

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE April 4, 2005

Track Event

This Saturday, April 9, a track and field event will take place at Phillip Burton High School for boys and girls age 14 and under. This event, sponsored by 100 Black Men of the Bay Area, Inc., will have both a life skills workshop and training for track and field events.

Shipyard

The Mayor's Hunter's Point Shipyard Advisory Committee will meet next week from Monday to Thursday to deal with a variety of topics. The CAC will meet Monday at 6:00 p.m. The Business & Employment committee will meet Tuesday at 6:00 p.m. The Executive Committee will meet Wednesday at 6:00 p.m., and the Planning Committee will meet Thursday at 5:30 p.m. The CAC meeting will take place at 1800 Oakdale Avenue, and the rest of the meetings will take place in the Lennar trailer.

Crime and Enforcement Update

Search Warrant Service, 1526 VanDyke, March 31, 2:30 p.m. Members of our Narcotics Unit, accompanied by members of our Bayview plainclothes team, served a search warrant at a home on Van Dyke Avenue and located a large cache of drugs, a firearm, live ammunition, several thousand dollars in currency, and a variety of material used in the sales and packaging of narcotics. The subject of the search warrant, a man living in Oakland, was arrested and booked for numerous drug and weapons charges (050 356 320).

Drug Arrests

April 1, 8:32 a.m., Bayview Officers Alcaraz and Mojica met with officers assigned to our Marine Unit at Illinois and Mariposa and were provided numerous pieces of narcotics evidence which had just been seized from a boat anchored in the harbor. The boat, belonging to a local drug dealer, was searched pursuant to the suspect's probation conditions (050 356 944).

April 1, 12:30 p.m., Bayview Officer Adams was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and, as he spoke with the driver, was overwhelmed by the pungent aroma of marijuana. The officer found a large stash of marijuana both inside the car and on the driver's person (one large baggie was stuffed into one of his socks). An additional stash was found inside a "Sesame Street" backpack. PBS will be none too thrilled

with this development. The man, living on 17th Street, was booked for numerous drug and traffic violations (050 360 274).

April 1, 3:38 p.m., Bayview Officers McPherson and Dalton arrested a man at 1631 Newcomb they knew to be wanted for outstanding warrants and found narcotics paraphernalia on his person. The man, living on Lee Street, was booked for the warrants and the new charges (050 912 563).

April 1, 8:09 p.m., Bayview plainclothes Officers Benzinger, Mustafich and Solares were on patrol when they saw three men loitering in front of the Joe Lee Gym. One of the men, upon seeing the officers, ran into the gym and was eventually detained. The man, living on the 1400 block of LaSalle, was booked for drug loitering (050 361 802).

April 3, 3:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Dockery and Siguido stopped a man for traffic violations and he identified himself to them as "Leroy Brown." With all due respect to Jim Croce, the officers did not believe the man and voiced their suspicions. The man eventually provided his actual name and was cited for numerous traffic violations, as well as possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 366 802).

Robberies

April 1, 7:35 p.m., Bayview Officer Hastings responded to the car wash at 3070 San Bruno and spoke with a woman who had just been robbed. The victim told officers that she had been at the car wash at 16th and Potrero when a man approached her and stole the money she was holding in her hands. The suspect ran to a waiting car, driven by a second suspect, and fled the area. The suspect is a black male, 40, 6'0", 160, a "discolored, possibly white" eye, short hair (or bald), wearing a black puffy vest made from shiny parachute material. Suspect two is a white female, 30, with a tattoo on her right arm. The suspect vehicle is a green Toyota with plates of 2GAH197 or 4GAH197 (050 361 749).

April 3, 9:31 a.m., Bayview Officers Siguido and Reynoso responded to Westpoint and Middlepoint and took a report from a woman who stated she had just been robbed. The woman told officers she had been at the corner when a man approached her and asked, "What's up my (n-word)?" The man then tried to pull the victim's purse from her grasp, and when he failed, he

struck the victim on her head with a bottle. The suspect is a black male, possible name of Reginald, 40-45, 5'10", 210, wearing a blue peacoat and blue jeans (050 365 945).

Warrant Arrests

April 1, 2:15 p.m., Bayview Officers Mojica and Alcaraz saw a man they knew to be wanted at Fitzgerald and Griffith and began to approach him. The man took off running and was eventually captured following a lengthy foot pursuit which ended by the man hiding inside a nearby home. The man, living on the 200 block of Harbor Road, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (050 360 917).

April 1, 10:29 p.m., Bayview Officers Benzinger, Fitzpatrick, Aherne and DeJesus arrested a man at 6600 3rd Street for a warrant charging him with violation of parole. The man provided officers with a fictitious name, and when they persisted in their efforts to obtain his actual name, he replied, "Damn, a man can't even abscond any more." The officers expressed their sympathy for the man's plight, and then booked him (050 362 151).

Burglaries

April 1, 7:54 a.m., Bayview Officer Whitney took a report from a woman living on the 2000 block of Revere who told him that she had just returned to her garage when she saw a man running away with the purse she had left inside her parked auto. The suspect is a black male, 16-18, 5'7", 145, wearing a black windbreaker and baggy blue jean pants (050 358 752).

April 2, 4:30 a.m., Bayview Officers Bates and Batchelder were on patrol at 1301 Minnesota when they saw a man walking down the street carrying two golf bags filled with golf clubs. Although this is a common sight in this part (industrial) of the district, the time of day led the officers to believe that something might be amiss. The officers stopped the man and asked him for his name, to which he responded, "I don't know if I want to tell you my name." The man then told officers that a friend had given him

the golf clubs, and when the officers asked for the friend's name, the man replied, "God." The officers knocked on doors in the area and located two victims who verified that their golf clubs had just been stolen from their garages. The suspect, living in Oakland, was booked for burglary, and two counts of possession of stolen property (050 362 753).

Stolen Autos

April 2, 1:58 p.m., Bayview Officers Kwan and Hui responded to the 2200 block of Revere on a stolen auto call and found a car parked and unattended which had been reported stolen. The officers surveilled the vehicle, and shortly thereafter, two young men approached the car and entered it. Both men were detained, and one of the young men was found to possess the keys to the vehicle (the keys too had been stolen). April 3, 5:30 p.m., Bayview Officers Fowler and Hastings responded to Northridge and Dormitory on the report of 7 to 8 juveniles in a vehicle "...spinning donuts" in the intersection. The officers found a juvenile seated inside a vehicle with its engine on, and as they approached, the juvenile took off running. The officers pursued the juvenile, eventually catching him, and determined that the car was stolen. The juvenile, 12 years of age and living on the 100 block of Kiska Road, was cited for stolen auto and released to his mother (050 367 349).

Domestic Violence

April 2, 8:55 a.m., Bayview Officers Sanders and Siguido were on patrol at 25th and Connecticut when they saw a woman holding a butcher knife and were then told by a man that the woman had just hit him in the head with a frying pan and was about to flatten his car tires. The man was booked for violating a restraining order which prevents him from going near the woman. The frying pan and knife were booked as evidence (050 362 929).

on the report of a stolen auto and spoke with the female caller who told her that her boyfriend had beat her in the face and then choked her. The boyfriend, living in Manteca, was booked for aggravated assault and domestic violence (050 366 880).

The boyfriend, living on Sunrise Way, was booked for domestic violence and violation of parole (050 366 404).
