#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Trespassing, 96 Westpoint Road, April 26, 8:47 a.m.

Bayview Officers Robinson and Rodatos were performing a premise check at a vacant housing unit when they found four squatters living in an abandoned unit. The four individuals were arrested and three were cited for trespassing. The fourth individual was booked, since he was just cited a few days prior for the same offense (050 460 959).

Theft of a Firearm, 1494 Revere, April 26, 8:55 a.m.

Bayview Officers Nasir spoke with a man who stated that someone had stolen his two handguns, which he had stored under the mattress in his bedroom. The victim believes that his 15 year old granddaughter stole the guns, and this same girl was recently implicated in a case involving the sale of firearms at Thurgood Marshall High School. Threats / Vandalism, 1229 Ingalls, April 26, 9:51 a.m.

Bayview Officer Mostasisa took a report from a man who stated that he parked his car on Ingalls and later heard the car alarm sound. The victim then saw his ex-girlfriend standing next to his car and holding a knife.

The victim then saw the ex-girlfriend slash his two front tires and break out his side mirror. The ex-girlfriend then fled to a waiting car and drove away from the scene. The victim stated that the driver of the getaway vehicle was his sister, who is best friends with his ex-girlfriend and is currently "...hating on (him)." The case will be investigated by our Domestic Violence Unit (050 461 117).

Possession Narcotics Paraphernalia, 1747 Quesada, April 26, 11:20 a.m. Bayview Officers Mojica and Darnell responded on the report of drug dealing and found a woman seated in a parked car. The woman was in possession of two crack pipes and was arrested. The woman, a transient, was cited for possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 461 844).

Juvenile Detention, 4000 3rd Street, April 26, 1:20 p.m. Bayview Officers Darnell and Mojica responded on the report of a group of young men selling drugs. The officers found three young men walking away from the area and upon detaining them, determined that one of them was wanted for an outstanding juvenile warrant. The suspect, living on the 1600 block of Kirkwood, was booked at YGC for the outstanding warrant (050 462 494).

Fraudulent Checks, 3801 3rd Street, April 26, 2:08 p.m. Bayview Officers Parry and Harmston responded to Wells Fargo Bank on a fraud call. As the officers entered the bank they saw a man walking quickly toward the exit door, and when they approached him, he took off running. The officers pursued the suspect and caught him several blocks away. The bank employees identified the suspect as the individual who had presented a check from "Malcolm Drilling Company" made payable to the suspect for payment. The bank employees verified with Malcolm Drilling that the check was stolen and fraudulent, and then summoned police. The suspect, living on the 2000 block of Keith, was booked for fraud and attempted grand theft (050 462 892).

False Personation, 116 Middlepoint, April 26, 2:09 p.m. Bayview Officers Robinson and Dockery had recently cited a man for trespassing and realized upon looking at his mug photo that he had provided a false name. The officers correctly identified the man and saw him standing on Middlepoint Road today. The officers approached the man and asked him about the name he had provided to them when being cited. The man admitted that he had provided his brother's name, and has been doing so whenever he gets cited. The man, a transient, was booked for false personation and an outstanding drug warrant (050 462 488).

Possession Stolen Property, 7th and Hooper, April 26, 5:45 p.m. Bayview Officers Festa and Cruz responded on the report of an auto burglary in progress and met with an off-duty San Francisco Police Department sergeant who had just chased down and arrested the suspect. The original caller told officers that he had seen the arrested man breaking into a parked auto and then stealing the stereo from inside the vehicle. The caller had flagged down the off-duty officer as he was driving by. The stolen property, which had been discarded by the suspect, was recovered nearby. The owner of the vehicle was brought to the scene and identified the recovered stereo as his. The suspect, a transient, was booked for possession of stolen property, resisting arrest, and violation of probation

(050 463 408).

Robbery Arrest, 975 Bayshore, April 26, 10:10 p.m.

Bayview Officers Borgen and Chiang responded on a pursesnatching call involving four female suspects who were last seen running away from the area. The Asian female caller told the officers that she had exited the bus and was then approached by a female suspect who pulled her hair and forced her to the ground. Three additional suspects then approached and began kicking the victim, eventually stealing her purse and fleeing on foot. The four suspects ran onto Silver Avenue and attempted to steal a purse from a second victim, but the victim refused to let it go and the suspects fled again. Responding officers found and detained three of the suspects as they ran from the area, and they were all positively identified by both victims. The first suspect, 16 and living on the 4400 block of 3rd Street, was booked for two counts of robbery and one count of conspiracy. The second suspect, 18 years of age and living on Garrison Street, was booked for the same charges. The third suspect, 17 years of age and living on the 4400 block of 3rd Street, was booked for the same charges (050 464 111).

Possession Firearm, LaSalle and Phelps, April 27, 12:59 a.m.

Bayview Officers Farrell, Anderson and Singh were on patrol when they attempted to stop a vehicle for traffic violations and the driver refused to pull over. The passenger in the rear seat opened the door as if he was going to exit, and the vehicle then took off with the passenger still inside. This went on for several blocks and the vehicle eventually pulled over and the rear passenger got out of the vehicle and fled on foot. Two of the officers pursued the man and saw him pull a revolver from his waistband as he ran. The officers drew their weapons and ordered the man to stop, but he continued running and then threw the revolver to the ground. The officers retrieved the gun and managed to chase down the suspect. The suspect, living in Oakland, was booked for possession of a firearm by a felon, possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, and resisting arrest. The suspect was also booked for a warrant charging him as a parole violator (050 464 434).
