Fatal Hit and Run Accident

the help of two Crime Prevention Units, Officer Barron was able to find and detain a suspect. The victim was brought to the scene and identified the burglar. In addition, the victim was able to provide video surveillance of the burglary in progress. The suspect in the video was wearing the exact same clothing as the detained man. It turns out the suspect is on active parole. He was booked at Bayview Station.

Tuesday, February 14, 2006. 3:00 AM. Aggravated Assault on a Police Officer, Resisting Arrest, Driving Under the Influence of Narcotics. 1100 block of Gilman Ave. Case #: 060170693. Bayview Officers Hunt and Lane arrived at a house on Gilman Ave. on the report that a male suspect was driving erratically, possibly high on drugs. Other Officers were already on scene and had confronted a man exiting his vehicle. The man was sweating profusely and twitching. He ignored the Officers' commands and snarled at them menacingly. The man jumped back into his vehicle, started it and sped at the Officers Correa and Pashby. Both Officers had to dive to the concrete to avoid being run over. The suspect swerved between several marked patrol cars and disappeared into the night.

A short while later Officer Hunt and Lane discovered that the man had driven back to the same house! This time, when the man saw the Officers he fled on foot and Officer Hunt followed. The chase continued for a block when the suspect turned and squared off with the Officer. A fight began and with the help of Officer Lane and a bystander, the suspect was taken into custody. The man was taken to SFGH where a blood sample was taken to discover if drugs were responsible for his erratic and felonious behavior.

Wednesday, February 15, 2006. 11:44 PM. Attempted Street Robbery with a Gun. Dwight at Girard. Case #: 060178948. Bayview Officers Festa and Berge rushed to the intersection of Dwight and Girard upon learning shots had been fired in the area. Upon arrival they were flagged down by a gunshot victim and several witnesses. The victim was shirtless and bleeding from at least one gunshot. The Officer learned that the man had been retrieving something from the trunk of his car when an unknown suspect approached him. The suspect ordered the victim to raise his hands and demanded, "What you got? What you got?" The suspect pointed a black revolver at the victim. The victim stated that he did not have anything and began to walk away. The suspect shot him in the back and fled. Moments later the victim's father arrived in his car and learned of the shooting. He sped off in search of the suspect. When he located a man matching the description he pulled within 50 ft. of the man. The suspect raised the gun and fired a the father. Lucky he escaped injury and wisely fled the scene to call 911. The suspect is described as a black male, 22-25 years of age, 5'09" and 150 lbs., he was last seen wearing a black beanie style cap, black puffy jacket, black and white pajama style pants, and black shoes.

Wednesday, February 15, 2006. 11:02 PM. Homicide with a Gun, Attempted Robbery. 1100 block of Palou Ave. Case #: 060178841. Bayview Officer Batchelder and numerous other Officers responded to a public housing unit on Palou Ave. after learning that someone there had been shot. At the scene they found a man with a gunshot wound to the face and several bystanders. The victim was rushed to SFGH where he later died. The homicide is possibly related to a botched robbery. SFPD Homicide Inspectors have assumed the case.

Thursday, February 16, 2006. 8:00 AM. Warrant Arrest, Traffic Violation Arrest. Toland St. and Galvez St. Case #: 060179532.

Bayview Officers DeGuzman and Altorfer were patrolling the "2-Car" sector of the Bayview District when they noticed a man walking in the middle of the above intersection, a California Vehicle Code infraction. The stopped the man and checked his identity. Turns out the man had no less than 5 outstanding warrants for his arrest. Each of these warrants stemmed from arrests for driving with a suspended driver's license. He was booked at Bayview Station.

Friday, February 17, 2006. 1:55 AM. Vandalism, Warrant Arrest. 5100 block of 3rd St. Case #: 060183323. Bayview Officers Rightmire and Coleman arrived at a Church on 3rd St. after learning that a trespasser had kicked in a door and entered the property. As the Officers arrived they discovered that Officers Ellis and Wise had a suspect detained. Officer Rightmire immediately recognized the suspect from the day before. The same man had been trespassing on the property yesterday and had been warned not to return. The woman noted that the male was came into the store two times earlier in the day. The woman asked the male if he needed some help and he replied, "No" and left the store. Just prior to this incident the male was standing outside the business waiting for the woman to return.

The male was described as a 45-55 year old Black male, 6'00'' & 180lbs wearing a black hat, a yellow/black backpack and had facial hair.

Saturday, February 18, 2006, 3:36 PM - Attempted Kidnapping, False Imprisonment, Battery - 3rd Street and Kirkwood Avenue - CS# 060 188 953 - Bayview Officers responded to the area of 3rd Street and Kirkwood Avenue on a report of man fighting with a woman. As police units arrived on scene they found a car parked in the middle of the street there were two women screaming and a male walking away from the scene. Officers quickly moved in and detained the man. As the man was apprehended one of the women yelled, "he tried to steal my baby!"

Parties were interviewed and it was determined that one of the women was loading her 1 year old son into her sister's car. The man, a parolee out of San Francisco and unknown to the women, approached and said, "I need a ride," and jumped into the back of the car. One of the women jumped into the back of the car to protect the child as the other woman went inside to call 911.

The man then screamed "Give me the baby", but the woman blocked the man from getting to the baby. The man struggled with the woman and began to choke her. Witnesses saw the struggle and when the police came on scene, they yelled, "The police are here!". The man ceases his activity and began to walk away. But was quickly apprehended. He was booked on numerous charges.

Saturday, February 18, 2006 8:00 PM - 1500 Block of Bayshore - Commercial Robbery with a Gun- CS # 060 189 650 - As a store employee exited the closed business he was met by three masked robbers. The one male pointed a gun at the victim and said, "Give us all your money and the money in the safe." The victim handed the males a bag with the days cash receipts totaling approximately \$3,000.00. The males forced the man inside the business and forced him to open the safe where an additional \$1,400.00 was kept. The robbers walked the victim down the hallway and ordered the victim not to turnaround until he counted to ten. The males then fled the business.

The suspects were identified as Black males all wearing the following identical clothing: All black clothing, black doo-rags and black Baseball hats.

Sunday, February 19, 2006 5:11 PM - Possession of a Firearm, Parole Violation - Rhode Island St/Southern Heights Avenue - CS# 060 192 330. Plainclothes Officers Kirchner and Ellis were on patrol in the area when they saw males standing in front of a residence on Rhode Island Street. As they approached, the males realized that the Officers were the police and two out of three began to run. Believing that something was criminally afoot the Officers gave chase. Officer Kirchner saw the male he was chasing place something into the bushes. Officer Kirchner detained the male, Officer Ellis detained the male he was chasing. The other remaining male did not run.

Officer Kirchner went back to the bush that the male stopped and recovered a loaded gun. The male who was on parole from Oakland for robbery was arrested for numerous gun charges. The other male also from Oakland was cited for resisting arrest. The remaining male, from San Francisco who stayed behind was identified and released.

It should be clear that these men were conspiring to commit a robbery or another violent act in this neighborhood and the diligence of these Officers prevented this form happening.

Sunday, February 19, 2006, $10:50\,\mathrm{PM}$ - Robbery w/Gun - 3800 Block of 3rd Street - CS# 060 193 106 - A local woman was a victim of a robbery at an ATM this evening. The woman pulled up to the ATM to make a deposit. She hesitated to exit the vehicle because she saw two males lurking behind the columns that were near the ATM. The victim waited a few minutes and exited her vehicle. As she approached the ATM the males came form behind the columns. One of the males brandished a gun and said, "Give me your money."

The victim sprayed the male with pepper spray striking him, however the victim had some of the spray blow back in her face. The second suspect was able to grab the victim's deposit. Both suspects fled to a waiting van and sped off.

A van that matched the description was spotted in the Ingleside District. The occupants were detained and inside the van were two toy replicas of a gun. The victim immediately identified the van as being involved in the robbery. The victim was not able to identify the people detained as the ones that robber her. The Robbery Unit is currently investigating the case.

Monday, February 20, 2006 6:00 PM, Carrying a Concealed Weapon - Unit block of Latona - CS# 060 195 867 - Plainclothes Officers were driving down Latona Street when they saw a Mustang double-parked. The driver who was standing outside the door saw the police and began to walk away. The officers alighted their vehicle and approached the car.
