Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Monday June 12, 2006 through Tuesday, June 13, 2006 - Armed Robbery Spree, Evading the Police, Burglary, Discharging a firearm - Area of Fitzgerald and Hawes - A seventeen year old male was responsible for a series of armed robberies, a home invasion burglary, and a police chase that began on Monday, June 12th. The incident began when a young woman struck the male's car on Fitzgerald Street. The woman also happened to know the male by his first name. The male fled the scene in his car. The woman stayed at the scene, as one is required to do after she is involved in an accident.

As the woman was waiting she received a phone call from a neighbor who told her that there are people inside her house tearing it up. The woman went to her house and inside was the male who car she struck and another suspect. When she approached her house she said that one of the suspects fired a gun at her. She fled the scene and went to Bayview Station.

Officers at the station heard the description of the suspect and immediately knew who the suspect was. A team of officers responded to the area. The suspect had already left the woman's house. Entry was made to the house and the victim saw that her house was ransacked and items were missing. Later, a spent shell casing was found.

A short time later, plainclothes officers saw the suspect driving in the area. As soon as the suspect saw the police he sped off. The plainclothes

officers gave chase but lost the vehicle. But alas, a new day is to dawn....

The next day, at 7:45 AM a young woman was walking down the 1100 block of Fitzgerald Avenue. She was approached by the suspect who took a fancy to her. The suspect asked the woman if he could get her phone number. The woman ignored the suspect but he persisted. The suspect growing frustrated withdrew a gun and pointed it at the victim, swore at her and demanded her money. The victim gave the suspect her wallet.

After robbing this woman, the suspect persisted and continued to ask the woman for her phone number. The suspect stopped his pursuit of romantic involvement with this woman because he saw his next victim.

The suspect saw a male that happened to be down the street unloading his vehicle. Also in the vehicle was the man's eight-year-old daughter. The suspect approached and asked the victim for the time. The victim said that he did not have the time so the suspect swore at him and demanded his money. The suspect then held the gun to the victim's neck; all the while the victim's daughter was watching.

A neighbor saw this and yelled out the window. The suspect scared ran off.

The suspect took a break for a few hours...at 10:50 AM he saw a person on the street that he had a long stemming issue with. An altercation between the two started. The suspect pushed over the victim's motorbike damaging it. The victim went to his house and the suspect followed.

The suspect stood outside the victim's house and yelled for the victim to come outside and fight. 911 was called and the police arrived and detained the suspect. But it was not exactly known about the suspect was tied in to everything.

But the suspect's mother arrived on scene and her statements helped set the story straight. She asked if her son was being detained because of the 'hit and run' accident that occurred the night before with 'the girl'. Officers became reasonably suspicious that this was the suspect that was wanted in connection with the accident/burglary/shooting the night prior.

The suspect was transported back to Bayview Station. Alert Officers saw the suspect in the station and thought he might be a suspect in their robbery cases that were mentioned in this vignette. The victims of the cases were contacted. They came to the station and positively identified the suspect as the one who robbed them.

The suspect was booked for many, many, charges with more pending.

Wednesday, June 14, 2006, 00:01 AM, 3rd and Revere, Broken tail light leads to narcotics and probation violation arrest (case # 060628658): Officers Farrell and Wise spotted a car driving with a broken tail light. The stopped the car and approached the car. As the officers approached the car, they shined their flashlight in the back seat of the car where two of the passengers were naked from the waist down. The officers told them to get their clothes on and waited until they were decent. The officers then contacted the driver who told the officers that he was on probation. A DMV check revealed that the driver also did not have a driver's license. The officers placed the driver under arrest and performed a search of his person and vehicle. They found suspected cocaine and methamphetamine as well checks belonging to someone else. The suspect was booked at Bayview Station on narcotics, probation violation, driving without a license and broken tail light charges.

Wednesday, June 14, 2006, 9:11 AM, 1700 block of Cesar Chavez, Assault on a teacher by student (case # 060629740): Officers responded to Kaiser hospital where they met with the victim, a teacher at a local school. The teacher had been stabbed with a pen, hit several times and then bitten by a student.

Wednesday, June 14, 2006, 4:35 PM, 1600 block of Shafter, Assault with caustic chemical arrest and lice infestation (case # 060631645): Officers Dockery and Martin were on bike patrol when they saw a man running after a female. The man was holding a can and rubbing his face; the woman was yelling obscenities back at the man and running in and out of traffic. Officer Martin was able to stop the man, but Officer Dockery had to chase the woman on his bicycle to stop her.

The man told Officer Martin that he was coming out of church when he saw the woman spraying the sidewalk in front of the church with the spray can. The can was 3-in-1 penetrating spray. When he told her to stop spraying the sidewalk, she got up and sprayed him in the face. He managed to get the can away from her right before Officer Martin and Dockery arrived on scene. The man signed a citizen's arrest on the woman for the assault.

In the mean time Officer Dockery was able to stop the white female on the 5100 block of 3rd. When Officer Martin joined them on 3rd Street, the female started making disparaging remarks about Officer Dockery's and Officer Martin's race. Because the woman was unwilling to tell the officers her name, she was transported in a squad car to Bayview Station where despite their best efforts the officers were unable to identify her. She was then transported in another squad car to County Jail where it was revealed to Officers Martin and Dockery that she had an extensive lice infestation. Any person who had contact with her and any vehicle that had been used to transport her was probably contaminated by lice. The two cars

spent the next two days being deloused.

Wednesday, June 14, 2006, 10:00 PM, 1500 block of Keith, Auto recovery and warrant arrest (case # 060609153): Officers Singleton and Johnson were transporting a suspect for another unit when they were flagged down by a citizen. The citizen told them that his stolen car was on the 1500 block of Keith. The officers responded, with the custody still in the back, to the 1500 block of Keith where the citizen pointed out his stolen vehicle. There were two people in the car. While Officer Johnson watched the custody in the back of their car, Officer Singleton approached the stolen car and took the two occupants into custody. Other units arrived to transport the new suspects back to Bayview Station. At the station, the suspect that was sitting in the driver's seat and had control of the car was found to be a parolee at large wanted on a parole violation warrant. He was booked at Bayview Station for the warrant and for possession of a stolen car.

Thursday, June 15, 2006, 3:15 PM, Caltrans tracks by 17th and Pennsylvania, Possible suicide by train (case # 060635619): Officers responded to the Caltrans track on a report of a man hit by a train. Officers found the deceased man near the tunnel that goes under Potrero Hill. It is believed that the man committed suicide.

Thursday, June 15, 2006, 7:00 PM, San Bruno and Silver, Marijuana arrest (case # 060636617): San Bruno beat Officer Gasanyan was riding down San Bruno Avenue at Silver when he saw a man sitting in a car holding up a bag that contained a green leafy substance. He rode up to the car from the back and saw the man taking some of the leafy substance out of the bag and placing it in the cut wrapping of a cigar. Officer Gasanyan then knocked on the window of the car which startled the man who turned out to be a juvenile. The juvenile was cited for possession of Marijuana and released to his parents at Bayview Station.

Thursday, June 15, 2006, 10:15 PM, 3rd and Newcomb, Narcotics/warrant arrest (case # 060637154): Plain clothes officers spotted a man driving on Newcomb Avenue, that they knew was wanted on a felony warrant. Before they could stop the man, he stopped and ran from his car, leaving the car door open and the engine running. The officers called after him, but he did not stop. The officers chased him on foot to a local store where he tried to hide. Before he ran in the store, officers saw him drop a package that turned out to be heroin. The suspect was booked on the warrant and narcotics charges at Bayview Station.

Friday, June 16, 2006, 3:30 PM, 900 block of Connecticut, Assault with glass (case # 060643349): The victim was home when she heard a knock at the door. When she opened the door, she was confronted by 5 African American females ... all with purple hair. One of the suspects then tried to hit the

victim with a paper bag, but missed. The bag hit the wall behind the victim, breaking the glass object that was inside the bag and spewing glass on the floor. The victim and the glass thrower then ended up wrestling on the floor while the other women with purple hair cheered them on. The victim ended up cutting her arm on the glass.

Again, the suspects are five African American females with purple hair. This should be a unique group.

Friday, June 16, 2006, 11:30 PM, 22nd and 3rd St, Traffic stop on Bicyclist leads to narcotics warrant arrest (case # 060641252): Officers Singh and Farrell were on patrol when they saw a bicyclist riding his bicycle on the sidewalk. They stopped the bicyclist and found that he had an outstanding felony warrant for his arrest. The Bicyclist was booked at Bayview Station for a No Bail narcotic warrant and riding his bicycle on the sidewalk.

Saturday, June 17, 2006, 12:10 AM, 200 block of Goettingen, Purse Snatch (case # 060641365): The victim was walking on the 200 block of Goettingen by herself at midnight when a white SUV with three African American males drove up to her. One of the occupants demanded her purse, but she continued to walk. Then one of the suspects jumped out of the car and grabbed her purse off her shoulder. He then got back into the SUV and it drove off. The purse was recovered minus cash and credit cards nearby.

Saturday, June 17, 2006, 6:10 AM, Gilman and Hawes, Robbery with firearm (Case # 060642034): The victim said that she was stopped at Gilman and Hawes when she was approached by the suspect who asked her to light his cigarette. The victim complied, but then for some reason that the victim could not explain, the suspect smashed her rear passenger window and pointed a gun at the victim. The suspect then took some prescription medications and CD's from the victim. The victim then gave the suspect the car keys and he opened the trunk and took a camcorder. The suspect must have given the keys back to the victim since she then drove the car home and called the police.

The victim described the suspect as an African American male, 12 or 13 years old, 5'3" tall and wearing a denim jacket, black t-shirt and blue jeans.

Saturday, June 17, 2006, 5:11 PM, Newcomb and Mendell, Warrant arrest (case # 060643543): Dispatch had received a call that a suspect driving an older white Chevrolet Suburban with primer spots on it was carrying a gun. Officers Thompson and Festa, while on patrol spotted the Suburban at Mendell and Newcomb. Although no gun was found, the driver was found to have three outstanding warrants for his arrest totaling \$30,000. The driver was also found to have a suspended license. He was booked on the warrants at Bayview Station and his car was impounded until he gets his

Saturday, June 17, 2006, 10:00 PM, Silliman and Girard, Robbery with rifle (case # 060644488): The victim was leaving his garage when the suspect pointed a rifle in his face and demanded money. The victim handed the suspect his wallet and the suspect ran off. A similar robbery had taken place earlier in the same area.

The suspect is described as an African American male, 30-35 years old, 6' tall with a dark complexion and dark clothing.

Sunday, June 18, 2006, 5:00 AM, Stolen Vehicle (?), Jerrold and Bayshore: The victim said that she picked up the suspect, an African American male, that she didn't know, but has seen in the area, on the 700 - 900 block of Missouri in the Potrero Hill Housing Projects at approximately 5:00 PM on Saturday. She then said that she and the suspect, who she reiterated that she didn't know, drove around the Bayview / Hunters Point area for the next 12 hours, just seeing the area. At approximately 5 AM on Sunday morning, she stopped at the Chevron station at Jerrold and Bayshore, leaving her car keys with the suspect who she again reiterated that she didn't know. When she came out of the rest room, her car and the suspect were gone. The victim then walked home to get a motorcycle, then rode to a friend's house where she fell asleep until after 10 when she finally decided that she should report her car stolen, 5 hours after it was taken.
