#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Robbery, Mansell and Goettingen, April 26, 7:50 p.m.  
Bayview Officer Buelow responded on the report of a robbery and spoke with the victim who stated that she had been standing at the bus stop when a woman jumped from a car which had just pulled up and approached her. The female suspect stole the victim's purse and then fled in the vehicle. The suspect is a Hispanic female, 18-22, 5'3", 130, chin pierced with a silver stud, wearing a short sleeve tan T-shirt. The vehicle is described as a black Toyota Celica (050 463 759).

Warrant Arrest, 4440 3rd Street, April 27, 12:16 p.m.

Bayview Officer Dalton was on patrol when he saw a man he knew to be wanted and placed him under arrest. The man, living on Lobos Street, was booked for the warrant (050 466 189).

Found Gun, 180 Cashmere, April 27, 1:50 p.m.

Bayview Officers Darnell and Mojica responded on the call of a found gun and spoke with the a man who had been cleaning the grounds when he found a loaded handgun behind a trash can. The gun had been reported as stolen from Eureka, California in July of 1996, and was booked as evidence (050 466 565).

Sex Offender Arrest, 3rd and McKinnon, April 27, 3:27 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when the officers saw what appeared to be a drug transaction and began to approach the two individuals involved. One of the men took off running and was pursued by the officers, who eventually caught and detained him. The detained man was found to be in possession of heroin and was arrested. The man was also found to be wanted for a warrant charging him with violation of parole, and additionally, was found to be in noncompliance with his sex registration requirement. The man was booked for all of the above (050 467 080).

Warrant Arrest, Shafter and Lane, April 27, 4:12 p.m.

Bayview Officers Benzinger, Aherne and Mustafich were on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and placed him under arrest. The man, living on George Court, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (050 467 115).

Shooting, 71 Nichols, April 27, 4:18 p.m.

Bayview Officers Fowler and Hastings were on patrol when they heard shots being fired in the Alice Griffith Development and began responding there. As the officers arrived, a group of anonymous witnesses yelled out to them, "The blacks and Samoans are shooting at each other." The officers found several spent shell casings and located numerous vehicles with bullet holes in them. Officers assigned to our plainclothes unit then began receiving anonymous phone calls regarding the identity of the shooters, and the officers located and detained numerous possible suspects, and located a gun case as well. The case will be followed up by our Gang Task Force (050 467 165).

Shooting Arrest, 4 Nichols, April 27, 5:07 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was following up on the above shooting when they received numerous phone calls from witnesses who identified the two main shooters. The officers saw both men loitering in the area and began to approach them. One of the men was detained, and the second man ran into a nearby unit and slammed the door behind him. The officers pursued the man and detained him, and froze the premises pending the issuance of a search warrant. The officers located and seized a 9 mm handgun and ammunition from the unit. The officers then located a second 9 mm handgun hidden in the planter box at 209 Cameron, and this was seized also. A search warrant was obtained for 4 Nichols, and both crack cocaine and marijuana were found and seized inside the premises. The first suspect, living on Nichols, was booked for numerous weapons, drug and gang charges (both suspects are member of the "Rock Solid" or "2-Rock" gang. The second suspect, living on the 1100 block of Gilman, was booked for the same

charges. Note that these same two suspects had just been booked by Bayview officers on February 24 for aggravated assault with a gun at 1100 Gilman. The first suspect had also just been booked for sales of cocaine at 2 Nichols on April 24 (050 467 165).

Threats, Battery, Warrant Arrest, 1475 Quesada, April 27, 6:41 p.m. Bayview Officers Festa and Cruz responded on the call of a fight and a possible homicide. The officers arrived to find two men arguing and learned that they were a landlord and tenant. The landlord told officers that his tenant had punched him twice and threatened to "kick (his) a\_\_." The tenant was arrested for threats and battery and was taken to Bayview Station, where he again threatened to harm his landlord (when he gets out of jai), and then threatened to harm the arresting officers. The suspect then made racial slurs toward the (Asian) arresting officer. Not surprisingly, the officers also found that the suspect was wanted for an outstanding warrant which charged him with...threatening the life of a peace officer (050 467 886).

Robbery, 2250 McKinnon, April 27, 7:55 p.m. Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson responded on a robbery call and spoke with the female caller who told them that she was approached by two men, one of whom was armed with a gun, and robbed of her personal possessions. Suspect one is a black male, 18-30, 5'10", 150, wearing dark clothing and carrying a black handgun. Suspect two is a black male, 5'10", 200, wearing dark clothing (050 468 113).

Attempted Robbery, Egbert and Newhall, April 27, 8:25 p.m. Bayview Officer Coleman took a report of a robbery from a woman who stated that she was walking down the street when a man ran up to her and began punching and kicking her. The man then tried to steal the woman's purse, but a passing witness yelled at him and he took off running. Due to darkness, no suspect description could be obtained from the victim (050 468 210).
