

BAYVIEW COMMUNITY UPDATE April 18, 2005

Operation IMPACT

The California Highway Patrol spent Friday evening patrolling the streets of the Bayview and enforcing traffic laws. During the period of time the CHP was here (from about 7:30 p.m. until 3:00 a.m.), they issued 46 moving violations, gave 29 verbal admonishments, towed 13 vehicles, made 6 misdemeanor arrests, arrested 4 drunk drivers, conducted two parolee searches, made one felony arrest and one narcotics arrest.

Summer Fishing

The San Francisco Police Youth Fishing program is beginning its 37th year of service to San Francisco youth, and this summer, trips will be conducted from June 20th to August 19th. Charter salmon fishing trips will depart every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from Fisherman's Wharf at 5:30 a.m. The participants must be from 12-17 years of age. Crime and Enforcement Update

Gun Cases

Possession Firearm by a Felon, 18 Cameron, April 15, 10:09 a.m.  
Bayview Officers Damonte and Alcaraz responded on a call of a fight and met with the female complainant who told them that her ex-boyfriend had just threatened her with a gun, and had also threatened to kill her new boyfriend if he ever found him with her. The suspect had fled in a vehicle and a description was broadcast. Moments later, additional Bayview officers located the described vehicle and detained the driver (who was the named ex-boyfriend). The driver, who is on parole, was searched and a fully loaded semi-auto handgun was located. The driver, living on the 1300 block of Shafter, was booked for felony threats, possession of a loaded and concealed handgun, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, possession of stolen property (the gun was stolen), violation of parole, and an outstanding arrest warrant (050 417 411).

Possession Firearm, 1100 Bayshore, April 16, 1:35 p.m.  
Bayview Officer Coleman was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and upon approaching the driver smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The driver and passenger were removed from the car and the passenger was found to be carrying a fully loaded revolver in his jacket pocket. No drugs were found and the driver was cited for traffic violations. The passenger, living on the 200 block of Topeka, was booked for possession of a loaded and concealed handgun (050 422 379).

Possession Assault Weapon by a Felon, Oakdale and Keith, April 16, 10:53 p.m.  
Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell were on patrol when they attempted to stop a Jeep Cherokee for traffic violations, but it took off at a high rate

of speed, running a red light on 3rd Street and almost striking a passing Muni bus. The officers lost sight of the vehicle but found it moments later at Oakdale and Keith, where it had collided with a light pole. The officers saw the driver bolt from the vehicle and could see what appeared to be a gun handle protruding from his rear waistband area. The officers pursued the suspect on foot and then saw him remove the gun from his waistband and throw it into onto the roof of a nearby school. The suspect was taken into custody and the Fire Department was phoned for a ladder. The officers climbed onto the roof of the school and retrieved an Uzi assault rifle. The suspect was booked for possession of an assault weapon, possession of a loaded and concealed firearm, possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, and traffic offenses (050 423 935).

Possession Air Gun, 3rd and Shafter, April 17, 3:20 a.m.

Bayview Officer Singh was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle for traffic violations and determined that the driver's license had been suspended. The driver, living on Cashmere, was arrested, and the officer then saw the butt of a silver handgun sticking out from under the car's front seat. The handgun was seized and was found to be an air gun (which is illegal to possess in San Francisco.) The driver was cited for traffic violations and possession of an air gun (050 424 347).

#### Shooting Cases

Aggravated Assault, 700 Kirkwood, April 15, 8:46 a.m.

Bayview Officer Rockwell took a report from a 13 year old juvenile who told him that he was waiting for the bus when a van drove by and someone in the van shot him in the leg with a b.b. gun. The van is described as a white van with bronze stripes and large shiny rims. The suspect is described as a black male, 18-25 (050 417 029).

Shots Fired, 1470 Thomas, April 15, 11:17 a.m.

Bayview Officers Hurley and Dicroce responded on a shots being fired call and found approximately twenty people loitering in the area, none of whom would provide any useful information other than to verify that shots had been fired. An anonymous caller provided Dispatch with a vehicle description and partial license plate, and responding back-up officers located a vehicle on Thomas which matched the description given and had five occupants aboard. The vehicle's occupants were detained, but no guns were found. Numerous spent shell casings were located on the street near 1470 Thomas (050 417 972).

Shooting, Kiska and Reardon, April 15, 5:46 p.m.

Bayview Officer Rockwell was on patrol when he heard several gunshots and then found three victims who had been shot on Kiska Road. Witnesses at the scene stated that two black males in a white full-size American van had been responsible for the shooting. An anonymous witness provided the officers at the scene with the street names of the shooters, and they are well known to Bayview officers. All three victims were treated at SFGH for their injuries (050 419 633).

#### Robberies

Gun Robbery, 1203 Revere, April 15, 9:44 p.m.

Bayview Officers Foss and Gallo responded on an armed robbery call and spoke with the victim who stated (through a police interpreter) that he had been standing in front of his home when a man armed with a revolver approached and robbed him. The suspect is a black male, 23-25, 5'9", 195, wearing a white T-shirt and driving a white four door vehicle with a silver door. Additional Bayview officers later located a vehicle at 3rd and Palou matching the description given, but the victim couldn't identify the driver as the robbery suspect (050 420 389).

Gun Robbery, Kiska and Reardon, April 16, 12:25 a.m.

Bayview Officers Anderson and Farrell took a report from a cab driver who stated that he had been robbed at gunpoint by a man he had picked up at 2828 San Bruno Avenue and driven to Kiska and Reardon Roads. The suspect is described as a Pacific Islander male, 20-25, small moustache, wearing a camouflage baseball cap and camouflage jacket. The suspect had a black semi-auto handgun and threatened to kill the cabbie if he didn't hand over all of his money. The cabbie told the officers that the suspect had told him that he was from "Fuji," although I believe the cabbie meant to say "Fiji." (Fuji was the name of a character from McHale's Navy.) 050 420 759.

Pursesnatch, Barneveld and Hale, April 17, 7:30 a.m.

Bayview Officers Ernst and Garate responded on a report of a pursesnatch and spoke with the female caller who told them that a man had approached her and punched her in the face, prior to taking her purse and fleeing to a waiting vehicle. The suspect is a black male, 20s, wearing a black knit beanie cap. The driver of the vehicle was a black male, no further. The suspect vehicle is a silver or light blue vehicle similar in size to a Toyota Camry (050 424 604).

#### Drug Cases

Possession Cocaine, 1631 Newcomb, April 15, 4:49 p.m.

Bayview Officers Dalton and McPherson were on patrol on 3rd Street when they saw a man displaying crack in his palm to another man. The officers arrested the man, a transient, and booked him for possession of crack cocaine and possession of narcotics paraphernalia (050 419 382).

Possession Cocaine, 6600 3rd Street, April 16, 9:17 a.m.

Bayview Officer Singh responded to the Franciscan Hotel on the call of a suspicious person. The hotel manager directed the officer to a man standing nearby who was shouting obscenities at the manager. The officer found the man to be intoxicated and placed him under arrest, and while being booked, crack cocaine was found in the man's pocket. The man, living on the 1000 block of Key, was booked for public drunkenness and possession of crack cocaine (050 423 684).

Possession Methamphetamine, 3rd and Cargo, April 16, 11:03 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they attempted to stop a vehicle for reckless driving and the vehicle took off at a high rate of speed. The two occupants of the vehicle then fled from the vehicle and the passenger was caught and detained (the driver got away). A quantity of methamphetamine was found in the vehicle and the passenger, living on the 100 block of Middlepoint, was booked for possession of meth and resisting

arrest (050 420 646).
