Memorial Garden for Officer Isaac Espinoza

This Sunday, April 10, marks the one year anniversary of the death of Officer Isaac Espinoza. Officer Espinoza was shot and killed on Newhall Street while attempting to stop a local gang member who was armed with an AK47 assault rifle. At 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, officers assigned to Bayview Station will dedicate a garden to Isaac's memory behind Bayview Station. This garden would not have been possible without the generous efforts of Topher Delaney and her employees at SEAM (on Illinois Street). Members of the public are welcome to attend the ceremony.

Apprenticeship Exposition

Crime and Enforcement Update

Possible Burglary, University and Dwight, April 5, 1:05 p.m. Bayview Officer Hui responded on the report of a burglary and spoke with the caller who stated that three or four suspects had been attempting to enter her home using a variety of keys. This information was reported to the caller by a concerned neighbor. The suspects, described only as black males, 18 to 20 years of age, were seen to enter a black two door Nissan Sentra with California plates of 5JGB861 and leave the area. The victim in this case had her purse stolen some time back and is concerned that the suspects were attempting to enter her home using the stolen keys. The locks have been changed and the case is being investigated by our Burglary Section (050 378 857).

Warrant Arrest, Lane and Revere, April 6, 8:53 a.m. Bayview Officer Altorfer was on patrol when he saw a man he knew to be wanted and placed him under arrest. The man, living on the first block of Latona, was booked for a drug warrant (050 377 489).

Carrying Concealed Weapon, Selby and Jerrold, April 6, 1:30 p.m. Bayview Officer Cohen responded on the report of a person brandishing a firearm from a vehicle. The female caller told officers that a woman she has had prior disputes with had just threatened her with a firearm. The officers located the suspect and her boyfriend and searched their vehicle,

finding no firearms. The female suspect did have a court issued stay-away order which prevents her from contacting the caller, and she was booked for violating the order. The caller was accompanied by a male she identified as her current boyfriend, and he was found to have a court order which prohibited him from contacting the caller also. He too was arrested and booked (050 378 766).

Methamphetamine Arrest, Latona and Bayview, April 6, 3:11 p.m. Bayview Officers Stoumen, DeJesus and Benzinger were on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer displaying something to a couple double-parked in a car. The man, upon seeing the officers, dropped the object to the ground, which the officers recovered and found to be a quantity of methamphetamine. The man, living on the 1400 block of Thomas, was booked for possession of both methamphetamine and marijuana (050 379 269).

Warrant Arrest, Gilman and Giants, April 6, 4:30 p.m. Bayview Officers Lamma and Doherty were on patrol when they stopped a woman for traffic violations and she provided them with a name which the officers believed was not hers. When the officers asked the woman for the address associated with the name she had provided (which came back with a record), she couldn't provide it. The woman eventually provided her actual name and was found to have four outstanding warrants for her arrest. The woman, living on the 1300 block of Thomas, was booked for a variety of warrants charging her with theft, possession of stolen property, petty theft with a prior, and violation of probation (from Santa Clara County) 050 379 601.

Shooting, 1300 block of Palou, April 6, 5:43 p.m. Bayview Officers Lyons Scott and Izaguirre, along with Sgt. Fabbri, responded to a home on Palou to conduct a probation search on a person living there who is believed to be involved in a recent district shooting. The officers located the suspect and searched the residence. The suspect had an injured hand and told the officers that it had been "...grazed by a gunshot." This fact alone led the officers to believe that perhaps the man had been involved in the shooting being investigated (050 372 207).

Cocaine Arrest, 4524 3rd Street, April 6, 7:15 p.m. Bayview Officer Dalton was on bike patrol when he saw a man sitting on a milk crate placing a lighter to a crack pipe. When the man saw the officer, he said, "Uh oh," and attempted to conceal the crack pipe. The officer confiscated the pipe, which contained a rock of crack, and the man stated, "That's just a five dollar rock." The man, a transient, was booked for possession of crack and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 380 216).

Stolen Auto Arrest, Palou and Keith, April 6, 6:18 p.m. Bayview Officers Olson and Kenney were on patrol when they stopped a man on a motorcycle for traffic violations. The officers determined that the motorcycle had been stolen from Atwater, California, during a commercial burglary, and the driver was placed under arrest. The driver told the officers that the motorcycle belonged to his son, who lives in the Doublerock Development. A booking search of the driver revealed powder cocaine in one sock and both marijuana and ecstasy in the second sock. The man, living on the 1300 block of Palou, was booked for stolen auto and numerous drug charges (050 380 034).

Bayview Officers Benzinger, Aherne, DeJesus and Izaguirre were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle which matched the description of a vehicle used recently in a drive-by shooting. The driver, wearing a bullet proof vest, was found to have a suspended license. As the officers were speaking with the driver about his license, they were surrounded by a hostile crowd. One member of the crowd began to yell out, "...there's going to be another Espinoza killing...there's going to be a 2005 name on the wall, just like Espinoza." The man also told the officers, "...that's why our kids are going to grow up to kill your kids." The man making the threats has prior arrests for weapons possession, and has been known to carry firearms. The driver was booked for traffic violations and the vehicle was impounded (050 380 498).
