SFPD Youth Fishing Program

The San Francisco Youth Fishing Program will begin its 38th year of taking local kids fishing. The program will run from June 20th through August 19th and fish for salmon. The program is open to established community groups that serve San Francisco Youth.

Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Tuesday, May 30, 2006 11:19AM - Homicide - Double Rock Housing Project - CS# 060 571 819 - A 31 year old man fell victim to gun violence in the Double Rock Housing Project. Further details are being withheld so the investigation is not compromised.

Tuesday, May 30, 2006, 08:39 PM - Attempted Homicide with a Knife, Arrest Made - 1488 Donner Street - CS #: 060 574 114 - A Novato man suffered severe injuries and San Francisco man was booked during a botched car burglary. The victim was working in a warehouse on Donner Street in the district when he saw two males rummaging inside his vehicle. There was a woman standing outside the car. The man yelled to the people to get out his car. The suspects began to run away. The victim kicked and pushed one of the suspects down. The other suspect then punched the victim. The victim now was engaged in a physical confrontation with two of the suspects. The suspects soon ran off. The victim later told police that he saw blood on his shirt and then realized he was stabbed.

A friend of the victim began to drive him to a hospital that he remembered was "nearby". The man became lost and found him and his friend, that now lost a considerable amount of blood, in a Daly City Gas Station. Daly City Police responded and were able to get the victim needed medical attention.

While this was occurring a witness was driving by the crime scene and phoned 911. The witness also picked up some of the victim's property that the suspects dropped and drove to Bayview Station.

The witness brought Bayview Officers back to the scene. While en route the witness saw one of the suspects. The suspect was brought into custody. He was booked on numerous charges including attempted homicide, and auto burglary.

The victim, who suffered stab wounds to his shoulder and lower back abdomen area, is recovering.

Wednesday, May 31, 2006, 1200 PM, Martin Luther King Middle School, Assault with a BB gun (case # 060576041): School resource officers Miller and

Valenzuela responded to MLK MS on a report of a shooting with a BB gun. The officers questioned the suspect who told them that he had purchased the gun on San Bruno Avenue and that he hadn't meant to shoot the victim who was shot in the forehead, just missing his eyes. The suspect was booked at YGC on felony charges of having a firearm at a school.

Wednesday, May 31, 2006, 5:00 PM, Thorton and Mercury, Attempted Robbery (case # 060577817): The victim was walking on Thorton near Mercury when she was approached by African American teenage males, all approximately 5'8", two with thin builds and a third with a stocky build. One of the suspects asked her the time, but then attempted to grab her purse. The victim struggled with the suspects, but managed to pull away and run to her house. The suspects ran away.

Wednesday, May 31, 2006, 5:15 PM, Felton and Brussels, Robbery with firearm (case # 060577447): The victim was walking home with her groceries when she was approached by the suspect who pointed a black hand gun at her. The suspect then grabbed the victim's purse causing the victim to fall to the ground. The victim saw the suspect getting into a black vehicle with the rear paper plate "SHIELD" on it. This brand of license plate frame is often used by criminals because the paper plate that comes with it resembles a California personalized plate.

Fortunately, the incident was caught on video tape by a neighbor in the area and the tape is now being examined by the crime lab. The suspect is a teenage African American male with a small Afro haircut, approximately 5'8" and 150 pounds. He was wearing a black jacket at the time of this incident.

Wednesday, May 31, 2006, 6:30 PM, Cesar Chavez and Pennsylvania, Assault with Paint Ball Gun (case # 060577629): The victim told responding officers that he was driving on Cesar Chavez with his window down when he suddenly felt something hit his left eye. Officers noted that the inside of the victim's car was coated with pink paint. The victim's left eye was swollen shut and he could not drive.

Wednesday, May 31, 2006, 9:00 PM, Palou and 3rd St, Attempted Robbery (case # 060578213): The victim was walking east on Palou when he passed the bus stop at 3rd and Palou. He noted that there were 6 African American males that left the bus stop and started following him. The suspects then surrounded him and started punching him in the head. The suspects then searched through the victim's empty pockets, but after they found nothing, they ran off back to the bus stop.

Thursday, June 1, 2006, 08:20 AM, Bayshore and Silver, Purse Snatch (case # 060579211): Sgt. Liam Frost, proud father of Officer Sean Frost, who just graduated from the police academy, responded to Silver and Bayshore where

he found the victim of of a purse snatch. Sgt. Frost went in search of the suspect with the victim and spotted the suspect near San Bruno and Felton. Sgt. Frost alerted other units who then responded to the area. The suspect spotted the arriving squad cars and took off on foot, eventually trying to hide in Martin Luther King Middle School on Girard and Burrows. However he wasn't fast enough and Sgt. Frost as well as the other responding units soon had him in custody.

The juvenile suspect was transported to Bayview Station. During an arrest search, officers found a pellet gun and ammo, like the ones being sold on San Bruno Avenue in his possession. The suspect was booked at YGC on robbery and possession of a replica firearm on school grounds.

Thursday, June 1, 2006, 12:35 PM, 3rd and Newcomb, Aggravated Assault (case # 060580371): The victim told officers that she was sitting on the corner at 3rd and Newcomb, when an African American woman that she only knows as "Precious" and an African American man she knows as "Phil" approached her. "Precious" started cussing at her and then attempted to hit her in the head with an unknown metal object. The victim was able to deflect the blow, causing "Precious" to drop the object. Unfortunately, "Phil" then picked it up and gave it back to "Precious" who then struck the victim several times in the head. The victim said that she had no idea why "Precious" would be mad at her.

"Precious" is in her early 20's, 5'10" and 140 pounds. She has orange dyed hair and was wearing a white short sleeve shirt and gray jeans. "Phil" is 5'10" and 270 pounds and was wearing a white t-shirt and blue jeans.

Thursday, June 1, 2006, 10:20 PM, Lane and McKinnon, Discharge of firearm (case # 060582377): Officers responded to the area of Lane and McKinnon and found 15 bullet casings as well as bullet holes in two vehicles. It appeared as if the first vehicle was the target since it was hit several times. The second vehicle was parked right behind it and appeared to have been hit due to its proximity to the first vehicle. Neighbors in the area said that they heard the shots, but did not see anything.

Thursday, June 1, 2006, 11:30 PM, 1400 block of Kansas, Robbery with firearm (case # 060582286): The victim was sitting with a friend in her car on the 1400 block of Kansas; the victim had his door partially propped open. All of a sudden the suspect opened the door completely and pointed a semi-automatic pistol at the victim. The suspect then demanded the victim's money. The victim was so paralyzed with fear that he just sat there and did not respond. The suspect then went into the victim's pockets and backpack and took his cell phone and wallet. The victim noted that there was a second suspect that was standing by, possible as a look out. The suspects then ran off east bound on 26th.

The suspect with the gun was described as an African American male in his late teens, 5'8" and 135 pounds. He was wearing a brown zip up hooded jacket, blue green knee length shorts and blue shoes. The other suspect was also an African American male in his late teens, 5'10" 150 pounds.

Sunday, June 4, 2006, 12:30 AM, Silver and Ledyard, Driving under the influence (case # 060593487): Officers responded to Silver and Ledyard on a report of a car accident involving several parked cars. When they arrived, they found a black Acura crashed against a parked car. There were several other parked cars that appeared to have been hit by the Acura before it came to rest. The driver of the Acura was stumbling around in the street and smelled of alcohol. A field sobriety test was administered and the driver failed 3 out of 4 of the tests. He was then transported to Mission station for a Breathalyzer test. The test revealed he had a blood alcohol level of 0.18, over double the legal limit. A DMV check revealed that his drivers license was also suspended. He was booked at county jail on driving under the influence and driving with a suspended license charges.

Sunday, June 4, 2006 12:30 AM, Kansas and 22nd, Robbery (case # 060589981): The victim was standing on the corner of Kansas and 22nd when she was approached by a 2 door dark car. The passenger of the car got out of the car and started talking to the victim. Without warning, the the passenger grabbed the victim around the neck and held a sharp object, possibly a knife to the victim's throat. The passenger then told the victim to leave her purse and to leave. Fearing for her life, the victim dropped her purse and ran off as soon as the passenger let her go.

The driver is a Hispanic male, 20 years old, 5'10" and a slim build. He had a mustache and was wearing a black beanie cap. The passenger was a Hispanic male, 20 years old, 5'10", 220 pounds. He was wearing a black baseball cap with "SF" in white writing on the front. And a black jacket with "415 Frisco," another name for the San Francisco branch of the Hell's Angels, on the back.

Sunday, June 4, 2006, 4:15 PM - Assault with a Vehicle - Silver Avenue and Conklin Streets - CS# 060 529 213 - A man was fortunately escaped injury when he was struck by a vehicle. It was learned that the man was working in his garage when he saw an SUV strike his car that was parked in the street. He approached the driver and asked to see his driver's license. The driver threatened to kill the man if he called the police and got back into his vehicle. The man stood in front of the suspect's car in attempt to block the exit of the suspect. The man's body proved to be no match for the automobile. The suspect gunned the engine with just enough force to knock the man down. A female passenger in the car got out and dragged the

victim out of the way. The suspect sped off leaving the victim and the female passenger behind.

The female boarded a Muni Bus and the victim followed. They rode the bus together and argued. They both got off the bus together at Third and Palou. The female then got into a waiting vehicle and fled the scene.

Sunday, June 4, 2006, 7:05 PM, 16th and Kansas, Driving under the influence (case # 060592611): Sgt. Pate observed a vehicle skid out of control while driving north on Kansas. He was finally able to stop the vehicle at 8th and Brannan. Both the driver and the passenger were very intoxicated. A DMV check on the driver revealed that his license was suspended. The driver was given a choice of blood or breathalyzer test, but insisted on urine which is no longer an option. The driver's blood was drawn at Mission Station prior to being booked at county jail for driving under the influence and driving with a suspended license charges. The passenger was booked at county jail for being drunk in public.

Sunday, June 4, 2006, 11:23 PM, 3rd and Jerrold, Attempted Robbery (case # 060593346): the suspect approached the drive in window of the Kentucky Fried Chicken Restaurant on 3rd and Jerrold and pointed a semi-automatic pistol at the attendant. The suspect then grabbed the attendant who was able to free himself and run to the alarm. The suspect attempted to grab the cash register from the window, but wasn't able to reach it. He then ran off on foot on Innes. Although no one is currently in custody, the entire incident was captured on video that is currently being examined by the crime lab.

Monday, June 5, 2006, 3:00 PM, Woolsey and Holyoke, Purse snatch (case # 060595712): The two victims were walking on Woolsey when the suspect ran up to the first victim and grabbed her purse. The suspect pulled so hard on the purse that the victim, a elderly woman, fell to the ground. The suspect then tried to grab a violin case from the second victim, but the second victim who was not so elderly fought back and started to scream as loud as she could. The suspect being used to attacking old ladies fled in fear by jumping into a silver Chevrolet Cavalier. The suspect was a late teen African American male, 6' and 160 pounds. He was last seen wearing a white shirt and blue jeans.

Tuesday, June 5, 2006, 7:30 PM - Reckless driving, resisting a Police Officer, Theft, Crack Cocaine - CS# 060 596 801 - Bike Officers Dockery and Martin were in the area of Revere Avenue and Jennings Street when they heard the sound of tires screeching. They saw a van speeding down the

street. The van ran a stop sign and came to a stop in front of a store. The man went inside and Officers Dockery and Martin waited for the man to return to his van.

The man returned and the Officers demanded his driver's license. The man said he did not have a license. Officer Dockery attempted to put the man in handcuffs and a struggle ensued. Officer Martin joined the fracas, but the suspect was able to break free and run away.

The suspect jumped a fence and hopped a few adjacent fences. Officer Martin and Dockery began to establish a perimeter. The man reemerged on the street. He grabbed a kid's bike that was lying on the sidewalk and began to pedal away. Officer Dockery saw this and the chase resumed. The man dropped the bike and ran for short distance. He stopped in front of house and began to fumble for a key. But the police closed in on him. The man was brought into custody. In the man's sock was a package of crack cocaine.

The man, on felony probation for robbery, was booked for numerous violations. The bike he stole was returned to the proper owner.
