Captain's Community Meeting

My next meeting will be, Tuesday, April 4, 2006 at 7:00 PM at Bayview Station, 201 Williams Street. The meeting will be held in the Community Room and access can be gained by entering through the Newhall Street door.

In the last several weeks the members of Bayview Station have made several arrests throughout the district. An auto burglar was arrested on Potrero Hill while he was burglarizing a car, the arresting officers had spotted him driving around casing the area and they established a surveillance of him. When he was taken into custody, the follow-up investigation revealed that he was using a stolen to traverse around the area.

In addition to that arrest, a suspect was taken into custody after he tried to sell a pair of snow ski's. We are still trying to locate the owner of the property so the suspect can be properly charged. At this point, it is unknown whether the property was taken from a vehicle or from a residence in the area.

There were three arrests of burglary suspects in the district. The most notable arrest was a burglar who had committed at least two burglaries in the Portola area. The suspect was taken into custody after an extensive search of the area and the investigating officers located evidence linking him to a second burglary in the area. The suspect was on parole at the time he committed the burglaries, his parole was revoked and he was delivered to county jail.

The problem of robberies has continued across the district, fortunately we have made arrests in eight separate incidents. In most cases, the suspect(s) appear to be opportunists who look for a vulnerable person to rob. Please be alert to your surroundings and avoid being distracted by talking on cellular telephones, etc.

Bayview Officers Lane and Hunt responded to a restaurant supply business on Evans St. and met with the manager who had just been robbed. The woman reported that three suspects approached her as she was opening the store. One suspect pointed a handgun at her and the suspects forced her inside the business. After the suspects demanded that the manager disarm the alarm system, they brought her to the safe. In fear for her life she opened the safe and the suspects emptied it of its contents, about \$5,000. The suspects fled without harming the woman.

The Officers began to search the facility and soon found a suspect who blurted out, "I'm just trying to find something to sell!". The Officers searched the man and discovered a dental pick, a screwdriver and several credit card statements in his pockets. The man was transported to Bayview Station. Next the Officers drove to the address listed on the credit card statements. The met with the woman who owned the account. She had no idea how the suspect got her credit card statements. The man, a resident of the Mission District, was booked on numerous felony charges.

Wednesday, March 22, 2006. 10:43 PM. Stolen Vehicle, Unlicensed Driver, Marijuana Possession, Narcotics Paraphernalia. Bayshore Blvd. at Silver Ave. Case #: 060243121.

A maroon Subaru caught the attention of Bayview Officers Radford and Brown. The vehicle's license plate was listed as "stolen" on the Officer's "Hotsheet". With the assistance of numerous other units, the Officers stopped the Subaru and detained the occupants. Both occupants were unlicensed 15-year-old juveniles. One stated that he bought the car from an unknown individual for \$20.00. Officers also found marijuana and narcotics paraphernalia in the car. Both suspects were cited and released to their respective guardians.

Wednesday, March 22, 2006. 10:59 PM. Warrant Arrest, Narcotics Arrest. Ingalls St. at LaSalle St. Case #: 060312817.

Bayview Officers Lam and Olson noticed a Honda driving with a faulty right brake light. Officer Lam stopped the Honda and contacted the driver who admitted that he knew his driver's license was suspended. Not only was the man correct about his license status, he had an active arrest warrant for driving with a suspended license. The Officers detained the man and found ziplock baggies of marijuana and methamphetamine in his pockets. This Bayview resident was booked for the warrant and the narcotics offenses.

Bayview Homeless Coordinating Officer Lavin received a complaint from the Port Authority that a contractor had been illegally dumping trash at a dead end on 23rd St. Officer Lavin sifted through the debris pile and noticed some paperwork referring to an address on Monterrey Blvd. Officer Lavin contacted the owner/contractor of the address. The man admitted that the trash was from his house. However, he claimed that he had paid two men to dump the trash and had no idea that they did so illegally. Thursday, March 23, 2006. Fraudulent Game. Gould St. Case #: 060314283.

A fraud victim walked into Bayview Station and explained his problem to Officer Whitney. The 20-year-old man explained that he had received a letter in the mail claiming that he had just won \$75,000. The letter required that the man cash a \$2850 check sent with the letter and send the cash to the sender. The man cashed the check but never sent the money to the sender. The check bounced shortly thereafter and now the victim owes the check cashing facility \$2850. Beware of this scam. In this case the original letter was from "Ontario Lottery and Gaming Payment and Processing Verification".

Thursday, March 23, 2006, 1:55 PM, Cocaine for Sales Arrest from Jaywalking (Case Number 060315156):

Plain clothes officers were walking in the area of Oakdale and Mendell. As they approached the area, several people quickly started walking away from them. Officer Benzinger, who was driving in the area, noticed the movement and saw one person so eager to get away, that he ran across Palou Ave against the red light in violation of 21453(d) CVC. Officer Benzinger saw the violation and stopped the man just south of Palou. Officer Benzinger asked the man for his identification to cite him, but the man said that he did not have any identification. Because the man did not have proof of his identity, the vehicle code requires that he be placed under arrest until he can appear before a magistrate. Officer Benzinger searched the man pursuant to arrest and found 9 rocks of crack cocaine. The suspect was booked at Bayview Station for Cocaine sales and walking against the red light.

Thursday, March 23, 2006, 5:00 PM, 3rd and Kirkwood Ave, Robbery (Case Number 060316320):

The victim was walking down 3rd Street when she was surrounded by 4 African American males. One of the suspects asked to use the victim's cell phone. The victim told them that she did not have a cell phone. The suspects then closed in on the victim. Feeling threatened and fearing for her safety, the victim fell to the ground to try to protect herself. The suspects then went through her pockets, rolling her on the ground in the process. The suspects took her money and fled east bound on Kirkwood.

Friday, March 24, 2006, 10:45 PM, 3rd and Palou Ave, Robbery (Case Number 060320779):

The victim was leaving the liquor store at 3rd and Palou when 2 African American males approached him. They first asked the victim for money, then

punched him in the face when he didn't comply. The suspects then went through the victim's pockets and took his wallet and cell phone. Unfortunately because it happened so fast, the victim was unable to provide any further information about the suspects.

Friday, March 24, 2006, 10:00 PM, Phelps St and Oakdale Ave, Evading Police (Case Number 060297598):

While on patrol, Officers Ferrell and Anderson noticed that a car coming towards them was playing music so loud that they could hear it from a block away in violation of 27007 CVC. The officers turned to follow the car, but when they saw the license plate, they realized that it was the same car which they had attempted to stop 5 days before, but had failed to stop when they had activated their lights and siren. The officers were able to stop the car at Phelps and Oakdale. The driver told the officers that he was not driving the car 5 days ago. The driver was cited and released, but ended up walking home. The car was towed due to the previous incident.

Friday, March 24, 2006, 11:40 PM, 18th and Rhode Island, Purse Snatch (Case Number 060320945):

The victim was unloading groceries from her car when the suspect ran by her car, reached in through the open door and grabbed her purse which was sitting on the front seat. The suspect then ran north on Rhode Island and jumped into a waiting vehicle. The suspect is described as an African American male, early 20's, thin build, wearing a light grey, hooded sweatshirt and dark pants. The car is described as a dark colored sports car.

Saturday, March 25, 2006, 08:23 AM, 1500 Block of Innes Ave, Warrant Arrest from Blocked Driveway Complaint (Case Number 060321545):

Officer Pascua was on patrol when he was hailed by a citizen on the 1500 block of Inness. The citizen told Officer Pascua that his driveway was blocked by a blue Mustang and that the driver was sleeping inside the car, but that he was afraid to contact the driver and have him move the car.

Officer Pascua checked the car and found that it was a Hertz rental car. He then woke the driver and asked him for his identification. The driver told him that he did not have any identification. The driver verbally told Officer Pascua his name. A warrant check revealed that the driver had two outstanding domestic violence warrants for his arrest. Officer Pascua confirmed the driver's identity from a SF mug shot from a previous arrest. The driver was booked at Bayview Station on the warrants and the car was towed clearing the driveway.

The victim was walking on the sidewalk, talking on a cell phone, about to board a bus when the suspect came behind her and pushed her head. The suspect then grabbed the cell phone and ran east on Silver. The suspect is described as African American Juvenile, 15-16 years old, 5'8", 150 pounds, wearing a black pea coat and blue jeans.

Remember, when you are using your cell phone in public, be discrete and be aware of your surroundings. Cell phones are as much a target of theft as wallets and purses.

Monday, March 28, 2006, 8:30 AM, Thomas and Keith, Narcotics for Sale Arrest (Case Number 060328660):

Officer Altofer and Maguire were on patrol when they saw a well known drug dealer, who is on probation for selling drugs, walking on Thomas. Because he is on probation, he agrees to be searched without cause at any time. The officers stopped the man and told him that they were going to conduct a probation search. During the search, the officers found bags of Marijuana and crack cocaine in the man's pockets. The suspect was placed under arrest and booked at Bayview Station for Narcotics and Probation Violation.
