#### Quality of Life Phones

For the past year, we have utilized three quality of life phones in the Bayview District. These phones allow members of the community to contact our officers directly on non-emergency calls that are of a continuing nature. We are currently evaluating the effectiveness of these phones. Please drop me a line with your opinion as to the effectiveness of these phones. In the next couple of months we will be making a decision on whether or not to continue their use.

#### Police Recruiting

We will send you out on a ride-along in the district so that you can become acquainted with the actual job, and I will sit down with you to discuss what you can do to prepare for the entrance examination and background investigation.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Aggravated Assault of a Peace Officer, Palou and Crisp, April 22, 8:35 a.m. Bayview Officers Doherty and Lamma were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle with no license plates. The officers determined that the driver had a suspended license and when they informed the driver that he was under arrest he became violent and began to fight with the officers. A crowd of onlookers surrounded the officers and began yelling at them. The officers were eventually able to arrest the driver and brought him to the station. The suspect stated that he was injured during the arrest and the officers brought him to SFGH, where he began to yell at both the treating physician and the additional hospital staff. The suspect had to again be restrained

and bit one of the officers during this struggle. The suspect, living on Baldwin Court, was booked for assault on a peace officer and numerous additional charges. The suspect was also booked for an outstanding arrest warrant (050 445 729).

Possession Cocaine for Sale, 1643 Quesada, April 22, 1:08 p.m. Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer speaking with another man on the street. The drug dealer handed something to the second man, who then walked away. The officers detained the dealer and found him to possess both crack cocaine and marijuana. The suspect, living on the 1500 block of Kirkwood, was booked for drug charges, violation of probation, and an outstanding drug warrant (050 447 571).

Possession Marijuana, 1600 Palou, April 22, 7:36 p.m. Bayview Officers Fitzpatrick, Solares and Stoumen, along with Sgt. Fabbri, were on patrol when they saw a known local drug dealer displaying his wares to a prospective client. The officers approached and arrested the man, who was in possession of seven baggies of marijuana. The suspect, living on Blythdale, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale (050 448 422).

Possession of a Firearm, 1294 Shafter, April 22, 8:20 P.M. Bayview Officers Chu and Rodriguez responded on the call of a man with a gun and spoke with the caller who told them that the suspect had just fled in a vehicle. Additional Bayview units stopped a vehicle matching the description given and found that the driver was armed with a handgun and an illegal magazine. The man was arrested and the caller was then interviewed more thoroughly. The caller told officers that the suspect had threatened to shoot him earlier following a family argument. The suspect, living on Treasure Island, was booked for numerous weapons and assault charges (050 448 654).

Robbery, 50 Cashmere, April 23, 1:00 a.m. Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell responded on the report of a robbery and spoke with the male caller who told them that he was visiting a female

friend when a male entered the premises and robbed him at knifepoint. The officers went back to the premises and spoke with the female, who told them that it was her ex-boyfriend who had committed the robbery. The female identified the ex-boyfriend as Steve Green, although there is no record of this individual anywhere and it is likely that this is not his actual name. The case will be investigated by our Robbery Detail (050 449 367).

Grand Theft, Barneveld and Napoleon, April 23, 2:44 p.m.  
Bayview Officer Damonte responded on a grand theft call and spoke with the elderly male caller who stated that he had just finished his work shift and was counting some money in his truck when three juveniles approached him on foot, stole his money, and took off running. The victim began yelling and chased the suspects, and a witness saw this and helped the victim pursue the suspects. The victim and witness caught two of the suspects, and the responding officers caught the third. The first suspect, 14 years of age and living on Arballo Drive, was booked for grand theft and conspiracy. The second suspect, 14 years of age and living on 3rd Street, was cited for the same charges. The third suspect, 14 years of age and living on the 1500 block of Hudson, was cited for the same charges (050 451 055).

Robbery, 3rd and Yosemite, April 23, 7:25 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Correa and Hastings responded on the call of a robbery and spoke with the caller who stated that two men had just thrown him to the ground and robbed him. Suspect one is a Samoan male, 16-17, 5'10", 150, clean shaven, wearing a white shirt and blue jean pants. Suspect two is a black male, 16-17, 5'10", 150, unknown clothing (050 451 839).

Warrant Arrest, 5300 Third Street, April 23, 7:44 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Reyes and Haynes responded on the report of a man resisting arrest and spoke with security personnel at Walgreen's who stated that they had taken a man into custody for petty theft. The man, living on the 1200 block of Ingalls, was found to have an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with attempted robbery (050 451 895).

Possession Cocaine, Newhall and LaSalle, April 23, 8:25 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer engaged in what appeared to be a drug deal. The officers approached the suspect and found him to be in possession of crack cocaine. The suspect, living on Bertha Lane, was booked for possession of cocaine and violation of parole (050 452 081).

Possession Firearm, Bayshore and Silver, April 23, 11:28 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and determined that the driver had a suspended license and was on probation from San Mateo County. The officers searched the vehicle and located a stash of marijuana. The passengers were removed from the vehicle and a rear passenger was found to possess both a loaded handgun and a quantity of crack cocaine. The passenger, living on San Bruno Avenue, was booked for weapons and drug charges (050 452 558).

Robbery, 330 Alemany, April 24, 12:15 a.m.  
Bayview Officers Gallo and Singh responded to 975 Bayshore Blvd. on the call of a strongarm robbery and spoke with the victim who told them that he had exited Hwy 280 at Alemany and was speaking on his cell phone when a man walked up to him and robbed him. The officers accompanied the victim back to the 300 block of Alemany and the victim spotted the suspect, who was still standing in the area. The officers arrested the suspect and found him to be in possession of the victim's property. The suspect, living in American Canyon, was booked for robbery (050 452 683).

Cocaine Sales, 2 Nichols, April 24, 12:16 a.m.  
Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer engage in two hand to hand drug deals with two locals. The officers began to approach the dealer and he took off running. The officers chased the dealer and caught up to him, placing him under arrest. The suspect, living on Nichols Way, was booked for drug charges and delaying arrest (050 452 718).

Bayview Officers Ernst and Garate responded on the report of a prowler and spoke with the male caller who had detained a female burglar. Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a known drug dealer handing something to a known drug user. The two parted and the officers approached and detained them both. The buyer, a woman living on the 1400 block of Newcomb, was booked for possession of crack cocaine. The seller, a man living in Daly city, was booked for sales of cocaine and possession for sale of cocaine (050 454 651).

Bayview's plainclothes team received information that a man wanted for a domestic violence case was possibly hiding out in a home in the Bayview. The officers went to the home on Albatross Court and found the man hiding next to a closet in the children's bedroom. The man, living on the 1100 block of Gilman, was booked for domestic violence, violation of a court order, violation of probation, resisting arrest, and a warrant (from a prior case) charging him with domestic violence (050 454 140).

Bayview's plainclothes team was on surveillance when they saw a man engage in what appeared to be numerous narcotics transactions. The man was detained and found to have an outstanding drug arrest warrant. The man,

living on Dedman court, was booked for the warrant and for new drug charges as well (050 244 383).

Heroin Arrest, 3rd and LaSalle, April 25, 12:02 a.m.  
Bayview Officers Singh and Wong were on patrol when they saw a group of people walking and noticed that a man in the group was drinking an alcoholic beverage. As the officers approached the man to issue a citation they saw him drop a plastic bottle to the ground. The officers recovered the bottle and found it to contain both black tar heroin and crack cocaine. The man then accused the officers of dropping the drugs in order to frame him, but he was arrested nonetheless. The man, living on the 1500 block of Oakdale, was booked for possession of both heroin and cocaine (050 455 900).
