General Community Information

I received great news from Damone Hale of the Joe Lee Gym yesterday. Five young men from the Bayview will be attending school at Porterville Junior College this fall and will be playing on the school's basketball team. The young men have been given jobs in the area and will room together also. Four of these young men played in our Late Night Basketball program and we wish them the best in Porterville (even though we're still smarting from how the young men defeated our police team soundly last month).

Murder Rate Down

Due to an increase in violence in our district this past spring, former Deputy Chief Greg Suhr assisted us by "loaning" several officers from other districts to the Bayview for the summer months. These officers work with our "Ceasefire" team, which focuses on gun violence and gang crimes. As a result of the work of these teams, as well as the work of all of our other Bayview officers, there have been no homicides in the Bayview since June 10. During this same period last summer, we had six homicides.

Housing Crime Down

I just received the July crime stats today for our four main public housing developments in the Bayview. There were 34 "Part One" crimes reported in the month of July in these developments (homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, pursesnatch, theft from a locked vehicle, and stolen vehicles). This compares to 51 crimes reported in July of 2004, a 33 percent reduction for 2005. The officers assigned to these developments have done a great job, and we're going to continue to focus on reducing crime in public housing, particularly violent crime.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Cocaine Arrest, 1874 25th Street, August 17, 12:58 p.m. Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and stopped to place him under arrest. The man was accompanied by a 17 year old male friend who was found to possess both crack cocaine and marijuana. The first man, living on the 1000 block of Connecticut, was booked for a warrant charging him with domestic violence. The juvenile, living on the 3400 block of Jennings, was booked for possession of crack for sale and trespassing on public housing property (050 922 238).
