Program Requirements

- Family members must have lived together for at least one year.
- Must complete 500 hours of "sweat equity" on the construction of their home.
- Must not have owned a home for the past three years.
- All household members (over 18 years old who are not full time students) whose income will contribute to the household gross income must be a U.S. citizen or a legal permanent resident of the U.S. (green card)
- Household income between 40-60% of the median gross annual income for San Francisco households of comparable size based on U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) guidelines:

Officers Kavanagh and Macias responded to a stabbing. Officers spoke with the victim, who had a cut to his right arm. The victim told officers that he was working as security, patrolling the yard, when he saw a suspect inside of the yard attempting to steal scrap metal. The victim confronted the suspect who attempted to stab him with a small knife. The suspect left and returned a few minutes later with a large knife, which he used to slice the arm of the security guard. The suspect was located, arrested and positively identified by the victim.
