#### Operation IMPACT Returns to the Bayview

The California Highway Patrol will be returning to both the Bayview and Mission Districts on Friday, April 15. The CHP officers will focus on traffic enforcement and DUI cases and will be working from approximately 7:00 p.m. until 3:00 a.m. In past operations, the CHP officers have made numerous arrests for a variety of offenses and have towed numerous vehicles being operated by persons with suspended licenses.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Knife Attack, 300 Bayshore, April 12, 2:27 p.m.

A 13 year old girl came to Bayview Station with her mother and reported that she was riding on the Muni 9L line when a group of five girls approached her and referred to her as "Kiana." The girls began shouting at the victim, and the Muni driver then told all of the girls and the victim they had to exit the bus. The suspects then jumped on the victim and punched and kicked her. One of the girls then pulled a knife and told the victim, "You have to fight or die." The victim refused to fight and the suspects walked away. The suspects are described as black females. The suspect with the knife was 14-17, heavy set, "French" braided hair, armed with a knife (050 410 750).

Dog Attack, 180 Westpoint, April 12, 6:40 p.m.

Bayview Officers Kenney and Olson responded to Oakdale on the report of a dog attack and spoke with the 9 year old victim who had been playing near 180 Westpoint when a pit bull dog ran from a unit and attacked him. The boy's mother was present and refused to provide any additional information regarding the attack, other than to identify the dog's owner as a woman named "Nickie." The victim was treated at the hospital and released (050 410 368).

Domestic Violence, 700 block of Missouri, April 13, 4:00 a.m.

Bayview Officers Brown and Bradford responded on a domestic violence call and spoke with the female caller who told them that she and her husband began arguing after he kicked her out of bed. The caller told officers that her husband then pushed her to the floor and jumped on her, holding her down with his knee to her back. The 19 year old husband was booked for domestic violence (050 407 387).

Possession Marijuana for Sale, 1001 Fitzgerald, April 13, 1:19 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a group of men in a vehicle smoking marijuana and stopped the men. The first man, living on Nichols and holding marijuana in his hand, was cited for possession of marijuana. The officers then saw additional marijuana on the car set between the two other men and the driver of the vehicle produced a "Medical Marijuana" card. The officers then found a shoe box filled with marijuana and arrested both men. The man with the medical marijuana card was also found to possess a digital scale (used for weighing drugs) and a ski mask. This man, living on Turk Street, was booked for possession of marijuana for sale. The last man, living on the 1200 block of Palou, was also booked for possession of marijuana for sale (050 409 802).

Warrant Arrest, 1001 Fitzgerald, April 13, 1:23 p.m.

Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they came across a man

wanted for an outstanding warrant from Bartow County, Georgia. The man, living in Richmond, was booked for the warrant which charged him with forgery (050 409 173).

Possession Prohibited Weapon, Napoleon and Evans, April 13, 1:30 p.m. Officer Remedios responded on the report of a man pushing a shopping cart and waving a knife. The officers found a man, armed with a large knife, and determined that he was wanted for an outstanding warrant. The man, a transient, was booked for the warrant and the knife (050 409 151).

Warrant Arrest, Newcomb and Newhall, April 13, 4:34 p.m. Bayview's plainclothes team was on patrol when they saw a man they knew to be wanted and placed him under arrest. The man, living on the 5500 block of 3rd Street, was booked for the warrant which charged him with violation of parole (050 410 051).

Possession Cocaine for Sale, Fitzgerald and Griffith, April 13, 7:23 p.m. Bayview's plainclothes team was on foot patrol in the Alice Griffith Development when they heard numerous people yelling out "Police," in an effort to alert the local criminals to the presence of police officers. The officers then saw two locals seated together and saw one of them throw two rocks of crack cocaine to the ground. The man, living on Exeter, was arrested and charged with possession of crack cocaine for sale and possession of marijuana for sale. The second man, living on the 1100 block of Oakdale, was arrested for trespassing on public housing property, and was also charged with possession of marijuana. The first man asked the sergeant at the scene if he had ever been shot. Note that there have been several recent incidents of men from the Alice Griffith Development threatening the lives of Bayview officers (050 410 829).

Attempted Robbery, Lane and Palou, April 13, 7:50 p.m. Bayview's plainclothes team responded on the report of a man armed with a gun and contacted a woman who spoke only Spanish. A Bayview Spanish-speaking officer was called to the scene and the victim told him that she was walking home when she was approached by three men and one of them displayed a semi-auto handgun to her which was stuck into his waistband. The victim started screaming and ran into the street and the suspects fled. Suspect one is a black male, 17-20, wearing a black suit jacket, white T-shirt, and blue jean pants. Suspects two and three are black males in dark clothing (050 410 891).

Knife Assault, 374 Hale, April 13, 11:00 p.m. Bayview Officer Borgen and numerous back-up officers responded on an assault call and spoke with the 15 year old female caller who stated that her father had just "socked" her on her head. The officers then interviewed the caller's mother (she spoke only Cantonese, and a Cantonese speaking officer interpreted), and the mother stated that she and the daughter had argued regarding the purchase of a jacket from an internet site. The daughter was angered that the mother refused to purchase the jacket, and the daughter threatened to kill the mother with a meat cleaver. The step-father intervened and pushed the daughter away. The daughter was booked at YGC for felony threats and felony assault charges (050 411 582).

Stay Away Order Violation, 1827 25th Street, April 14, 12:23 a.m. Bayview Officers Wong and Birco responded on the report of a restraining order violation and spoke with the female caller who told them that her husband had just come to her home and attempted to gain entry in violation

of an Emergency Protective Order. The husband was located nearby and was booked for violation of a court order (050 411 695).
