus in Sacramento was eventually identified and located. The case is under investigation (041 408 790).

On December 12, at 12:25 p.m., a Bayview officer was on patrol on Egbert when he saw a vehicle driving by and noticed that the vehicle was in the computer system as being stolen. The vehicle took off and was located later by the same officer. Both occupants of the vehicle had fled, but the driver was located hiding in a nearby garage on Orsi. The suspect, 14 years of age and living on Apollo, was cited for stolen auto and released to her guardian (041 408 502).

On December 12, at 3:45 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 400 block of Bayshore on a call of a man with drugs on his lap passed out in a car. The officers located the man and arrested him for possession of crack cocaine. The man, living in South San Francisco, was also charged with possession of narcotic paraphernalia (041 409 077).

On December 12, at 7:50 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1400 block of Innes on a robbery call. The victim, who delivers Chinese take-out food, told officers that he was delivering food to a home on the 1400 block of Innes and received no answer to the home's doorbell. As the victim was walking back to his car, he was approached by four suspects, all armed with guns, who demanded his money and property. After the suspects had taken the victim's currency and wallet, they attempted to rip a necklace from his neck, but he pulled back, telling the suspects that his mother had given him the necklace. The suspects punched the victim in the face and then went to his vehicle and stole property from his female friend, who was seated in the vehicle. The suspects then rummaged through the vehicle and stole additional property. Suspect one is black male, 20-25, 5'10", 150, wearing a dark beanie cap, black skinny puffy type jacket, armed with a revolver. Suspect two is a black male, 5'8", 140, wearing a dark beanie cap, dark jacket, armed with a silver revolver. Suspect three is a black male, 5'8", 140, wearing a dark beanie cap, dark jacket, armed with a black revolver. Suspect four is a black male, 5'8", 140, wearing a dark beanie cap, dark jacket, armed with a silver revolver. Note that the victim was robbed just three weeks under similar circumstances on Rebecca Street (041 409 726).

On December 12, at 8:19 p.m., Bayview officers responded to the 1600 block of Palou on a robbery call. The victim told officers that he was entering his home when he was suddenly approached by a suspect armed with a gun who demanded his property. The victim pushed the suspect away from him and the suspect struck the victim in the face with the gun prior to fleeing. The suspect is a black male, 30-40, 6'0", 230, wearing a blue hooded coat, tan pants, carrying a 9 mm handgun (041 409 776).
