In order to be accepted the applications must be postmarked by November 30, 2005 or be hand delivered to the Examination Unit at 850 Bryant, Rm 577-13 by November 30, 2005.

Minimum qualifications:

- Must be 20 years of age by November 30, 2005
- US citizen or permanent resident
- US high school diploma or equivalent
- Valid drivers license
- No domestic violence convictions
- No felony convictions

Monday, October 24, 5:00 PM – Fraudulent Game or Trick - Case # 051201255 - Donner Ave: A victim came to Bayview Station to report a money scam. The victim reported that an unknown suspect approached her while she stood outside of her house. The suspect explained that he had a large sum of cash and he needed assistance in donating it to the poor. As the suspect explained his story, another suspect approached to two and coaxed the victim to assist the first suspect. The two con artists went with the victim to her bank. There, the first suspect gave the victim a pink cloth sack. He explained that the sack held the \$90,000 dollar donation he planned to make. The suspects told the victim they wanted her to make the \$90,000 donation. In return they would need a \$10,000.00 "good faith security deposit" from her. The victim withdrew \$10,000.00 and gave it to the suspects. The next day, when the victim opened the pink sack, she discovered that it was full of newspaper.

Tuesday, October 25, 10:00 PM - Noise Complaint - Case#: 051207366 - Lathrop Ave: In response to a neighbor's complaint, Bayview officers responded to a house on Lathrop Ave. in Bayview's Little Hollywood neighborhood. The neighbor had complained about loud music coming from the house. This particular residence is well known in the Bayview District. Officers are frequently dispatched there to investigate loud and unusual noises emanating from the residence. Officers responded and heard the noise. They peered through a gate topped with barbed wire and discovered the noise seemed to be coming from a tent in the back yard. The officers knocked on the front door but could not contact the resident. The officers left, but returned an hour later for the same complaint. Upon their second arrival, the officers discovered that the noise had ceased. Again the resident refused to answer when the officers knocked on the front door.

Tuesday, October 25, 08:10 AM - Bomb Threat - Case#: 051203916 - 600 Block Vermont: Bayview Officers Barron and Whitney responded to the International Studies Academy on Vermont St. in response to a bomb threat. The Officers met with the assistant principal. The man had just received a call from an unknown male who warned that there was a bomb on school grounds. The assistant principal stated the caller sounded like a male juvenile trying to disguise his voice. Sheriff Deputy Dorn responded to the scene with a bomb dog. The Officers, Deputy, and Bomb Dog searched the school but did not find any explosives.

Wednesday, October 26, 2005, 10:30 PM, Robbery: An elderly Asian couple coming home late at night were going into their house when a 6 foot tall, 180 pound black male in a camouflage jacket with a hood came from behind and grabbed the 57 year old wife as she was unlocking the front door. The cowardly suspect then took the wife's purse and ran to a small dark green 4 door car (possibly a Nissan) where two other black males were waiting for him. (case number 051211464)

There has been a series of robberies, usually purse snatches, targeting smaller, elderly Asian and Latin females around the Portola shopping district. Residents, merchants and shoppers in the area are requested to report any suspicious characters, especially those that are only loitering in the area and that do not appear to have any specific reason to be in the area. The suspects in the robberies so far have all been younger African American males.

Wednesday, October 26, 2005, 8:30 PM, Warrant Arrest: Plain clothes officers Ellis, Lyons, Mallinger and Scott were on patrol in the area of Oakdale Avenue and Baldwin Court when they noticed a well known gang member suspected in several drive by shootings. Officer Scott knew that the gang member did not live in the area and had been advised that he would be arrested for trespassing if he returned to that area. In addition, Officer Scott knew that the gang member also had an outstanding warrant for his arrest for evading police officers in a vehicle. The officers took the gang member into custody and during the arrest found a substantial amount of both marijuana and cash on the suspect, consistent with marijuana sales. The suspect was booked at Bayview station for the warrant, trespassing and the narcotics sales. (case number 051211157)

Thursday, October 27, 2005, 1:46 AM, Robbery with an Assault Weapon: The victims were sitting in their car at Quesada and Industrial when two black males approached their vehicle on each side. One suspect placed a Tec-9 assault weapon in the face of the passenger and told him to get out of the car and get on the ground. The passenger, fearing for his life, got out of the car and got on to the ground. The suspect then told the passenger to empty his pockets, which only contained his wallet and a small amount of cash. The other suspect pointed another assault weapon in the driver's face and told the driver to give him his wallet and a few electronic gadgets that the driver had in the car. The suspect told the driver that he would shoot the driver if he did not comply within 5 seconds. The suspects then ran off on foot westbound on Industrial with a small amount of cash, a cell phone and a digital music player (certainly worth going to state prison for...). Officers Brown and Tong responded to meet with the victims. After explaining what had happened and getting the suspects' descriptions, Officer Brown noted a similarity between the suspects in this case and a suspect wanted for a series of robberies. That particular suspect is also wanted in a murder. Officer Brown obtained a photo of the wanted suspect. The victims immediately and without hesitation identified the photo as one of the suspects that robbed them.

The suspect is Jason Quiles, 20-year-old African American male, 5'10", 130 pounds, usually wearing a goatee and mustache. He is currently wanted for both robberies and a homicide. If you have any information about his whereabouts, call Insp. Lynch, Robbery detail at 553-1201. Or if you see Quiles in the area, call 911. Quiles was last known to live on the 1700 block of Oakdale.

Saturday, October 29, 2005, 8:00 PM, Traffic stop leads to Narcotics dealer arrest: Plain clothes officers Ellis, Lew and Lyons were in the area of Ingalls and Yosemite when they saw a blue Buick going northbound on Ingalls. From prior contacts with the driver of the Buick, Officer Lyons knew that the driver's license had been suspended due to numerous driving under the influence convictions. Officer Lyons also knew that the driver was currently on court probation because of the convictions. The officers stopped the car and arrested the driver for driving with a suspended license. Searching the driver incident to the arrest, Officer Lyons found a bag of cocaine powder (cocaine hydrochloride). Because the driver was on probation, he was subject to a search of his person, car and residence at any time without cause. Based upon finding cocaine in his possession, the officers decided to search the driver's residence. There they found more cocaine, both powder and rock as well as evidence of cocaine distribution. The driver was booked at Bayview Station for driving with a suspended license and cocaine distribution (case number 051223356)

Saturday, October 29, 4:00 AM - Armed Residential Robbery - Case#: 051221322- 1100 block of Palou: Officer Darnell took a report from a victim at Bayview Station. The victim was shaking and crying. The woman described how, several hours earlier, two masked men had robbed her and her friends at gunpoint. The victim had thrown a party for friends at her house on Palou. At one point during the party, she went outside to smoke. As she opened the door to exit, she met the first suspect and his big silver handgun that he pointed at her face. He ordered the woman back into her house. Another suspect followed the pair into the house. The second man was armed

with an "AK-47" style assault rifle. The two men ordered the partygoers to the ground and robbed them of cash and jewelry. After the men left all the victims left in house in fear that the men might return. Apparently they did. When officers responded to the residence they found it had been ransacked. The case is being investigated by the robbery detail.

Saturday, October 29, 2005, 11:30 PM, Gang fight leads to stabbing: a bit out of the Bayview District, but interesting no less for the differing version of the event by witnesses. Bayview officers responded to 17th and Bryant St. on a report of approximately 50 people fighting in the middle of the intersection. Officers arriving found no one fighting, but found a victim stabbed several times on the 2700 block of Bryant. The victim told officers that he was in the park at 17th and Bryant St when 5 Latin men approached him. The men asked him for his gang affiliation to which the victim refused to respond. The officers noted that the victim had "X3" tattooed on his arm, which is a gang notation for Trece, a Norteno gang. The suspects then chased the victim from the park to 17th and Bryant where they beat him and then stabbed him several times.

Interestingly enough, although the victim only described 5 suspects, witnesses in the area, including a security guard said that there were as little as 9 and as many as 70 involved in the fight. Some witnesses described the fighters as jumping up and down on cars, but there was no damage to any cars in the area. Some witnesses said that the fight was between Latin males and some described African American males. All in all, there was no evidence of a fight between 50 to 70 people in the area, even though that is the number that the first caller described.

Sunday, October 30, 2005, 3:25 AM, Halloween Shooting: After a night out celebrating at Kellys Mission Rock, a group was standing north of Kellys when a woman in the group fell to the ground. The woman found that she had been shot in the legs twice. No one in the group saw the shooter or even heard the shots. Her friends took her to SFGH for treatment. At the same time, a man sitting in his car in front of Kellys saw a Latin male in his twenties coming towards him. He saw the suspect point at him and then he saw a flash coming from the suspect's raised hand. Fearing for his life, the man drove off, but soon found that he had been shot in the back. He pulled over and called 911; The police, as well as an ambulance arrived. Officers searching the area, found a Jeep Cherokee with Arizona registration parked behind 550 Terry Francois, the once, but no longer future Gap Headquarters building which has remained vacant ever since the Gap decided not to move their headquarters there. The Jeep's engine was still warm from use and had several expended shell casings inside the car.
