Crime and Enforcement Update

Shooting into an Occupied Building 1005 hrs.

Bayview Officer Alcaraz responded to the unit block of Kiska on a report that someone had fired shots into the building over the weekend. There is no suspect information.

Attempted Strongarm Robbery 1025 hrs.

Bayview Officers Mostasisa and Barron responded to the 1000 block of Palou on a report of a battery. Upon arrival, they met the victim who said that she was collecting cans for recycling. A man walked up to her and demanded money. When she told the man she did not have any money, he grabbed her and threw her to the ground. Officers searched the area for the suspect but did not find him. The suspect is described as a black male, 30-35 years old, 5'7", 200 lbs.

Possession of Marijuana for Sale, Misdemeanor Warrant Arrest  
1232 hrs.

Bayview plainclothes Officers Scott, Lyons, and Lantrip were on patrol in an unmarked unit in the area of 3rd St./Palou when they saw 3 males loitering on the corner engaged in what appeared to be a narcotics transaction. The officers stopped and detained 2 of the men. One man walked away before the officers could make the u-turn and get back to the location. One of the men detained had a warrant and was arrested. During the arrest search, officers found individually wrapped baggies of marijuana on him. The other man was interviewed admonished per 11532 of the Health and Safety code. 11532 H&S states that any person who loiters in a high drug trafficking area and has been previously admonished as per 11532 for that location can be arrested by any police officer if he returns. This

man was then released.

Attempted Murder/Gun 1509 hrs.

Bayview Officers Alcaraz and Winters responded to Kiska and Kirkwood on a report of a shooting victim. Upon their arrival, numerous people pointed east on Kirkwood and said that the shooting suspect fled in that direction. Many people gave bits and pieces of information, but refused to identify themselves. The officers were able to piece together suspect and vehicle information. They found the suspected "shooter" vehicle at Kirkwood and Earl.

At the same time, Dispatch advised that the shooting victim was being driven to the San Francisco General Hospital by a private auto. Bayview Plainclothes Officers Scott and Stoumen went to SFGH to wait for the victims. They found the victim who was shot in the leg. No arrest has been made. This incident is being investigated by the Gang Task Force.

Strongarm Robbery 2155 hrs.

Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell responded to the unit block of Middle Point on a report of a robbery. Upon arrival, they met a man who said that he was walking to his residence when 6-10 suspects approached him and demanded money. When the man refused, several of the suspects began to punch and kick the man in the head. The suspects stole several items of the man. Numerous police units searched the area for the suspects but did not locate them. The suspects are described only as black males, 16-19 years old.
