Tsunami Water Polo

Crime and Enforcement Update

Pursesnatch, Bacon and Burrows, April 17, 7:30 a.m.

Bayview Officers Mostasisa, Barron and Remedios responded on the report of a pursesnatch and spoke with the elderly Asian female caller who stated, through an interpreter, that she had been walking down the street when a suspect approached her from behind and struck her in the back of her neck, knocking her to the ground. The suspect then took the victim's purse and ran to a waiting blue vehicle, driven by a second suspect. Suspect one is a black male, 16-18, wearing a black jacket and black baseball cap. Suspect two is a black male, no further (050 424 585).

Shots Fired, 26 Ardath, April 17, 10:47 a.m.

Bayview Officers Barron and Mostasisa took a report from a woman who told them that she returned home to find that a bullet had been shot through her window. No suspects were seen (050 425 135).

Warrant Arrest, 2700 Jennings, April 17, 6:34 p.m.

Bayview Officers Fowler and Hastings were on patrol when they stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and determined that the driver was driving with a suspended license, and also that he was wanted for an outstanding arrest warrant. The driver, living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, was booked for the warrant and the traffic violations (050 426 315).

Attempted Homicide, 1600 LaSalle, April 18, 2:00 a.m.

Bayview Officers Lane and Winesberry responded on the call of a woman screaming for help and found a woman lying on the sidewalk. The woman was holding her abdomen and told the officers she was four months pregnant and her boyfriend had just punched her in the head and kicked her in the stomach several times. The victim described her boyfriend and the vehicle he was driving to officers, and a second team of officers located both at Jerrold and Newhall. The victim told officers that she and the suspect had argued about his desire to see another woman, and the suspect then beat and kicked the victim severely and slammed her against a building. The suspect also stole all of the victim's money after throwing her to the ground. The victim stated that the suspect beat her severely late last year, when she was also pregnant, and it resulted in a miscarriage. The suspect, 21 years of age, was booked for attempted murder and numerous other assault charges (050 427 181).

Hot Prowl Burglary, 28 Carr, April 18, 12:26 p.m.

Bayview Officers Lew and Alcaraz responded on the report of a hot prowling burglary and met with the caller who stated that she heard her doorbell

being rung numerous times and ignored it. Minutes later, the caller saw three men walking into her home, one carrying a crow bar. The men fled upon seeing the victim. Suspect one is a black male, 20-24, 5'9", 150, wearing a dark do-rag and a black jersey with white lettering. Suspects two and three are described only as black males (050 429 494).

Shots Fired, 1350 Evans, April 18, 2:33 p.m.

Bayview Sergeant Moran responded on a call of shots being fired and found numerous spent shell casings but no victims or suspects. Additional Bayview officers stopped a man walking away from the area and found that he was wearing a bullet proof vest. No victims or witnesses ever came forward (050 430 093).

Burglary Warehouse, 2088 Jerrold, April 18, 3:40 a.m.

Bayview Officers Birco and Singh responded on the report of a burglary and spoke with a produce employee who told them that he saw two men stealing boxes of produce and then running to a vehicle. Suspect one is a black male, 40-43, 5'10", 180, wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans. Suspect two is a Hispanic male, 5'6", 180, wearing a black 49er jacket and blue jeans. The vehicle is described as a blue 4 door sedan with a possible plate of 5SKX920. Note that this plate is similar to one described in yesterday's e-mail for a similar theft from the produce market (050 427 066).

Warrant Arrest, 159 Amherst, April 18, 4:30 p.m.

Bayview Officers Coleman and Cruz responded to a home in the district in order to serve an arrest warrant. They located the wanted man and arrested him for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (050 272 271).

Robbery, 223 Missouri, April 18, 6:00 p.m.

Bayview Officers Reyes and Haynes responded on a call of a robbery and met with the female caller who stated that she had just parked her car when a female suspect approached her and grabbed her purse. The suspect ran to a waiting vehicle and fled from the area. The suspect is a black female, 35, 5'7", 135, waist length hair pulled back, dark skinned, wearing a white T-shirt, blue jean pants and a blue hooded sweatshirt. The vehicle is described only as a black van (050 431 013).

Robbery, San Bruno and Bacon, April 18, 8:00 p.m.

A woman walked into Bayview Station with her daughter and stated that her daughter had been robbed. The victim, a 16 year old girl, said that as she walked down San Bruno Avenue she was approached from behind by three suspects who knocked her to the ground and stole her property. The suspects are described only as black males (050 431 433).
